THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Notice, dated September 20, from the Governor of Malta, directing that vessels having left Syria within thirty days shall not be admitted into the port. Vessels not provided with licensed medical officers shall be subject to strict medical inspection on arrivals from any ports in Southern Europe, from Cape St. Vincent eastwards, in Turkey in Asia, and in Northern Africa east of Tangier. Passengers arriving from any of the above-mentioned ports will not be permitted to land unless they produce satisfactory evidence that they have not resided or been in Syria for the thirty days immediately preceding the date of their arrival.

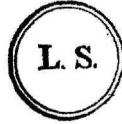

No. 498.—AUSTRALIA AND PACIFIC STATIONS.

AUSTRALIA—NORTH-WEST COAST.

Amended Positions of Certain Islets and Shoals.

THE following information, dated June, 1890, relating to the positions of certain islets and shoals on the north-west coast of Australia, has been received from Commander W. U. Moore, Her Majesty's surveying-vessel "Penguin."

(1.) Cartier Islet and Woodbine Shoal.—The west point of Cartier Islet was found by the "Penguin" to be situated in lat. $12^{\circ} 31' 56''$ S., long. $123^{\circ} 32' 46''$ E., or five miles westward of the position on Admiralty Charts. The position of Woodbine Shoal, reported by the Master of the barque of that name in 1873, as situated north-westward seven or eight miles from Cartier Islet, and where a sounding of ten fathoms was obtained, when altered to correspond with the above position of Cartier Islet, agrees very nearly with the position of the shoal reported by the Master of the pearling schooner "Sree Pas Sair" in 1887, and on which a depth of eight fathoms was obtained; as published in Notice to Mariners, No. 48 of 1888. The position of this shoal was determined by the "Sree Pas Sair" from astronomical observations as in lat. $12^{\circ} 25'$ S., long. $123^{\circ} 27'$ E., which is now considered to be identical with Woodbine Shoal, and accepted as the position of that shoal.

CAUTION.—With moderate winds, the sea does not break on the reef surrounding Cartier Islet, from two hours before until two hours after high water; as the directions of the currents in this immediate neighbourhood are uncertain, and the lead gives no warning of approach to Cartier Islet, Mariners should exercise great care in the vicinity.

Walsall Corporation Act, 1890.
Borough of Walsall.

WHEREAS, by the Walsall Corporation Act, 1890, it was provided that the extended borough should be divided into Eight Wards, with such boundaries and names as should be determined by a Commissioner to be for that purpose appointed by Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department within three weeks after the passing of the said Act.

And whereas, it was further provided by the said Act that after the commencement of the said Act the number of Aldermen and Councillors should be eight Aldermen and twenty-four Councillors, and that the first election of Councillors for the New Wards, to which existing Councillors had not by a scheme to be made by the said Commissioner been fully apportioned, should be held on the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety.

And whereas it was further provided by the said Walsall Corporation Act, 1890, that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, all elections, vacancies of office, and rotations should be governed by the Municipal Corporations Acts.

And whereas the said Commissioner was by the said Act further empowered to do by his scheme the following things, namely:—

(1.) Apportion all the existing Councillors among the New Wards or some of such Wards, so as to provide (as far as practicable) for the Councillor continuing to represent as large a number as possible of his former constituents; and every such Councillor shall hold his office in the Ward to which he shall be so assigned for the same period as he would have held such office if the existing Wards of the Borough had remained unaltered.

(2.) State what Alderman or other person shall act as Returning Officer for each Ward in respect of the Election of Councillors on the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety.

(3.) Make all such provisions as may be necessary or proper in consequence of the extension of the borough and of the alterations of wards, and of the numbers of Councillors and Aldermen.

And whereas, by the third section of the said Walsall Corporation Act, 1890, it was provided that for the purposes of all proceedings preliminary to the municipal elections of one thousand eight hundred and ninety, the said Act should come into operation on its passing.

And whereas, on the twenty-fifth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, the said Act received the Royal Assent, and came into operation for the purposes aforesaid.

And whereas, on the fifth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, the Right Honourable Henry Matthews, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, did duly warrant and appoint Archibald Bence Bence-Jones, Esq., Barrister-at-Law, to be such Commissioner for the purposes of the said Act.

Now I, the said Archibald Bence Bence-Jones, do hereby, in pursuance of the said warrant and appointment, declare this to be my Scheme for the purposes of the said Walsall Corporation Act, 1890; and I hereby fix and determine that the names of the said eight wards respectively shall be as follows, namely:—

Bloxwich Ward, Leamore Ward, Birchills Ward, Hatherton Ward, Paddock Ward, Bridge Ward, Pleck Ward, Caldmore Ward.
