WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament holden in the thirteenth and fourteenth years of the reign of Her present Majesty intituled "An Act for extinguishing the Vicarial Tithes in the Parishes of Kew and Petersham in the county of Surrey; for confirming and regulating the Pew Rents of the Churches of the said Parishes; for authorizing the Division of the Vicarage of Kew and Petersham; and for other purposes relating to such Vicarage," it was amongst other things enacted that the Provost and Scholars of King's College Cambridge, as patrons of the Vicarage of Kew and Petersham, should be empowered, with the consent of the Bishop of the diocese, to declare by deed or writing under their common seal as in the said Act provided that the Vicarage of Kew and Petersham should be divided in accordance with the provisions of the said Act into two distinct vicarages:

And whereas no such deed has been made under the said Act:

And whereas by a scheme of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners ratified by an Order in Council dated the twenty-fourth day of March one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, the advowson of the Vicarage of Kew and Petersham was transferred, by way of exchange, from the Provost and Scholars of King's College Cambridge and vested in Her Majesty the Queen:

And whereas by the Kew and Petersham Vicarage Act, 1890, it is enacted that "it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, on the recommendation of the Bishop of the diocese, to declare that the Vicarage of Kew and Petersham shall be divided in accordance with the Kew and Petersham Vicarage Act, 1850, into two distinct vicarages, and by such Order to exercise in relation to such division all powers conferred by that Act on the Provost and Scholars of King's College, Cambridge, and that Act, so far as regards such division, shall be construed as if Her Majesty in Council were substituted therein for the Provost and Scholars of King's College, Cambridge, and any reference to the consent of the Bishop of the diocese were omitted therefrom."

And whereas the Right Reverend Anthony Wilson, Lord Bishop of Rochester, pursuant to the said Act of 1890, hath by writing dated the thirty-first of October one thousand eight hundred and ninety recommended that the Vicarage of Kew and Petersham should be divided into two vicarages in accordance with the said hereinbefore first recited Act.

And whereas the Reverend William Henry Bliss, the Vicar of the said Vicarage has by writing under his hand dated the twenty-seventh day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, consented to the said division.

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Vicarage of Kew and Petersham, situate in the diocese of Rochester, shall be, and the same is hereby, divided into two distinct vicarages, and that such division shall take effect from the date of this Order.

THE following Statutes, made by the Governing Body of Wadham College, Oxford, on the sixth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety; and sealed on the sixteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, have been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877:—

A STATUTE to amend a Statute made by the University of Oxford Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877 (40 and 41 Vict., c. 48), and approved by the Queen in Council on the third day of May one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, in relation to Wadham College in the University of Oxford, duly made at a General Meeting of the Warden and Fellows specially summoned for this purpose, held on the sixth day of December one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and passed at such meeting by the votes of two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, and submitted to Her Majesty the Queen in Council.

WHEREAS by clause 19 of Statute III made by the University of Oxford Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877, and approved by the Queen in Council on the third day of May one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two in relation to Wadham College in the University of Oxford, it was enacted as follows:—

"In certain cases the Warden and Fellows may elect to a vacant Fellowship, without giving public notice of the vacancy and without examination, any person specially qualified as hereinafter mentioned, although the person so elected be in possession of any property, pension or office, which would in ordinary cases render the possessor ineligible; and although he may not have taken the degree of Bachelor of Arts, in any University, or passed the examinations required for that degree; Provided that such person is otherwise qualified for election. The excepted cases shall be as follows:—

"(a.) Any person qualified to be a Tutor or Bursar of the College.

"(b.) Any Professor or Public Reader within the University of Oxford. Provided that, if the emoluments (exclusive of fees) of any Professor so elected shall exceed £700 per annum, he shall not receive, as the emolument of his Fellowship, a greater sum than will amount with the emoluments of his Professorship (exclusive of fees) to £900 per annum.

"(c.) Any person whose attainments in literature, science, or art, shall in the judgment of the College qualify him for election as a Fellow, and who shall undertake, if required, to perform any definite literary, scientific, or educational work in the College, or in the University, or (under the direction of the College or the University) elsewhere, which work shall be specified in the resolution by which he is elected.

"In each of the above cases the election shall be made by resolution passed at a stated General Meeting, and except in the case of a person elected as qualified for the office of Tutor or Bursar by a majority of two-thirds of those present and voting. The resolution shall in every case specify the nature of the qualification for election; and any person who, undertaking to perform such work as aforesaid, shall be elected or become a Fellow of the College, shall

" ipso facto vacate his Fellowship, if being required to perform such work, he shall decline or cease so to do.

