THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT, 1882.

THE following scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the Local Board of Nelson, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in pursuance of the Municipal Corporations Act:—

“Whereas by the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1885, it is enacted that where a petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to the Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council (in the said Acts, and in this scheme, referred to as ‘the Committee of Council’) and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter, the Committee of Council may settle a scheme for the purposes in the said Acts named, and containing such provisions as are in the said Acts particularized.

“And whereas certain inhabitant householders of the Local Government District of Nelson, in the county of Lancaster, have petitioned Her Majesty the Queen, praying for the grant of the Charter of Incorporation.

“And whereas the said petition for a Charter was referred to the Committee of Council, and it was proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter.

“And whereas the Local Government District of Nelson aforesaid is a district subject to the jurisdiction of the Local Board for the district of Nelson (hereinafter called ‘the Local Board’).

“And whereas by Charter, dated the twenty-first day of July one thousand eight hundred and ninety, the Local Government District of Nelson aforesaid was created a Municipal Borough by the name of the borough of Nelson, and the said Charter extended the Municipal Corporations Acts to the borough so created.

“And whereas under and by virtue of the provisions of the Nelson Water and Gas Act, 1866, amended by a Provisional Order, dated March thirtieth, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and confirmed by Parliament by thirty-four and thirty-five Vict., cap. fifty-nine, and by a Provisional Order, dated the twenty-third day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and confirmed by Parliament

by the Local Government Supplemental Act, 1871 (No. 4), the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1873 (No. 5); The Nelson Local Board Act, 1879; The Nelson Electric Lighting Order, 1883, confirmed by Parliament by the Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation Act (No. 4), 1883; The Nelson Improvement Act, 1886, and The Nelson Local Board Act 1888, the Local Board is possessed of Gas and Water Works and other property, and has undertaken to supply, and does supply water and gas within the Local Government District aforesaid, and also in the township of Great and Little Marsden, and the township of Barrowford Booth in the parish of Whalley, both without the said district, and supplies gas and water within the limits for gas and water supply in the said Acts defined and for that purpose has acquired, provided, and laid down, lands, gas works, mains, pipes, meters, and apparatus, and the said Board has divers other powers, authorities, obligations, privileges and duties, and it is expedient that provision be made for the continuance, transfer to, and vesting in the Urban Sanitary Authority of the said borough of the gas and water and other undertakings of the Local Board, and of all the property, powers, authorities, obligations, privileges and duties aforesaid.

“And whereas notice of the petition for the said Charter of Incorporation was given to the Lancashire County Council, and was also sent to the Local Government Board, and the Local Government Act, 1888, was otherwise duly complied with.

“And whereas this scheme was, before being settled by the Committee of Council, referred for consideration to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State and the Local Government Board.

“And whereas the Local Board is a local authority, within the meaning of Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882.

“And whereas it is expedient, right, and just that a scheme should be settled pursuant to the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1885, containing the provisions hereinafter set forth. Now, therefore, pursuant to the said Acts and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the said Committee of Council have settled a scheme, containing the provisions hereinafter set forth, and do hereby order, direct, and declare as follows:—

“1. This scheme may be cited for all purposes as ‘The Borough of Nelson Scheme, 1890.’

"2. This scheme (when confirmed by Parliament or Order in Council as the case may be) except where it is hereinafter expressly otherwise provided, shall be deemed to have come and shall come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough, created by the Charter above referred to, and shall be construed to have effect accordingly for all purposes. The said date is hereinafter referred to as 'the commencement of this Scheme.'

"3. In this scheme the expression 'the Charter' shall mean the said Charter creating the Municipal Borough of Nelson. The expression 'the borough' shall mean the said borough of Nelson, created by the said Charter. The expression 'the Nelson Sanitary Authority,' shall mean the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Nelson, acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority of the said borough. The expression 'the Local Government District' shall mean the Local Government district of Nelson, as it existed at the date of the said Charter.

"4. Immediately on, from and after the day of the first meeting of the Council of the borough, the borough shall be deemed to have been, and shall thenceforth continue, placed within the jurisdiction of the Nelson Sanitary Authority.

"5. The Local Board, its powers, duties, obligations, and privileges, shall continue, and shall be deemed to have continued, until the commencement of this scheme unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the creation of the borough, or the grant of the said Charter. This clause shall take effect and operate as from the grant of the said Charter.

