THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, from Her Majesty's Representative at Vienna, the following Translation of a Circular, dated December 20, 1890, which has been issued by the Marine Board of Trieste:—"In consequence of cholera having ceased in Spain, the I. R. Marine Board revokes the measures introduced by Circular No. 7252, of August 12, against arrivals from Spain. Vessels arriving from Spanish ports in the Mediterranean, or situate west of Gibraltar as far as the frontier of Portugal, or from the Balearic Islands, are to be subjected on arrival to a rigorous medical visit, and will only be admitted to pratique if found in perfectly healthy conditions.'

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a Despatch, dated December 15, from Her Majesty's Representative at Washington, transmitting the following quarantine regulations of the Board of Health of Pensacola, which will be continued in force until April next :-

Rules and Regulations of the Board of Health

of Escambia County, Florida. Pensacola, Fla., November, 1890.

BE it resolved, by the Board of Health of the County of Escambia, State of Florida:

1st. That the Port Inspector shall visit and inspect every vesel entering the Bay of Pensacola and ascertain and report her sanitary condition; and until such inspection and report, and the release of such vessel by said officer, no person shall visit her, and no person from her shall visit any other vessel or the shore: The master or owner of each vessel so inspected shall pay to this board for service as follows, to wit;

Steamships ... \$15 00 ••• 15 00 Ships ... Barks and three- and four-masted 10 00 schooners ... Brigs ... 5 00 5 00 Schooners, two-masted

2nd. No vessel coming into the port of Pensacola having on board any contagious or infectious disease, or from a port where any such disease prevails, shall remain within the territory under the jurisdiction of this board, except at a point designated and under restrictions imposed by this board, according to the exigencies of each case.

3rd. It shall be the duty of any person coming into the county of Escambia or port of Pensacola from any locality where any disease in an epidemic form prevails, to report at once to this board, or some officer thereof, and no person coming from any such locality shall remain in said county without the permit of this board, and then only at such point as may be designated, and under such restrictions as may be imposed by this board, according to the exigencies in each case.

4th. No ballast brought into the Bay of Pensacola by vessels shall be discharged in the county of Escambia, or the waters separating that county and the county of Santa Rosa, except at such point as may be designated in a permit obtained from this board or granted on its authority; and in case this board or its Sanitary Inspector or other officer with approval of this board deem it expedient for the preservation of the public health to require fumigation, disinfection, or discharge of ballast at quarantine station, the same shall be done at the expense of the vessel, and in accordance with the system in use by this board.

5th. All pilots and tow boats of the port of Pensacola shall be supplied with copies of these rules, and every pilot or tow boat master speaking or boarding a vessel coming into said port, shall hand a copy thereof to the master of said vessel. Pilots must, and hereby are required, in each case before boarding a vessel desiring to enter the Bay of Pensacola, to make inquiry as to the sanitary condition of the vessel, and in no case must they board if the vessel has contagious or infectious diseases aboard, or has had the same during the voyage. In all such cases the pilot must direct said vessel to the nearest United States quarantine or refuge station.

6th. That in case any vessel shall be required by authority of this board in the exercise of its powers to preserve the public health, to discharge ballast at quarantine station, or be fumigated, she shall pay 25 cents per ton for the ballast discharged, and for maritime sanitation, as follows, to wit:

\$75 00 Steamships ... Ships ... 50 00 Barks and other vessels, other than brigs and two-masted schooners ... 40 00 Brigs ... 20 00 Two-masted schooners 15 00 7th. That no pilot, tow boatman, or other person shall remove, transfer, or receive, or assist in removing, transferring, or receiving, any person

from any vessel entering the Bay of Pensacola, until such vessel shall have been inspected and released by the Port Inspector.

8th. Every violation of the foregoing rules will be punished as prescribed by law.

REDUCTION OF LETTER POSTAGE.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testifi d by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:-

Definition.

1. In this Warrant the expression "United Kingdom" includes the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man.

Rates of Postage.

2. On every letter transmitted by post between the United Kingdom and Hong Kong, Ceylon, the Straits Settlements, Labuan, British North Bornco, and Sarawak, there shall be charged and I St. Helena, Ascension, the Transvaal, the Orange

paid (in lieu of any rates now payable) for every half of an ounce in weight of such letter or fractional part of half of an ounce in weight a rate of postage of two pence halfpenny.

