GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Suspending Operation of General Order as to Contracts and Tenders :-

Parish of Birmingham.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Birmingham, in the County Borough of Birmingham ;-

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by an Order dated the 16th day of January, 1850, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Birmingham, the Poor Law Board prescribed, amongst other things, regulations to be observed by the said Guardians with regard to the Contracts to be entered into by them on behalf of the said Parish for purposes relating to or connected with the general management of the Poor;

And whereas by a General Order dated the 31st day of December, 1877, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the several Unions and Parishes named in the Schedule B to such Order, including the Guardians of the Poor of the said Parish of Birmingham, We, the Local Government Board, made further regulations with regard to such Contracts as aforesaid, and prescribed certain Forms in which Tenders for the supply of goods or materials required should be made to any of the Guardians named in the said Schedule, and in which the fact of the acceptance of any such Tender should be attested under the common seal of the Guardians;

And whereas it is expedient that other provision in the matter should be made as regards the said

Parish of Birmingham:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby suspend the operation, as regards the said Parish of Birmingham, of the said General Order dated the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, until We, by an Order otherwise direct.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Altering General Order as regards Parochial Lists and Statement of Accounts: Advertising Attendances of Guardians:—

Carlisle Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Carlisle Union, in the County of Cumberland;—
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a General Order, dated the 27th day of June, 1870, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Carlisle Union (amongst others), the Poor Law Board made provision for the printing, circulating, and advertising by the said Guardians of the Parochial List and Statement of Account therein referred to, or any parts thereof;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision as regards the said Parochial List and Statement of Account should be made as herein-

after mentioned:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—When the said Guardians deem it expedient that, in addition to the said Parochial List and Statement of Account, any such further information relating to the subject matters thereof shall be prepared as can be given within reasonable limits, including an annual Statement of the number of attendances of the several Guardians at the ordinary Meetings of the Guardians, it shall be the duty of the Clerk to prepare the same accordingly.

ARTICLE II.—The said Guardians may, in addition to the said Parochial List and Statement of Account, cause such further information, including the Statement as aforesaid, to be printed and circulated among the Ratepayers of the said Union, or to be advertised in some newspaper or newspapers circulated within the said

Union.

ARTICLE III.—The reasonable costs incurred under this Order by the said Guardians shall be charged to the Common Fund of the said Union.

(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Beard of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—in the county of Surrey, comprised within the following boundary, that is to say, commencing at Raynes Park Railway Station in the Kingstonroad, Merton, and proceeding in a westerly direction along the south side of the said Kingston-road (but not including the said road) to West Barnes-lane, thence proceeding along the eastern side of West Barnes-lane (but not including the said lane) as far as the Water Course known as the Pyl Brook and following the Pyl Brook across the fields in a southerly direction to the Lower Morden-road at Hobalds Farm, thence in an easterly direction along the north side of the Lower Morden-road (but not including the said road) to a point one hundred and fifty feet from the Farmhouse in the occupation of Mr. Bishop, thence proceeding in a northerly direction along the east side of fields in the occupation of Mr. Partridge to Cannon Hill Park Estate (but not including the said Estate), and from thence along the south-west side of the said Cannon Hill Park Estate to the Grand Drive (including the said Grand Drive) to the said Raynes Park Railway Station,—which was declared by Order of the Board dated the nineteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the second day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety.
