REDUCTION OF LETTER POSTAGE.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

Definition.

1. In this Warrant the expression "United Kingdom" includes the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man.

Rates of Postage.

2. On every letter transmitted by post between the United Kingdom and the Falkland Islands or British. Honduras there shall be charged and paid (in lieu of any rates now payable) for

every half of an ounce in weight of such letter, or fractional part of half of an ounce in weight, a rate of postage of two pence halfpenny.

Unpaid and Insufficiently Prepaid Letters.

3. Any Letter posted in the United Kingdom addressed to the Falkland Islands or British Honduras, or posted in the Falkland Islands or British Honduras, a ddressed to the United Kingdom, upon which the postage chargeable under this Warrant is wholly or in part unpaid, shall be charged with double the amount of the deficient postage.

Application of Provisions of other Warrants.

4. All such Letters as are hereinbefore referred to shall, subject to the provisions of this Warrant, be posted, forwarded, conveyed, and delivered under and subject to the provisions of any Treasury Warrant now or for the time being in force applicable thereto.

Commencement of Warrant.

5. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1878. 41 Vict., c. 16, s. 53.

OVERTIME.—ADDITIONAL TWO HOURS.
Order of Secretary of State extending Special
Exception.

WHEREAS the Factory and Workshop Act, 1878, contains a special exception to the effect

- that the regulations of the Act with respect to the employment of young persons and women shall not prevent the employment in the factories and workshops or parts thereof to which the exception applies of young persons and of women during a period of employment beginning at 6 A.M. and ending at 8 P.M., or beginning at 7 A.M. and ending at 9 P.M., or beginning at 8 A.M., and ending at 10 P.M. if there are also at 10 P.M. 10 P.M., if they are employed in accordance with the following conditions; namely,

(1.) There shall be allowed to every such young person and woman for meals during the period of employment not less than two hours. of which half an hour shall be after five

o'clock in the evening; and

(2.) Any such young person or woman shall not be so employed on the whole for more than five days in any one week, nor for more than 48 days in ary 12 months:

And whereas the special exception is by the Act declared to apply to the factories and workshops referred to in the said section:

And whereas Part 2 of the same Act, section 63,

provides as follows:

Where it appears to a Secretary of State that the adoption of any special means or provision for the cleanliness or ventilation of a factory or workshop is required for the protection of the health of any child, young person, or woman employed, in pursuance of an exception under this part of this Act, either for a longer period than is otherwise allowed by this Act, or at night, I c may by order made under this part of this Act direct that the adoption of such means or provision shall be a condition of such employment:

And whereas it has been proved to my satisfaction that in the non-textile factories and workshops of the class mentioned in the Schedule hereunder, it is necessary, by reason of press of work arising at certain recurring seasons of the year, and of the liability of the business to a sudden press of orders arising from unforeseen events, to employ young persons and women in manner authorized by this exception, and that such employment will not injure the health of the young persons and women affected thereby, provided that it be subject to the condition hereinafter as pearing.

Now I, the Right Honourable Henry Matthews, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by this Order, made under Part 2 of the said Act, extend this exception accordingly: Provided that it shall be a condition of the employment of any young person or woman under this extended exception that there shall be a cubic space of at least four hundred feet for every young

person and woman so employed.

This Order shall come into effect on the 16th and shall continue in force until the 24th day of December, 1890, inclusive, and no longer.

RAMWAYS BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the County Borough of Stockport, in the several counties of Chester and Lancaster, acting by the Council as the Local Authority under section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870.

Interpretation.

1. For the purposes of these Bye-laws and Regulations, the term "car" shall mean any carriage using the tramway laid down within the said borough, and the terms "driver" and "conductor" shall respectively mean the "driver" and "conductor," or other person having charge of a

Speed of Cars.

2. The driver of every car shall cause the same to be driven at a speed not less than five miles an hour on the average, and not exceeding eight miles an hour.

Distance between Cars.

3. The driver of every car shall so drive the same that it shall not follow a preceding car at a less distance than thirty yards.

Stopping to Take Up or Set Down Passengers.

4. Subject to the requirements of Rye-laws Nos. 3 and 5, the driver or conductor of a car shall stop the same for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers when required by any passenger desiring to leave the car, or by any person desirous of travelling by the car, for whom there is room, and to whose admission no valid objection can be made, provided that nothing in this Bye-law shall require a car to be stopped on any gradient steeper than 1 in 25.

5. Except at a passing place or terminus no car shall be stopped at the intersection or junction of two or more streets or roads, nor within ten yards of a car on an adjoining line of rails.

Bell or Whistle to be Sounded when Obstruction Ahead.

6. The driver of a car on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road, so as not to leave sufficient space for the car to pass, shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall, with reasonable dispatch, cause such vehicle to be removed so as not to obstruct the car.

Traffic not to be Interfered with.

7. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramways, nor shall any driver or conductor needlessly cause interruption to the ordinary road traffic.

Penalties.

8. Every driver, conductor, or other person offending against any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and not

exceeding for any continuing offence ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.

9. These Bye-laws shall come into force on

the 14th day of February, 1891.

TRAMWAYS RULES and REGULATIONS made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the County Borough of Stockport in the several Counties of Chester and Lancaster, acting by the Council as the Local Authority in and for the said Borough, under the provisions of the 48th Section of the Tramways Act, 1870.

Interpretation.