"6. Immediately from and after the commencement of this scheme, the Local Board shall be, and the same is hereby abolished, and shall thenceforth be dissolved and cease to exist.

"7. All the powers, authorities, duties, obligations, liabilities, privileges, rights, property, interest, waterworks, gas works, market, recreation ground, hall and offices, and other property, whether real or personal and works connected therewith, and whether within or without the borough, held, possessed, enjoyed, or acquired by, or attaching to, or vested in, or belonging to the Local Board, under or by virtue of the Nelson Water and Gas Act, 1866, as amended as aforesaid; the Nelson Local Board Act, 1879, the Nelson Electric Lighting Order, 1883, confirmed as aforesaid; the Nelson Improvement Act, 1886, and the Nelson Local Board Act, 1888, or any of them shall pass or be transferred to be exercisable or enforceable by or against, vest in or attach to, and be held and enjoyed by or against the Nelson Sanitary Authority, and every reference in the said Acts or Orders to the Local Board shall be deemed and construed to be a reference to the Nelson Sanitary Authority, and the Nelson Sanitary Authority shall be substituted in the said Acts and Orders, and the contracts thereto scheduled for the Local Board for all purposes, and every reference or incorporation by the said Acts to or of any provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875, or the Acts amending or extending the same, applicable in the case of a Local Board, shall be deemed and construed to be a reference or incorporation to or of the corresponding provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875, and the Acts amending or extending the same applicable in the case of an Urban Sanitary Authority of a municipal borough. The district fund and general district rate of the Local Board named in the before-mentioned Acts of Parliament or Provisional Orders, or any of them, shall be deemed to mean and refer to the district fund

and general district rate of the borough of Nelson. All Bye-laws and Rules made under the said Acts or Orders, or any of them, shall be and continue in full force and operation notwithstanding the grant of the said charter and the above transfers, and every reference therein to the Local Board shall be construed as a reference to the Nelson Sanitary Authority, and the Nelson Sanitary Authority shall be substituted for the Local Board therein. Every contract and contractual engagement entered into by or with the Local Board under or by virtue of the said Acts or Orders, or any of them, shall be deemed to have been entered into by or with the Nelson Sanitary Authority.

"8. Any Bye-laws made by the Local Board and in force immediately before the granting of the charter shall be deemed to have continued and shall continue in force, except so far as the same may be repealed or altered by Bye-laws hereinafter duly made by the Nelson Sanitary Authority, and duly confirmed, and shall apply throughout the borough, and any application made to the Local Government Board for borrowing or other powers before the commencement of this Scheme, and subsequently granted to the Local Board, shall be deemed to have been, or be made by or granted to the Nelson Sanitary Authority and shall be effectual and may be used accordingly.

"9. All rights, property, liabilities, or obligations vested in or attaching to the Local Board, under the Public Health Act, 1875, or any Act amending or extending the same or incorporated therewith shall pass to be exercisable by or against, vest in, or attach to the Nelson Sanitary Authority.

"10. 'Property' wherever mentioned in this scheme means and includes all property whether real or personal, and all rights and interests, legal or equitable connected therewith, or in respect thereof, and all choses in action and all gas and water rates, and all other rates, and all rights, legal or equitable, connected therewith or in respect thereof, and all charters, deeds, books, writings, and documents, and all rights and claims to any legal or equitable relief.

"11. Any investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy, in respect of any property, obligation, debt, liability, or forfeiture vested in, or attaching to, or due to, or incurred by, or on behalf of the Local Board, before the commencement of this scheme, may be continued, prosecuted, or enforced by or against the Nelson Sanitary Authority.

"12. The transfers from the Local Board to the Nelson Sanitary Authority of any powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, obligations, or property ordered, directed, or declared, or intended to be effected by this scheme shall be effectual and operative, whether or not such transfers may also have been effected or carried out by or under section three hundred and ten of the Public Health Act, 1875.

