**REGULATIONS
TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING
ROOMS.**

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at a Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen will

observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at two o'clock.

VICTORIA AND GERMANY AND BELGIUM,

And any Country or Place via Germany or Belgium to or at which the German or Belgian Post Offices forward or receive Parcels for Transmission.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

Repeal.

1. From and after the date when this Warrant comes into operation the Warrant of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, dated the second day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, shall be repealed, revoked, and annulled.

Definitions.

2. In this Warrant and the schedule hereto—

(1.) The expression "Parcel" means a Postal Packet which is posted as a Parcel in accordance with the provisions of this Warrant, or any Warrant amending the same.

(2.) The expression "Germany" means the Empire of Germany.

Places between which Parcels may be transmitted.

3. From and after the date when this Warrant comes into operation Parcels not exceeding eleven pounds in weight may, subject to the provisions of this Warrant, be transmitted by Post between the Colony of Victoria and Germany and Belgium, and any country or place via Germany or Belgium to which the German or Belgian Post Offices may respectively forward.

Parcels, or from which such last-mentioned Post Offices may respectively receive Parcels for transmission.

Rates of Postage.

4. On all Parcels posted in Victoria addressed to Germany or Belgium, or any country via Germany or Belgium to which the German or Belgian Post Offices may respectively forward Parcels, and transmitted by the routes respectively mentioned in the schedule hereto without passing through the United Kingdom, there shall be charged and paid the respective rates of postage specified in such schedule.

Maximum Dimensions and Weight.

5. No Parcel, the dimensions of which shall exceed in any direction two feet, or which shall exceed in weight eleven pounds, shall be conveyed or tendered for conveyance by Post under this Warrant.

Prepayment.

6. The Postage chargeable under this Warrant shall in all cases be prepaid at the time of posting.

Mode of Posting.

7. Subject to the provisions of this Warrant, all Parcels addressed to Germany or Belgium, or any country via Germany or Belgium, shall be posted, forwarded, conveyed, and delivered, under and subject to all such regulations, conditions, and restrictions as the Post Office authorities in Victoria, with the approval of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General, may from time to time prescribe.

Commencement of Warrant.

8. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS (Supplementary to the General Regulations issued 8th April, 1872, and amended by subsequent Notices in the London Gazette), respecting Open Competitive Examinations for Situations as Abstractors in the Civil Service.

LIMITS OF PORT.

WE, the undersigned, Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, do hereby appoint Bristol, on and after the first day of February next, to continue and be a Port in that part of the United Kingdom called England, and do hereby declare the limits of the said Port of Bristol shall be on the north-east a line following the site of the Severn Tunnel from the shore, in the county of Gloucester, until it is intersected by a supposed straight line from Aust, in the said county, to the westernmost part of the Flat and Steep Holmes in the Bristol Channel;

On the north-west, the said last-mentioned line from the point where it intersects the first-mentioned line to the westernmost part of the Flat and Steep Holmes aforesaid;
