Government Notice.

His Excellency the Governor, having taken the opinion of the Board of Health, has been pleased to revoke Government Notices No. 92 and No. 94, dated respectively the 17th and the 21st June last, and to direct as follows:—

Vessels having left Spain or the Balearic Islands within thirty days shall not be admitted into this port.

Vessels, other than men-of-war and mail boats, provided with licensed medical officers, shall be subjected to strict medical inspection on arrival from any ports in Southern Europe from Cape St. Vincent, Eastwards, in Turkey in Asia and in Northern Africa, East of Tangiers.

Passengers arriving from any of the above-mentioned ports will not be permitted to land unless they produce satisfactory evidence that they have not resided or been in the Kingdom of

Spain for the thirty days immediately preceding the date of their arrival at this port.

Soiled linen and wearing apparel shall not be allowed to be landed from any ship which may be under any suspicion of contagious or infectious disease except after disinfection at the lazaretto, or at such other place as may be appointed by the Superintendent of the Ports.

THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that at a Trial of the Pyx, held at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the city of London, on the 9th July, 1890, in accordance with the provisions of the Order in Council of the 29th June, 1871, the following verdict of the Pyx Jury was delivered to the Queen's Remembrancer, viz.:—

WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn this ninth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, before the Queen's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the city of London, have made the Assays and Trials of Her Majesty's Gold and Silver Coins in the Pyx of the Mint, and which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Mint from the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, both days inclusive. We ascertained that the number of coins, both of gold and silver, in each packet produced to us, corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain; and we took a coin or coins from each of such packets of Gold coins, making altogether twenty-eight Sovereigns or Twenty shilling pieces, and sixteen Half-Sovereigns or Ten shilling pieces, and we weighed each of the said coins separately, so as to ascertain whether they were within the remedy prescribed in the First Schedule of the Coinage Act, 1870. We found that there was no varia-

tion from the Standard of Weight specified in the said First Schedule of the said Act. We then melted the said Gold coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard Gold Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the Standard of Fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act was minus one ten thousandths (or '0001), and, therefore, that the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said Gold coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to Weight. We then took from such residue three Sovereigns and three Half-Sovereigns, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such Sovereigns weighed respectively,—the first 123·374 grains, the second 123·224 grains, and the third 123·174 grains; and that such Half-Sovereigns weighed respectively,—the first 61·667 grains, the second 61·617 grains, and the third 61·627 grains. We then assayed the said three Sovereigns and three Half-Sovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such Sovereigns to be 916·60, 916·56, and 916·76 respectively, and of such Half-Sovereigns to be 916·46, 916·40, and 916·50 respectively. We also took a coin from each of such packets of Silver coins, making altogether forty-four Crowns, twenty-two Double Florins, thirty-two Half-Crowns, seventeen Florins, thirty-eight Shillings, thirty-six Sixpences, one Fourpenny piece, fifteen Threepenny pieces, one Twopenny piece, and one Penny piece, and weighed each of the said Silver coins separately, so as to ascertain whether they were within the remedy of the said First Schedule of the said Coinage Act, 1870. We found that the amount of variation from the Standard of Weight specified in the said First Schedule of the said Act was minus thirteen thousandths of an ounce (oz. '013) on the whole of such coins, and that, therefore, they were within the prescribed remedy as to Weight. We then melted the said Silver coins, so taken out and weighed, into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard Silver Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act, and we found that there was no variation from the Standard of Fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act. We weighed the residue of the said Silver coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to Weight. We then took from such residue one Crown, one Double Florin, one Half-Crown, one Florin, one Shilling, one Sixpence, and one Threepenny piece, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such Crown weighed 435·533 grains, that such Double Florin weighed 349·440 grains, that such Half-Crown weighed 217·651 grains, that such Florin weighed 174·345 grains, that such Shilling weighed 87·302 grains, that such Sixpence weighed 43·716 grains, and that such Threepenny piece weighed 21·808 grains.
