Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levees, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

Altering Name of Local Board: Public Health Act, 1875, Sec. 311:—

Conway Union.

Local Government District of Dwygyfylchi.

To the Dwygyfylchi Local Board, being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Dwygyfylchi, in the County of Carnarvon;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 311 of The Public Health Act, 1875, it is enacted as follows:—

“ Any Local Board constituted either before or
“ after the passing of this Act may, with the
“ sanction of the Local Government Board,
“ change their name. Every such change
“ of name shall be published in such manner
“ as the Local Government Board may
“ direct”;

And whereas at a Meeting held, after due notice, on the 17th day of April, 1890, the said Dwygyfylchi Local Board resolved that the name of the said Board should be altered from Dwygyfylchi Local Board to Penmaenmawr Local Board; and application has been made by them to the Local Government Board to sanction such change of name:

Now, therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby give Our sanction to the name of the said Local Board being changed to the “Penmaenmawr Local Board.”

And We hereby direct that the said Penmaenmawr Local Board shall cause this Order to be published two successive weeks in some newspaper circulating within their District, within one calendar month from the date hereof:—

(PORT OF BRISTOL (AVONMOUTH)—DEFINITION OF FOREIGN ANIMALS WHARF.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of Bristol as a foreign animals wharf:

All that space situate at the north-west end of Avonmouth Dock, in the county of Gloucester, commencing at the water edge of the south-west side of the Entrance Lock to the said Dock six yards or thereabouts south-east of the Inner Gate, thence in a south-westerly direction for a distance of ninety-four yards or thereabouts bounded partly by a wooden fence and partly by the side of the Cattle Lairs, thence in a north-westerly direction for a distance of twenty-seven yards or thereabouts bounded by the sides of the Old Slaughter-houses and Lairs, thence at a right angle in a south-westerly direction for a distance of six yards or thereabouts bounded by a wooden fence, thence at a right angle in a north-westerly direction

for a distance of fifty-nine yards or thereabouts bounded by a wooden fence, thence at a right angle in a north-easterly direction for a distance of twenty-four yards or thereabouts bounded by a wooden fence and side of the New Slaughter-houses, thence at a right angle in a north-westerly direction for a distance of thirty-four yards or thereabouts bounded partly by the sides of the Cold Stores and partly by a wooden fence, thence at a right angle in a north-easterly direction for a distance of fifty-two yards or thereabouts bounded by a brick wall, thence at a right angle in a south-easterly direction for a distance of forty-one yards or thereabouts bounded partly by a brick wall and partly by a wooden fence, thence at a right angle in a south-westerly direction for a distance of twenty-five yards or thereabouts bounded by a wooden fence, thence at a right angle in a south-easterly direction for a distance of thirty-seven yards or thereabouts bounded by the side of the Cattle Lairs, thence at a right angle in a north-easterly direction for a distance of forty-eight yards or thereabouts bounded partly by the side of the Cattle Lairs and partly by a wooden fence, thence in a north-westerly direction for a distance of fourteen yards or thereabouts bounded by a wooden fence, thence at a right angle in a north-easterly direction for a distance of twelve yards or thereabouts to the water edge of the aforesaid Lock bounded by a wooden fence, and thence in a south-easterly direction alongside of the aforesaid Lock for a distance of fifty-six yards or thereabouts bounded by the said Lock, all which space is coloured pink on the plan of the said foreign animals wharf deposited for the purposes of this Order at the office of the Board of Agriculture, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Clerk of the County Council for the county of Gloucester.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and with reference especially to Article 96 of The Animals Order of 1886, do hereby license the Local Authority for the county of Stafford, to dig up or cause to be dug up, within fourteen days after the date of this Licence, the carcasses of three pigs on premises of Mr. Samuel Thornley of Rumbelows Farm, Heath-town, subject to the following conditions:—

1. When dug up the Local Authority shall forthwith cause the carcasses to be examined with a view to ascertain whether the animals were affected with contagious or infectious disease, and the Local Authority shall then cause the carcasses to be re-buried as soon as possible, and shall cause them to be covered with a sufficient quantity of quick lime or other disinfectant, and with not less than six feet of earth.
2. The expenses of and incidental to the digging up, examination, and re-burial of the carcasses shall be defrayed by the Local Authority.

