WHEREAS it has been represented to Us that it is expedient that Senior Apothecaries of the Subordinate Medical Department in India should be granted Commissions as such: Our will and pleasure is that:

1. Commissions shall be granted to all Senior Apothecaries in the Service at the date of this Our Warrant, and to all Warrant Officers subsequently promoted to the rank of Senior Apothecary.

2. There shall be two grades of Senior Apothecaries, who shall rank as follows for purposes of precedence and other advantages attaching to corresponding military rank:—

As Honorary Coptain.

Senior Apothecary of the First Grade, after three years' service in the grade.

As Honorary Lieutenant.
Senior Apothecary of the First Grade, with less than three years' service in the grade.
Senior Apothecary of the Second Grade.

3. Senior Apothecaries shall have authority, under the Medical Officers, to command members of their own department, hospital attendants, patients in military hospitals, and such warrant

officers, non-commissioned officers, and men as may be attached thereto (without their own officers) for hospital duty.
