Translation from the Official Gazette of the $\frac{1}{2}$ August, 1890.

ROYAL DECREE concerning the imposition of a quarantine on arrivals from the Arabian Coast of the Red Sea:—

George I. King of the Hellenes.

Upon the proposal of our Minister of the Interior and the opinion of the Board of Health, taking into consideration paragraph 5th of Article 13 of the Sanitary Law, we resolved and do order;

from the Arabian Coast of the Red Sea, which have been submitted to a quarantine of only ten days at some lazaretto on the Red Sea, and which passed the Suez Canal under quarantine, shall be submitted to five days' observation, commencing from the day of their examination by the competent sanitary authority. The observation will be carried out in the Ports of the Kingdom where there exists a health officer of the first class, and at the Lazaretto of Delos, if no case of cholera has happened during the voyage; and,

(b.) Steamers and vessels in general, arriving from the Arabian Coast of the Red Sea, which have not been submitted to a quarantine in the Red Sea, but which having crossed the Suez Canal under quarantine, entered into the Mediterranean, shall be submitted to a quarantine of eleven days, to be counted from the day of their examination by the health officer, and to be

performed at the Lazaretto at Delos.

With regard to merchandise shipped at the Arabian coast of the Red Sea, the provisions of our Decrees of the 19th July, 1866, and 15th November, 1873, shall be applied.

The same Minister shall publish and execute

the present Decree.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board. Cholera Regulations .- (Rags from Spain):

To all Port Sanitary Authorities :-

To all Urban and Rural Sanitary Authorities ;-

To all Officers of Customs;

To all Medical Officers of Health of the Sanitary Authorities aforesaid;—
To all Masters of Ships;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS Cholera is now prevalent in certain parts of Spain, and it is expedient that regulations should be made as hereinafter mentioned with reference to Ships having on board bales of Rags from that country:

And whereas the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Customs have signified their consent to the Regulations herein contained so far as the

same apply to the Officers of Customs:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, do, by this Our Order, and in exercise of the power conferred on Us by Section 130 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and by the Public Health Act, 1889, and every other power enabling Us in this behalf, make the following regulations, and declare that they shall be enforced and executed by the Authority or Authorities hereinafter specified:—

ARTICLE 1. In this Order—

The term "Sanitary Authority" means Port Sanitary Authority, Urban Sanitary Authority, or Rural Sanitary Authority;

The term "Ship" includes vessel or boat; The term "Officer of Customs" includes any person acting under the authority of the Com-

missioners of Her Majesty's Customs; The term "Master" includes the officer, pilot, or other person for the time being in charge

or command of a ship.

ARTICLE 2. From and after the twelfth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and until the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, no rags from Spain shall be delivered overside, except for the purpose of export, nor landed in any port or place in England or Wales.

side or landed in contravention of this Order, they shall, unless forthwith exported, be destroyed by the person having control over the same, with such precautions as may be directed by the Medical Officer of Health of the Sanitary Authority within whose jurisdiction or district the same may be found.

ARTICLE 4. All masters of vessels, consignees, and other persons having control of any rags prohibited under this Order from being delivered overside, except for the purpose of export, or landed, are required to obey these regulations.

ARTICLE 5. All Officers of Customs are empowered to prevent the delivery overside or landing of rags in contravention of this Order.

ARTICLE 6. It shall be the duty of the Sanitary Authority to take proceedings against masters of ships, consignees, or other persons having control over any rags, who shall wilfully neglect or refuse to obey or carry out, or shall obstruct the execution of any of these regulations.

Bye-laws and Regulations made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Bacup, acting by the Town Council as the Local Authority under section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, with respect to the Tramways authorized by the Rossendale Valley Tramways Act, 1888.

Definition.
1. For the purpose of these Bye-laws and Regulations the "tramways" shall mean the tramways authorized by the Rossendale Valley Tramways Act, 1888, and constructed within the borough of Bacup; the term "car" shall mean any engine or carriage using the tramways; and the terms "driver" and "conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of an engine or carriage.

Speed of Cars. 2. The driver of every car shall cause the same to be driven at a speed not exceeding eight miles

Distance from other Cars.

less distance than sixty yards, unless the cars are coupled.

Stopping Cars.

4. Subject to the requirements of Bye-laws Nos. 3 and 5 the driver or conductor of a car shall stop the same for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers when required by any passenger desiring to leave the car, or by any person desirous of travelling by the car, for whom there is room, and to whose admission no valid objection can be made, provided that nothing in this Bye-law shall require a car to be stopped on any gradient steeper than 1 in 25.

5. The driver of a car shall, upon receiving a signal from any person driving, riding, or in charge of a horse travelling along the road, immediately stop the car, and shall not again start the same until the person and horse shall

have passed such car.
6. Except at a passing place or terminus no car shall be stopped at the intersection or junction of two or more streets or roads, nor within ten yards of a car on an adjoining line of rails.

Traffic on the Road.

- 7. The driver of a car on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road so as not to leave sufficient space for the car to pass, shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall with reasonable dispatch cause such vehicle to be removed, so as not to obstruct the car.
- 8. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramways, nor shall any driver or conductor needlessly cause interruption to the ordinary road traffic.

Penalty.

9. Every driver, conductor, or other person offending against any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and not exceeding for any continuing offence ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.

10. These Bye-laws shall come into force on

the 1st day of November, 1890.
