The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or

Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her

Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained

at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be very distinctly written on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at a Drawing Room, except in attend-

ance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen will

observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

VICTORIA, R.

VICTORIA, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith, to Our right trusty and well-beloved Councillor, Joseph Chamberlain, Chairman; Our right trusty and well-beloved John William, Baron Rayleigh; Our trusty and well-beloved Sir William Thomas Lewis, Knight; Our trusty and well-beloved Harold Baily Dixon, Esquire, Master of Arts, Professor of Chemistry and Metallurgy at the Owens College, Manchester; Our trusty and well-beloved Emerson Bainbridge, Esquire; and Our trusty and wellbeloved Charles Fenwick, Esquire; Greeting!

Whereas it hath been represented unto Us that with respect to many large explosions which have taken place in coal mines it has not been sufficiently ascertained to what extent they were due to coal dust, and that the subject of danger from coal dust in mines requires further

investigation:

And whereas we have deemed it expedient that a Commission should forthwith issue to inquire into the effect of coal dust in originating or extending explosions in mines, whether by itself or in conjunction with fire-damp; and also to inquire whether there are any practicable means of preventing or mitigating any dangers that may arise from the presence of coal dust in mines:

Now know ye, that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your knowledge and ability, have authorized and appointed, and do by these presents authorize and appoint, you, the said Joseph Chamberlain; John William, Baron Rayleigh; Sir William Thomas Lewis; Harold Baily Dixon; Emerson Bainbridge, and Charles Fenwick, to be Our Commissioners for the

purposes of the said inquiry.

And for the better effecting the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these presents give and grant unto you, or any three or more of you, full power to call before you such persons as you may judge necessary by whom you may be the better informed of the matters herein submitted for your consideration and every matter connected therewith, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by the investigation of past explosions and by experiment, and by all other lawful ways and means whatscever; and also to call for, have access to, and examine, all such books, documents, registers, and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject.

And We do further by these presents authorize and empower you; or any three or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect, for the more |

effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid, and to employ such persons as you may think fit to assist you in conducting any enquiry which

you may hold.

And We do further by these Our presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue; and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And We do further ordain that you or any three or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time if you shall judge it expedient so

to do.

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you, your opinion upon the matters herein submitted for your consideration.