"13. In case any officer of the Local Board shall not be employed by the Council of the said borough, nor offered by the said Council a position in their employ of a similar character, and of an equal value to that formerly held by him, he shall be entitled to be paid, by way of compensation for the loss of his position, out of the funds of, or under the control of the Nelson Sanitary Authority, such gratuity or annual allowance as on a full consideration of the circumstances of the case, may seem to the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, or any two or more of them, to be a reasonable and just compensation for the loss of his position, and the said Commissioners, in

awarding the said compensation, shall be guided by the principles which would be applicable in the case of an award of compensation under the provisions of the Superannuation Act, 1859, to a person retiring or removed from the public service, in consequence of the abolition of his office. Provided that no special minute within the meaning of the said Act, stating any special grounds for granting such allowance shall be necessary or be made. Provided nevertheless that if any such officer be so employed by the said Council and discharged by them (otherwise than for misconduct) within two years of the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, he shall be entitled to compensation in the same manner as if he had not been employed by the said Council. Provided that the term 'officer' shall include only persons employed by the Local Board whose salaries or emoluments are payable at intervals of not less than one month, and no other persons. Provided also that the said Lords Commissioners, or any two or more of them shall be the sole judges as to the right, title, or claim of any officer to any compensation whatever, and as to the amount thereof, and the said Lords Commissioners, or any two or more of them, shall be the only judges upon any question which may arise under this clause, and further, every determination of the said Lords Commissioners upon any such right, title, claim, amount, or question, shall be absolutely final and conclusive, and every such officer shall have such rights only under this clause, as the said Lords Commissioners, or any two or more of them consider just and reasonable, and no other rights. Any determination of the said Lords Commissioners, or any two or more of them may be evidenced by writing under the hands of any two of them.

14. The accounts of the Local Board and its officers shall be (as soon as conveniently may be) audited by the district auditor, in like manner and subject to the like powers, duties, provisions, and right of appeal as if the Charter had not been granted; the provisions of sections two hundred and forty-seven and two hundred and fifty of the Public Health Act, 1875, as amended by the District Auditors Act, 1879, and any regulations duly issued by the Local Government Board, with respect to the audit of accounts of Local Boards, and of their officers, shall apply to such audit; and the provisions of this scheme, with respect to the Local Board, shall be construed so as to admit of such exceptions as may be necessary to enable such audit to be duly made, but such exceptions shall be strictly limited in time, character, and operation, to the purposes of such audit.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Notice, dated Trieste, September 23, from Her Majesty's Representative at Vienna, directing that, in consequence of the outbreak of cholera at Aleppo, arrivals from the Gulf of Iskanderna from Ras Kansir to Karatch Burun shall be subjected to a quarantine observation of seven days. Personal effects are to be disinfected according to the prescribed rules. This treatment will take place provided they have had a healthy passage, and arrive in normal health, as in any other case the treatment will be decided on by the Marine Board, to whom the case is to be referred.

Not fewer than 32 persons will be selected, if so many shall be found duly qualified: viz., * for the Lower Provinces of Bengal (including Assam); * for the Upper Provinces of Bengal (including the Punjab, Oudh, and the Central Provinces); * for Burina; * for Madras; and * for Bombay.

2. No person will be deemed qualified who shall not satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners:—

(i.) That he is a natural-born subject of Her Majesty.

(ii.) That his age will be above twenty-one years and under twenty-three years, on the 1st April, 1892.

[N.B.—In the case of Natives of India (i.) and (ii.) must be certified by the Government of India, or of the Presidency or Province in which the Candidate may have resided.]

(iii.) That he has no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Civil Service of India.

(iv.) That he is of good moral character.

3. Should the evidence upon the above points be *prima facie* satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners, the Candidate, on payment of the prescribed fee, will be admitted to the Examination. The Commissioners may however in their discretion at any time prior to the grant of the Certificate of Qualification hereinafter referred to, institute such further inquiries as they may deem necessary; and if the result of such inquiries, in the case of any Candidate, should be unsatisfactory to them in any of the above respects, he will be ineligible for admission to the Civil Service of India and if already selected, will be removed from the position of a Probationer.

4. The Open Competitive Examination will

Candidates are at liberty to name any or all of these branches of knowledge. No subjects are obligatory.

5. The merit of the persons examined will be estimated by marks; and the number set opposite to each branch in the preceding Regulation denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it.

6. The marks assigned to Candidates in each branch will be subject to such deduction as the Civil Service Commissioners may deem necessary in order to secure that "a Candidate be allowed no credit at all for taking up a subject in which he is a mere smatterer."

