THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a Despatch, dated August 4, from Her Majesty's Representative at Madrid, reporing that, owing to the appearance of cholera at Llerena, near Badajos, the Portuguese Government have closed their frontier to all arrivals from Spain, and have established lazarets at Elvas and Valencia de Alcantara, where travellers wishing to proceed to Portugal will have to remain seven days before being allowed to continue their journey.

Cases of cholera having been ascertained in the neighbourhood of Mecca, all vessels which during their voyage have touched any port in the Red Sea will on their arrival be subjected to a rigorous medical visit, and, provided they arrive in perfect health, they are to be admitted to free pratique.

Should this not be the case, the further treatment will be decided by the Marine Board, to whom the case is to be reported in the quickest possible manner.

with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the ninth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety.
