THE ANIMALS (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1890, No. 2.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Revocation of Order.

1. The Animals (Amendment) Order of 1890. dated the seventh day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not revive any Order or part of any Order revoked by or otherwise affect the past operation of the Order hereby revoked, or invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Order hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Order hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order.

The Netherlands declared a Free Country.

2. From and after the commencement of this Order, unless and until the Board of Agriculture otherwise order, animals (except swine) brought from the Kingdom of the Netherlands are allowed to be landed without being subject under the Fifth Schedule to the Act of 1878, or under The Animals Order of 1886, to slaughter or to quarantine, and, subject to the provisions of this Order, Chapter 32 and Part II of the Fifth Schedule of that Order shall be read and have effect as if the Kingdom of the Netherlands were included in the list of Free Countries named in that part of that Schedule as if the Order hereby revoked had not been made.

Amendment of Article 151 of The Animals Order of 1886.

3. The following provisions of this Article shall be read in the place of Article 151 of The Animals Order of 1886, and shall be deemed to be Article 151 of that Order (namely):

Conditions of Landing.

151.—(1.) The landing of foreign animals at a Landing-Place for foreign animals under the provisions of this Chapter is subject to the following

First. That the vessel in which they are imported has not, within twenty-eight days before taking them on board, had on board any animal exported or carried coastwise from a port or place in any country other than in Her Majesty's Possessions in North America, or in Norway, or in Iceland, or in New Zealand, or in the Channel Islands, or in the Isle of Man, or in the United States of America (provision as to which country is made by the second condition of this Article), or in Denmark, or in Sweden, or in the Netherlands (provision as to which three countries is made by the third condition of this Article).

Second. That the vessel in which they are imported has not, within twenty-one days before taking them on board, had on board. any animal exported or carried coastwise from a port or place in the United States of

America.

Third. That the vessel in which they are imported has not, within twenty-eight days before taking them on board, had on board any swine exported or carried coastwise from a port or place in Denmark, or in Sweden, or in the Netherlands.

Fourth. That the vessel in which they are imported has not within twenty one days before taking them on board or at any time since taking on board the animals imported, entered any port or place in any country other than in Her Majesty's Possessions in North America, or in Norway, or in Iceland, or in New Zealand, or in the Channel Islands, or in the Isle of Man, or in Denmark, or in Sweden, or in the Netherlands, or in the United States of America.

Fifth. That the animals imported have not, while on board the vessel, been in contact with any animal exported or carried coastwise from any port or place in any country other than in Her Majesty's Possessions in North America, or in Norway, or in Iceland, or in New Zealand, or in the Channel Islands, or in the Isle of Man, or (subject to the sixth condition of this Article) in Denmark, or in Sweden, or in the Netherlands.

Sixth. That the animals imported have not, while on board the vessel, been in contact

with any swine exported or carried coastwise from a port or place in Denmark, or in Sweden, or in the Netherlands.

(2.) And the animals imported shall not be landed at a Landing-Place for foreign animals

unless and until-

(a.) The owner or charterer of the vessel in which they are imported, or his agent in England or Wales or Scotland, has entered into a bond to Her Majesty the Queen, in a sum not exceeding one thousand pounds, with or without a surety or sureties, to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Customs, conditioned for the observance of the foregoing conditions; and

(b.) The master of the vessel has on each occasion of importation of foreign animals therein satisfied the Commissioners of Customs, or their proper officer, by declaration made and signed or otherwise, that all the animals then imported therein are properly imported according to the provisions

of this Article.

Amendment of Article 130 of The Animals Order of 1886.

4. The following provisions of this Article shall be read in the place of Article 130 of The Animals Order of 1886, and shall be deemed to be Article 130 of that Order (namely):

Conditions of Landing.

130.—(1.) The landing of foreign animals at a Foreign Animals Wharf under the provisions of this Chapter is subject to the following conditions:

First. That the vessel in which they are imported has not, within twenty-eight days before taking them on board, had on board any animal exported or carried coastwise from a port or place in any of the countries mentioned in Part I of the Fourth Schedule, or from a port or place in Malta, or in Belgium, or in Germany, or from any port or place from which the landing of animals is for the time being prohibited.

Second. That the vessel has not within twentyone days before taking them on board or at any time since taking on board the animals imported, entered any port or place in any of the countries mentioned in Part I of the Fourth Schedule, or any port or place in Malta, or in Belgium, or in Germany, or any port or place from which the landing of animals is for the time being prohibited.

Third. That the animals imported have not, while on board the vessel, been in contact with any animal exported or carried coastwise from any port or place in any of the countries mentioned in Part I of the Fourth Schedule, or from any port or place in Malta, or in Belgium, or in Germany, or from any port or place from which the landing of animals is for the time being prohibited.

(2.) And the animals imported shall not be landed at a Foreign Animals Wharf unless and until the master of the vessel has on each occa-sion of importation of foreign animals therein delivered to the Commissioners of Customs or their proper officer, a declaration made and signed that all the animals then imported therein are properly imported according to the provisions of this Article.

Interpretation.

5. In this Order terms have the same meaning as in The Animals Order of 1886.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as THE ANIMALS (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1890, No. 2.

Commencement.

7. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the twenty-fourth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and
