By Her Majesty's Command,

Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levees, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five; and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter eighty-two; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the eighth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety in the words following; that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Your Majesty chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Your Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter fifty-five and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Your Majesty chapter eighty-two, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Andrew, Earlsfield situate within the limits of the new parish (sometime particular district) of St. Mary Summers Town, in the county of Surrey, and in the diocese of Rochester.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Saint Mary Summers Town, and of the parish of Saint Anne Wandsworth in the county and diocese aforesaid which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the schedule hereunder written there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new parish and parish respectively.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said new parish of Saint Mary Summers Town and of the said parish of Saint Anne Wandsworth should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Andrew Earlsfield situate as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Anthony Wilson, Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester as such Bishop with the consents of James Attlee of Grasmere Garratt Green, Tooting in the said county of Surrey, Gentleman of Frederick Eden Elton of the Chestnuts Garratt Green Tooting aforesaid Dyer, of Alexander Gordon, of Seend Melksham in the county of Wilts, Gentleman, of John Mills Thorne of Burntwood Lodge, Wandsworth Common in the said county of Surrey, Brewer, and of Benjamin Richard Thorne also of Burntwood Lodge aforesaid Brewer as the patrons of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Mary Summers Town, and with the consent of Elizabeth Du Buisson of Heathfield, Wandsworth Common aforesaid Spinster as the patron (for the next turn) of the vicarage of the said parish of Saint Anne Wandsworth, and with the consent of the said Anthony Wilson, Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester, as the patron (after the next turn) of the last-named vicarage (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint Mary Summers Town and of the said parish of Saint Anne Wandsworth which are described in the schedule hereunder written all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Andrew Earlsfield situate as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Earlsfield.'

"We therefore humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Earlsfield comprising:—

"All that portion of the new parish (sometime particular district) of Saint Mary Summers Town, in the county of Surrey and in the diocese of Rochester, and also all that contiguous portion of the parish of Saint Anne Wandsworth, in the said county and diocese, wherein the present incumbent of such new parish and of such parish respectively still possess the exclusive cure of souls, which two said portions are comprised within and bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Anne Wandsworth from the new parish of Saint Mary Summers Town aforesaid, at a point in the middle of Burntwood-lane, at or near to the northern angle of Garratt Green, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said lane for a distance of twenty and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Garratt-lane, and extending thence northward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of four and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Siward-road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to its present south-western termination, and continuing thence in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a further distance of ten chains or thereabouts thereby crossing the millpond, to a point at or near to the River Wandle upon the boundary

dividing the said new parish of Saint Mary Summers Town from the district chapelry of the Holy Trinity South Wimbledon, in the county and diocese aforesaid, and extending thence generally northward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of twenty-four chains or thereabouts thereby following generally the ancient course of the said River Wandle to a point in the middle of the main line of the London and South-Western Railway upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Mary Summers Town from the parish of Wimbledon, in the county and diocese aforesaid, and extending thence first northward then westward then north-eastward and then again northward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of sixteen chains or thereabouts thereby still following the ancient course of the said river, to the point where the said last-mentioned boundary joins the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Mary Summers Town from the district of Saint Paul Wimbledon Park Wandsworth, in the county and diocese aforesaid, and continuing thence first northward then westward and then again northward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of nineteen chains or thereabouts thereby following the middle of the present course of the said River Wandle to the point where the said last-mentioned boundary joins the boundary which divides the said district of Saint Paul Wimbledon Park Wandsworth from the parish of Saint Anne Wandsworth aforesaid and extending thence first northward then north-eastward and then again northward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of thirty chains or thereabouts thereby continuing to follow the middle of the present course of the same river to a point opposite to the western end of the wall which forms the northern boundary of the house and grounds called or known as Upper Wandle House and extending thence that is to say from the said last-mentioned boundary eastward to and along the same wall for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to its eastern end on the western side of Garratt-lane aforesaid and continuing thence still eastward and in a direct line to a point in the middle of the last-named lane, and extending thence southward along the middle of the same lane for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its junction with Swaffield-road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of nineteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Grove-road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to its junction with Earlsfield-road, and continuing thence in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of four and a half chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the main line of the London and South-Western Railway aforesaid, upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Anne Wandsworth from the consolidated chapelry of Saint Mary Magdalene Wandsworth Common in the county and diocese aforesaid, and extending thence for a distance of fifty-four chains or thereabouts first south-westward along the last-mentioned boundary (thereby following the middle of the said line of railway) and then south-eastward along the same boundary to a point in the middle of Burntwood-lane aforesaid, opposite to the south-western angle of the grounds attached to the house called or known as Burntwood Grange, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of twenty-nine and a half chains or thereabouts to the first