3. This Licence is revocable by the Board of Agriculture.

(SWINE-FEVER.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. After the expiration of five years from the date of the Charter no person whether already an Associate or Student or not, shall be eligible as a Fellow unless he shall have passed the Examination or Examinations declared by the rules of examination to appertain to the Class of Fellows. Nevertheless it shall be in the power of the Council to dispense with the aforesaid examination or examinations in the case of a candidate possessing one or other of the qualifications hereinafter mentioned provided that not less than two-thirds of the whole Council shall vote, in person or by proxy, in favour of such dispensation:—

"(a.) That he is the Actuary or the principal officer if responsible for the actuarial work of some Life Assurance Society or Company having its head office in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland or in one or other of its Colonies or Dependencies.

"(b.) That he is in the service of the Crown in the capacity of Actuary of some department of the Government.

"(c.) That he is the Actuary of some Annuity or Reversionary Interest Society or analogous institution having its head office as aforesaid whose experience in matters relative to the profession of Actuary is such as to render him in the opinion of the Council worthy of election to the class of Fellows.

"53. Except in the cases hereinafter mentioned in sections fifty-eight and fifty-nine Fellows and Associates shall be elected by ballot at Ordinary General Meetings, provided always that only Fellows shall vote in the election of Fellows."

ARTICLE I.—So much of the Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the Appointment of Vestry Clerks," as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk, shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said parish of Fisherton Anger, and the provisions contained in Articles II, III, and IV, of this Order shall apply to the Vestry Clerk for the time being appointed to the said Parish.

ARTICLE II.—The duties of the Vestry Clerk shall be as follows, namely,—

To give notice of and attend the meetings of Vestry and Committees appointed thereat.

To summon and attend meetings of the Churchwardens and Overseers when required, and to enter the minutes thereof respectively.

To keep the account of all charity moneys which the Churchwardens or Overseers are authorized or are accustomed to distribute.

To keep the Vestry books and the Parish deeds and documents, and the Rate books and Accounts which are closed, and to give copies of and extracts from the same to any person entitled thereto, such person paying for the same at the rate of fourpence for every seventy-two words or figures, and to permit any person or persons rated to the relief of the Poor of the said Parish at all reasonable times to inspect the same or any of them, on pain of dismissal for neglecting to give such copies or permit such inspection.

To make all returns required of the Churchwardens or of the Overseers by law or proper authority.

To advise the Churchwardens and Overseers in all the duties of their office, and also to perform such other duties and services of a like nature as the Local Government Board from time to time, at the request of the Churchwardens or Overseers of the said Parish, or otherwise, shall prescribe and direct to be performed by the Vestry Clerk.

ARTICLE III.—The Vestry Clerk shall give to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Alderbury Union a bond, in a penal sum of not less than one hundred pounds, in the names of himself and one sufficient surety, not being an officer of the said Parish, conditioned for the due and faithful performance of the duties of the office; and shall give immediate notice to the said Guardians of the death or bankruptcy of such surety, or of his having compounded with his creditors or liquidated his affairs by arrangement, and shall, when required by the said Guardians, produce a certificate, signed by two householders, that his surety is alive and is believed by them to be solvent, and shall supply a fresh surety in the place of any such surety who may die or become bankrupt, or who may have compounded with his creditors or liquidated his affairs as aforesaid.

Provided that the Guardians may accept as a security the guarantee of any Company or Association which shall undertake to guarantee the good conduct of such officer, and shall give their guarantee in a security, the form whereof shall have been approved by the Poor Law Board or the Local Government Board under their Seal.

ARTICLE IV.—The Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said Parish shall pay to the Vestry Clerk a salary at the rate of ten pounds per annum, or such other remuneration for the performance of the duties of that office as we may, with the consent of such person, from time to time direct or approve.

ARTICLE V.—Such remuneration, in the case of an annual salary, shall be considered as accruing from day to day, and be apportionable in respect of time accordingly, in pursuance of the provisions of "The Apportionment Act, 1870," and shall be paid at Lady Day in each year.

ARTICLE VI.—A copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette by the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said Parish.
