IT is hereby notified, for the information of the travelling Public, that the Marquess of Salisbury, Her Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received from Her Majesty's Minister at Belgrade a Despatch reporting that eastward-bound travellers, who may not be furnished with passports are stopped and subjected to great inconvenience at Semlin, and that, even if provided with passports, they are subjected to similar inconvenience at the Turkish frontier if the passports do not bear a Turkish visâ.