7. The Examination will be conducted on paper and *vis à voce* as may be deemed necessary.

8. The marks obtained by each Candidate, in respect of each of the subjects in which he shall have been examined, will be added up, and the names of the several Candidates who shall have obtained, after the deduction above mentioned, a greater aggregate number of marks than any of the remaining Candidates, will be set forth in order of merit, and such Candidates shall be deemed to be selected Candidates for the Civil Service of India, provided they appear to be in other respects duly qualified. Should any of

the selected Candidates become disqualified, the Secretary of State for India will determine whether the vacancy thus created shall be filled up or not. In the former case, the Candidate next in order of merit, and in other respects duly qualified, shall be deemed to be a selected Candidate. A Candidate entitled to be deemed a selected Candidate, but declining to accept the nomination as such, which may be offered to him, will be disqualified for any subsequent competition.

9. Selected Candidates before proceeding to India will be on probation for one year, at the end of which time they will be examined, with a view of testing their progress in the following subjects:—

In this Examination, as in the Open Competition, the merit of the Candidates examined will be estimated by marks (which will be subject to deductions in the same way as the marks assigned at the Open Competition), and the number set opposite to each subject denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it at any one Examination. The Examination will be conducted on paper and *visu à oculo*, as may be deemed necessary. This Examination will be held at the close of the year of probation, and will be called the "*Final Examination*."

10. Candidates will be tested during their probation as to their ability to perform journeys on horseback; and no Candidate will be deemed qualified for the Civil Service of India who fails to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners of his competence in this respect.

11. The selected Candidates who, at the Final Examination, shall be found to have a competent knowledge of the subjects specified in Regulation 9, and who shall have satisfied the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of nationality, age, health, character, and ability to ride, shall be certified by the said Commissioners to be entitled to be appointed to the Civil Service of India, provided they shall comply with the regulations in force, at the time, for that Service.

12. Persons desirous to be admitted as Candidates, must apply on forms, which may be obtained from "The Secretary, Civil Service Commission, London, S.W.," at any time after the 1st December, 1891. The forms must be returned so as to be received at the office of the Civil Service Commissioners on or before 31st May, 1892.

SYLLABUS, showing the extent of the Examination in certain subjects at the Open Competition for admission into the Indian Civil Service in 1892.

THE Regulations governing the Open Competition for admission into the Indian Civil Service have been framed with a view to the principle regarded by Lord

† These subjects may not be offered by any Candidate who has offered them at the previous examination.

Macaulay's Committee, in 1854, as essential, viz., that the object of the Competition should be to secure for the Indian Civil Service officers who "have received the best, the most liberal, the most finished education that their native country affords." The scheme of examination has accordingly been made to embrace most of the subjects of the Honour Schools in the Universities of Great Britain and Ireland. In administering the scheme, the Civil Service Commissioners, concurring with Lord Macaulay's Committee in the opinion "that no Candidate who may fail should, to whatever calling he may betake himself, have any reason to regret the time and labour which he has spent in preparing himself to be examined," desire to avoid all disturbance of the general course of University studies, and to render it possible, with due regard for the principle of Open Competition, for those who have graduated with honours at the Universities, to attend the examination for the Indian Civil Service with good prospects of success. The appended Syllabus shows in outline the intentions of the Commissioners with regard to the extent and character of the examination in those subjects which seem to require further definition. The scope of the examination in the subjects not mentioned in the Syllabus is sufficiently defined in the scheme published in the Regulations themselves. The Examiners will be instructed to keep the Standard in each subject up to the level of the highest course of study pursued in the Universities.

ENGLISH COMPOSITION.—An Essay to be written on one of several subjects specified by the Civil Service Commissioners on their Examination Paper.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE AND LITERATURE.—The Examination will be in two parts. In the one the Candidates will be expected to show a general acquaintance with the course of English Literature, as represented (mainly) by the following writers in verse and prose, between the reign of Edward III and the accession of Queen Victoria:

Verse—Chaucer, Langland, Spenser, Shakespeare, Milton, Dryden, Pope, Gray, Collins, Johnson, Goldsmith, Crabbe, Cowper, Campbell, Wordsworth, Scott, Byron, Coleridge, Shelley, Keats.

Prose—Bacon, Sir Thomas Browne, Milton, Swift, Defoe, Addison, Johnson, Burke, Scott, Southey.

A minute knowledge of the works of these authors will not be looked for in this part of the Examination, which will, however, test how far the Candidates have studied the chief productions of the greatest English writers *in themselves*, and are acquainted with the leading characteristics of their thought and style, and with the place which each of them occupies in the history of English literature. Candidates will also be expected to show that they have studied in these authors the history of the English language in respect of its vocabulary, syntax, and prosody.

The other part of the Examination will relate to one of the periods named below, which will follow each other year by year in the order indicated.