described point at or near to the northern angle of Garratt Green aforesaid, upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Anne Wandsworth from the new parish of Saint Mary Summers Town aforesaid, at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Rochester.

THE following Statute, made by the Governing Body of the Queen's College, Oxford, on the sixth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, has been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877:—

STATUTE made by the Governing Body of the Queen's College, Oxford, at a meeting specially summoned under section 54 of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and held on June six, one thousand eight hundred and ninety.

STATUTE III, Clause 10:

At the end of the clause add the following words:—

The Provost and Fellows may from time to time elect to an Honorary Scholarship any member of the College who has not exceeded his ninth term from matriculation, and has either obtained a First Class in Moderations or a University Scholarship or Prize, open without restriction to all members of the University whom they shall judge of sufficient merit for election; and any such Honorary Scholar shall enjoy the rights and privileges only of a Scholar without emolument: and any such Honorary Scholarship shall be tenable for such a term as the Provost and Fellows shall determine, provided always that no such Honorary Scholarship shall be tenable by any one after the expiration of the twentieth term from his matriculation.

THE following Statute, passed on the thirty-first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, by the Governing Body of University College, Oxford, and sealed on the fourth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, has been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877:—

Ex parte the Master and Fellows of the Great Hall of the University commonly called University College in Oxford.

A STATUTE to amend Statute V framed by the Commissioners appointed under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877 (40 and 41 Victoria, c. 48) in relation to the College of the Great Hall of the University commonly called University College in the University of Oxford duly made at an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Master and Fellows being the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose held on the thirty-first day of May one thousand eight hundred and ninety and passed at such Meeting by the unanimous votes of those present and voting and submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the study of Modern History is constantly increasing in the University and it is therefore desirable that some portion of the income of the College should be expended in the encouragement of that study. And whereas the College is at present obliged by its Statutes to support five Scholarships for the encouragement of the study of Mathematics for which purpose four Scholarships would suffice.

We the Master and Fellows of the said College desire to change one of the above-named Scholarships into two Exhibitions for the encouragement of the study of Modern History and for this purpose in exercise of the powers given to us by section 54 of the said Act and by Statute XI of the College Statutes alter and amend Statute V of the College Statutes.

By substituting in clause 1 line two the word "sixteen" for "seventeen" and in line eleven the word "four" for "five."

By adding to clause 6 the words "Two Exhibitions founded by the College, out of the Linton Fund and called Linton Exhibitions."

By adding in clause 7 line three after the word "Gunsley" the words "and also the Linton Exhibitions."

By inserting between the present clauses 13 and 14 the following clause to be hereafter numbered 14.

The two Linton Exhibitions shall be of the annual value of not less than forty pounds and shall be awarded for special proficiency in Modern History. No person shall be eligible who on the day of election shall have exceeded the age of twenty-one years or have completed the eighth term from that of his matriculation inclusive.

By changing the numbers of the clauses from 14-20 inclusive to 15-21 inclusive.