1. In the construction of these Rules and Regulations, the expression "Local Authority" means the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the County Borough of Stockport, in the several counties of Chester and Lancaster acting by the Council; the expression "Company" means the Manchester Carriage and Tramway Company Limited, and the Stockport and Hazel Grove Carriage and Tramways Company Limited; the expression "Tramways" shall mean the Tramways in the County Borough of Stockport or any part thereof; the expression "Car" shall mean and include every tramway car or carriage running or intended to run on any part of the tramwavs.

Owner's Name and Number and Rate of Fares to be painted on Carriage.

2. A table of fares shall at all times be kept painted or printed in clear and legible characters, to the satisfaction of the Council, on the inside of every tramway carriage, together with the licensed number of such carriage, and the name or names of the owner or owners, and the number of persons which such carriage is licensed to carry, and such other notices and particulars as the Council may from time reasonably direct, and the licence number shall also be painted on each side of the outside of such carriage and on the back of such carriage in figures of not less than four inches in height, together with the names of the extreme places from and to which such tramway carriage shall run, painted on each side of the outside and each side of the inside of such carriage, in legible and conspicuous letters, on a ground different from the colour in which such carriage is painted, and in such position as shall be directed by the Council, and such particulars shall not be obliterated or covered during the time such carriage is being used.

Cars to be kept in good repair.

3. The Company shall at all times keep every car using the tramways, and all the furniture and fittings thereof in good order, with the harness complete and in good condition, and the inside of the car clean and in good repair and order, and shall provide and place upon the floor of each car a suitable dry or false floor.

Lamps to be provided.

4: The Company shall cause to be provided at. each end of every car using the tramways, a lamp | horse or horses attached to such car.

or lamps which shall be so constructed and fitted: as when lighted to afford adequate means of signalling the approach or position of such car, and also adequate light to any passengers conveyed in the interior of such car, and shall be so fixed as to prevent the dripping of oil or grease upon passengers using the car.

Lamps to be Lighted.

5. Every Conductor of a car using the tramways at any time when the public street lamps are required to be lighted, or at any time during the prevalence of such a fog as may render such light necessary for the safety of other vehicles or foot passengers, shall cause the lamps of such car to be properly lighted, and to be kept lighted until such car shall cease to use the tramways, or until the cessation of the cause which may have rendered such light necessary.

Brakes and Ventilation.

6. The Company shall cause every car to be provided with efficient brake power and proper means of ventilation.

Civility of Drivers and Conductors.

7. Every driver and conductor of a car using the tramways shall behave with civility towards every person seeking to be carried or being carried in or upon such car.

Drivers and Conductors to wear Badges.

8. Every driver or conducter of a car shall, when driving or conducting, wear appended or fastened to his left arm, so as to be at all times plainly and distinctly visible, a badge consisting of a metal plate which shall be provided by the Local Authority, and shall be delivered to such driver and conductor together with the licence granted to him by the Local Authority, and on which shall be engraved, impressed, painted, or marked in legible figuars, a number corresponding with the number of the licence granted to such driver or conductor, and the driver or conductor requiring the same, shall pay the sum of one shilling, to be refunded to him on the return by him of the badge to the Corporation.

Accommodation for Passengers defined.

9. The Company shall not cause or suffer to be conveyed at any one time in or upon any car using the tramways, a greater number of passengers (other than children in arms) than will admit of the provision of adequate sitting accommodation to the extent of at least 16 inches from side to side, and 14 inches from front to back of every seat in respect of each person conveyed in or upon such car, and also of adequate accommodation to enable every such person to sit with ease, provided that in addition not more than 3 passengers may be permitted on the platform at the rear.

Refusal to carry Passengers.

10. The driver or conductor of a car shall not, without reasonable excuse, neglect or refuse, on being requested by any person, to receive such person as a passenger in or upon the car unless the same shall at the time contain the maximum number of passengers authorized to be carried

Drivers not to leave Cars while in charge.

11. No driver of a car using the tramways shall leave such car at any time when the same may be standing or plying for passengers to be carried for hire, or may be actually conveying any pas-sengers, unless there remain in charge of the same during the absence of such driver a person competent to have the care and control of the

Loitering.

12. The driver or conductor of a car shall not cause or permit such car to loiter in the public streets.

Property left in Cars to be taken to Chief Constable's Office.

13. In the case of property being left in any car by any person who may have used the same, such property shall, within twelve hours after being found in the car by the driver or conductor, and in the state in which it was found, be taken to the office of the Chief Constable of the Borough, and be there deposited for reclamation.

Penalty for Offences by the Company.

14. For any offence against any of the foregoing Rules and Regulations so far as the provisions of such Rules and Regulations are applicable to them, the Company shall be liable to a penalty of forty shillings, and in case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of ten shillings for every day during which the offence may be continued, after notice in writing from the Local Authority under the hand of the Town

The like by Drivers and Conductors.

15. For any offence against any of the foregoing Rules and Regulations, so far as the Rules and Regulations are applicable to any driver or conductor of any car using the tramways, such driver or conductor shall be liable to a penalty of forty shillings.

 $oldsymbol{Reduction}$ of $oldsymbol{Penalty}$.

16. Provided, nevertheless, that the Justices of Court before whom any complaint may be made for a breach of any of the foregoing Rules and Regulations, may, if they think fit, reduce the amount of penalty hereinbefore prescribed as they may deem advisable.

These Rules and Regulations shall come into

force on the 14th day of February, 1891.