Application of Provisions of other Warrants.

3. All such letters as are hereinbefore referred to shall, subject to the provisions of this Warrant, be posted, forwarded, conveyed, and delivered under and subject to the provisions of any Treasury Warrant now or for the time being in force applicable thereto.

Commencement of Warrant.

4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

CAPE OF GOOD HOPE, NATAL, ST. HELENA, ASCENSION, TRANSVAAL, ORANGE FREE STATE, AND BRITISH BECHUANALAND. REDUCTION OF LETTER POSTAGE, POSTCARD RATES FOR NATAL, GENERAL ABOLITION OF FINE SYSTEM.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows :-

Definitions.

1. In this Warrant the expression "United Kingdom" includes the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man.

Rates of Postage.

2. On every letter transmitted by post between the United Kingdom and the Cape of Good Hope, Natal, or Ascension, and from the United Kingdom to St. Helena there shall be charged and paid (in lieu of any rates now payable) for every half of an ounce in weight of such letter or fractional part of half an ounce in weight a rate of postage of four pence halfpenny if transmitted overland via Lisbon and by Colonial Packet, and if transmitted by any other route or means of conveyance two pence halfpenny.

3. On every letter transmitted by post between the United Kingdom and the Transvaal, the Orange Free State, or British Bechuanaland, there shall be charged and paid (in lieu of any rates now payable) for every half of an ounce in weight of such letter or fractional part of half an ounce in weight a rate of postage of six pence if transmitted overland via Lisbon and by Colonial Packet Boat, and if transmitted by any other route or means of conveyance four pence.

Unpaid and insufficiently preprid Letters.

4. Any letter posted in the United Kingdom addressed to the Cape of Good Hope, Natal, Free State, or British Bechuanaland, or posted in either of those places addressed to the United Kingdom, upon which the postage chargeable under this Warrant is wholly or in part unpaid, shall be charged with double the amount of the deficient postage.

Application of Provisions of other Warrants.

5. All such letters as are hereinbefore referred to shall, subject to the provisions of this Warrant, be posted, forwarded, conveyed, and delivered under and subject to the provisions of any Treasury Warrant now or for the time being in force applicable thereto.

POSTCARDS.

Rates of Postage.

6. On every Postcard transmitted by post between the United Kingdom and Natal there shall be charged and paid, if transmitted overland via Lisbon and by Colonial Packet Boat, a rate of postage of two pence, and if transmitted by any other route or means of conveyance a rate of postage of three halfpence.

Insufficiently Prepaid Postcards.

7. Any Postcard posted in the United Kingdom addressed to the Cape of Good Hope or Natal, or posted in either of those Colonies, addressed to the United Kingdom, upon which the postage is partly but not wholly prepaid, shall be charged with double the amount of the deficient postage.

Address only to be written on stamped side of Card.

8. The address, and nothing else, shall be written, printed, or otherwise impressed on the side of the Postcard which bears the impressed stamp, and no part of the address shall be written, printed, or otherwise impressed across such stamp.

Letters, &c., may be written, printed, &c., on unstamped side of Card.

9. Anything (including a letter) may be written, printed, or otherwise impressed on the side of the Postcard which does not bear the impressed stamp.

Nothing to be attached to Card.

10. Nothing whatever shall be in any manner attached to a Card, except a postage stamp or stamps in part prepayment of postage, nor shall a Postcard be cut, or folded, or otherwise altered.

Disposal of Cards not in conformity with Warrant.

11. If any Postcard is sent by post otherwise than in conformity with this Warrant, it shall be detained and returned, or given up to the sender thereof.

Newspapers, Book Packets, and Pattern or Sample Packets.

12. Any newspaper or packet of newspapers, or book packet, or pattern, or sample packet, posted in the United Kingdom addressed to the Cape of Good Hope, Natal, St. Helena, Ascension, the Transvaal, the Orange Free State, or British Bechuanaland, or posted in either of those places addressed to the United Kingdom, upon which in the case of any newspaper or packet of newspapers the postage chargeable thereon is prepaid to the extent of one penny, but is nevertheless insufficiently prepaid, or upon which in the case of any book packet, or pattern, or sample packet, the postage is partly but not wholly prepaid, shall be forwarded, charged with double the amount of the deficient postage.

13. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.