At a General Meeting of the Governing Body of Jesus College Oxford specially summoned for the purpose on Thursday, the twenty-second of May one thousand eight hundred and ninety, it was decided by not less than two-thirds of the persons present and voting to make an alteration

in the Statute relating to the Meyricke Fund, clause 3, by inserting between "The Principal and Fellows" and "may assign out of the income &c." the following words "shall as a first charge pay annually out of the endowment a sum amounting to the interest (less income tax) of twenty thousand pounds consols for the maintenance of scholars at Intermediate Schools to a Committee elected by the joint Education Committees of Wales and Monmouthshire if and so long as Jesus College has the right to be represented on such Committee, and"

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, a copy of a Notice, dated June 21, from the Governor of Malta, directing that arrivals from any ports in

Southern Europe from Cape St. Vincent eastwards, in Turkey in Asia, and in Northern Africa east of Tangier, are to be subjected to strict medical inspection. Passengers arriving from any of the above-mentioned ports will not be permitted to land at Malta, unless they produce satisfactory evidence that they have not resided or been in the Kingdom of Spain for the month immediately preceding the date of their embarkation. Soiled linen and wearing apparel are not allowed to be landed in Malta from any ship arriving from the above-mentioned ports, except after disinfection at the lazaretto.

Stockton Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Stockton Union, in the County of Durham ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a General Order dated the 24th day of July, 1847, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Stockton Union (among others), the Poor Law Commissioners made certain Rules and Regulations with regard to the government of the Workhouse or Workhouses of the said Union ;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made as hereinafter mentioned :

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order that, from and after the date hereof, the following regulations shall be in force in the said Stockton Union, namely, —

ARTICLE I.—Tobacco or snuff may be allowed to such of the inmates of any Workhouse of the Union who are not able-bodied, or are employed upon work of a specially disagreeable character, as the Guardians may consider should be supplied with the same, the quantity to be allowed in each case, or in any class of cases, to be such as the Guardians may by resolution prescribe.

ARTICLE II.—So much of Article 121 of the said General Order as provides that no pauper shall smoke in any room in the Workhouse without the special direction of the Medical Officer shall be rescinded, so far as regards the said Union ; but the Guardians may from time to time, by resolution, determine in what rooms and at what times smoking shall be allowed, and no pauper shall smoke in the Workhouse in any other room or at any other time than is so allowed.

Bay Southward of Talara Point, Buoyage, and Lights.

THE following information, dated 17th April, 1890, has been received from Mr. H. W. C. Tweddle, part owner of a large mineral oil establishment recently opened a few miles northward of Paríña Point, and for which Talara Bay is the shipping port:—

Talara Bay, situated about 5½ miles southward of Talara Point, is open to the north-west, about two cables in width within the five-fathoms line; with a length of about three cables, and affords anchorage in 10 to 20 fathoms water. It is formed by a projecting headland about 110 feet in height, inside of which is a flat shore.

A red buoy, surmounted by a square red frame, marks the west side of entrance to the bay; a white buoy with red band, and surmounted by a square white frame, marks the east side. The four-fathoms line around the bay is marked by buoys. Three mooring buoys for large vessels are to be laid down. A wharf, alongside which vessels drawing 26 to 30 feet may lie, is in course of construction on the west side of the bay.

A light is exhibited from a lighthouse (70 feet high, and painted red and white in bands) erected on the summit of the headland on the west side of the bay.

The light is a fixed white light, elevated 150 feet above the sea.

Approximate position, lat. 4° 34' 30" S., long. 81° 15' 40" W.

A white light is also exhibited from a tower, 50 feet high, at the head of the bay, to guide vessels entering during the night.

These lights are privately maintained by Mr. Tweddle, and there is, therefore, no guarantee for their continuance.

NOTE.—The coast trends in a N.N.W. direction from Talara Bay to Talara (or Cappulano) Point; a sunken rock (Burro Rock), on which the sea at times breaks, lies about 1½ miles southward of

Talara Point. From Paríña (Parinas) Point (about 6½ miles S. by W. from Talara Bay) Rocks, on which the sea usually breaks, extend for about one mile in a north-west direction.