The Examination in this part will require from Candidates a more minute acquaintance with the history of the English language and literature, as illustrated in the chief works produced in each period, and will be based to a considerable extent, but by no means exclusively, on certain books specified each year by the Commissioners.* The names placed under the dates are intended to suggest the general character of the literary development of the period, and, consequently, the natural limits of the Examination. All the works of Shakespeare, for example, will be regarded as falling within the second period; all the works of Swift within the third; all the works of Scott and Wordsworth within the last.

* The books for 1892 are:—

Chaucer: Prologue to the Canterbury Tales; The Flower and the Leaf; The Assembly of Fowles; Minor Poems.

Langland: Vision of Piers Plowman.

Spenser: Faery Queen, Books I, II; Shepherd's Calendar.

Sir John Mandeville's Travels.

Sir Thomas More's Utopia.

FRENCH LANGUAGE AND LITERATURE.—Passages for translation from French into English, and from English into French; Critical questions on the French Language and Literature.

GERMAN LANGUAGE AND LITERATURE.—As in French.

LATIN LANGUAGE AND LITERATURE.—Passages for translation from Latin into English; Composition in Prose and Verse (in the place of the latter may be taken, by those who prefer it, a paper of critical questions on the style of the Latin orators and poets, based on Cicero De Oratore and Quintilian, Institutiones Oratoriae Lib. x.); Critical Questions on the Latin Language and Literature.

GREEK LANGUAGE AND LITERATURE.—Translations from Greek into English. Composition in Prose and Verse (in the place of the latter may be taken by those who prefer it, a paper of critical questions on the style of the Greek orators and poets, based on Aristotle's Rhetoric (Book III) and Poetics). Critical Questions on the Greek Language and Literature.

SANSKRIT LANGUAGE AND LITERATURE.—Passages for translation into English from Sanskrit, and from Sanskrit into English. History of Sanskrit Literature (including knowledge of such Indian History as bears upon the subject); Sanskrit Grammar; Vedic Philology.

ARABIC LANGUAGE AND LITERATURE.—Translations as in Sanskrit; History of Arabic Literature; Arabic Grammar; Arabic Prosody.

ENGLISH HISTORY.—General questions on English History from 800 to 1848; questions on the Constitutional History of England from 800 to 1848.

Questions covering the whole period named will be set, but Candidates will be allowed to attempt only a limited number of them.

GENERAL MODERN HISTORY.—Candidates may, at their choice, be examined in any one of the following periods:—

1. From the accession of Charlemagne—The Third Crusade. 800—1193.
2. From the Third Crusade—The Diet of Worms. 1193—1521.
3. From the Diet of Worms—The end of the reign of Louis XIV. 1521—1715.
4. From the accession of Louis XV—The French Revolution of 1848, 1715—1848.

Periods 3 and 4 will include Indian History.

GREEK HISTORY.—Questions on the General History of Greece to the death of Alexander; questions on the Constitutional History of Greece during the same period.

ROMAN HISTORY.—Questions on the General History of Rome to the death of Vespasian; questions on the Constitutional History of Rome during the same period.

In Greek and Roman History candidates will be expected to show a knowledge of the original authorities. Questions covering the whole period named will be set, but candidates will be allowed to attempt only a limited number of them.

MATHEMATICS.—Pure Mathematics:—Algebra, Geometry (Euclid and Geometrical Conic Sections), Plane Trigonometry, Plane Analytical Geometry (less advanced portions), Differential Calculus (Elementary), Integral Calculus (Elementary).

Applied Mathematics:—Statics, Dynamics of a Particle, Hydrostatics, Geometrical Optics, all treated without the aid of the Differential or Integral Calculus.

ADVANCED MATHEMATICS.—Pure Mathematics:—Higher Algebra, including Theory of Equations, Plane and Spherical Trigonometry, Differential Calculus, Integral Calculus, Differential Equations, Analytical Geometry, Plane and Solid.

Applied Mathematics:—Statics, including Attractions, Dynamics of a Particle, Rigid Dynamics, Hydro-mechanics, Geometrical and Physical Optics, Geometrical and Physical Astronomy, excluding the Planetary Theory.

Persons who have been trained in Normal Schools at the Public expense will not be qualified to receive appointments until the consent of the Committee of Council on Education, Great Britain, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

3. Copying manuscript.
4. Copying figures and tabular statements.

5. Application for permission to attend the examination must be made at such time and in such manner as the Commissioners may appoint.
