REDUCTION OF LETTER POSTAGE.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:-

Definition.

1. In this Warrant the expression "United Kingdom" includes the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man.

Rates of Postage.

2. On every letter transmitted by post between , the United Kingdom and the Falkland Islands or British Honduras there shall be charged and paid (in lieu of any rates now payable) for

every half of an ounce in weight of such letter, or fractional part of half of an ounce in weight, a rate of postage of two pence halfpenny.

Unpaid and Insufficiently Prepaid Letters.

3. Any Letter posted in the United Kingdom addressed to the Falkland Islands or British or posted in the Falkland Islands Honduras, or British Honduras, addressed to the United Kingdom, upon which the postage chargeable under this Warrant is wholly or in part unpaid, shall be charged with double the amount of the deficient postage.

Application of Provisions of other Warrants.

4. All such Letters as are hereinbefore referred to shall, subject to the provisions of this Warrant, be posted, forwarded, conveyed, and delivered under and subject to the provisions of any Treasury Warrant now or for the time being in force applicable thereto.

Commencement of Warrant.

5. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.