" Every Fellow elected under this clause shall be admitted an Actual Fellow immediately upon his election; he shall not be disqualified for retaining his Fellowship for any cause which, if it had existed at the time of his election, would not have made him ineligible under this clause; and the electors may at the time of his election determine the rank which he shall hold in the College without reference to the date of his election, but such rank shall confer no other than honorary privileges.

" The number of Fellows holding Fellowships under this clause, other than Officers of the College, shall not exceed two at any one time; and no person shall be elected under it as qualified to be Tutor or Bursar, if the maximum number of the Official Fellows is at the time complete. Every Officer of the College elected to a Fellowship under this clause shall vacate his Fellowship on ceasing to hold his Office, except as herein provided. Every Professor or Public Reader elected to a Fellowship under this clause may be elected either for the ordinary term of a Fellowship or for the time during which he shall hold his Office; but he shall in any case vacate his Fellowship on ceasing to hold his Office. Any person elected under this clause may be re-elected under it upon the expiration of his Fellowship."

And whereas the Warden and Fellows are of opinion that it is desirable to amend the said Statute in manner hereinafter appearing.

We the said Warden and Fellows of the said College, being the Governing Body thereof, do hereby in exercise of the powers given to us by the fifty-fourth section of the said Act alter the nineteenth clause of Statute III of the said Statutes as hereinbefore set out by inserting after the words "(a) Any person qualified to be a Tutor" the words "or Lecturer" and also by inserting after the words "office of Tutor" the words "or Lecturer" and also by inserting after the words "qualified to be Tutor" the words "or Lecturer."

A STATUTE to amend a Statute made by the University of Oxford Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877, (40 and 41 Vict. c. 48), and approved by the Queen in Council on the third day of May one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, in relation to Wadham College in the University of Oxford, duly made at a General Meeting of the Warden and Fellows specially summoned for this purpose, held on the sixth day of December one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and passed at such meeting by the votes of two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, and submitted to Her Majesty the Queen in Council.

Whereas by clause 8 of Statute VI made by the University of Oxford Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and approved by the Queen in Council on the third day of May one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, in relation to Wadham College in the University of Oxford, it was enacted as follows:—

" There shall be a Divinity Lecturer in the College, who shall be appointed by the Warden and Fellows from time to time for such term not exceeding ten years, as to the Warden and Fellows shall seem fit, and who shall be capable of reappointment for any like period from time to time, after the expiration of such term.

" The Divinity Lecturer shall also hold the office of Senior Chaplain and shall be charged with the duty of performing Divine Service in the College: Provided nevertheless that if the Divinity Lecturer shall be a Fellow of the College, receiving emolument as such, it shall be in the power of the Warden and Fellows (if they shall think fit, but without being obliged so to do), to separate the office of Senior Chaplain from that of Divinity Lecturer, during the time while the last-mentioned office shall be so held: and during the time of any such separation the said office of Senior Chaplain shall be subject to the provisions of the clause next hereinafter following.

" The aggregate stipend of the offices of Divinity Lecturer and Senior Chaplain, so long as they shall be held by the same person, shall be £300 per annum: and the stipend of the office of Divinity Lecturer, when held separately from the said office of Senior Chaplain, shall be £200 per annum. Such stipend shall be paid as to £31 10s. part thereof, out of the fund bequeathed by Dr. Wills for that purpose, and the residue out of the Tuition Fund hereinafter mentioned.

" The holder of the said office of Divinity Lecturer shall be bound to reside within the College, unless the Warden and Fellows shall at any time think fit to permit his residence elsewhere within the University, which they shall have power to do.

" Any such Divinity Lecturer, whether holding the office of Senior Chaplain or not, may at any time be removed from his office by the Warden and Fellows for inefficiency, neglect of duty, or other reasonable cause, subject to such right of appeal as hereinafter-mentioned.

" The Divinity Lecturer shall be deemed to be a Lecturer of the College within the meaning of Statute III, clause 13."

And whereas by clause 9 of the said Statute it was enacted as follows:—

" For the performance of Divine Service in the College there shall always be two Chaplains; of whom the Junior Chaplain shall be appointed by the Warden and shall receive a yearly stipend of £50 to be paid out of the Corporate Revenue of the College.

" Whenever the office of Senior Chaplain is separate from that of Divinity Lecturer, the appointment thereto shall in like manner be made by the Warden, but shall be terminable upon the next vacancy in the office of Divinity Lecturer; and the stipend of the Senior Chaplain shall, in any such case, be £100 per annum, payable out of the Corporate Revenue of the College."

And whereas the Warden and Fellows are of opinion that it is desirable to amend the said Statute in manner hereinafter appearing.

We the said Warden and Fellows of the said College, being the Governing Body thereof, do hereby, in exercise of the powers given to us by the fifty-fourth section of the said Act, alter the eighth clause of Statute VI of the said Statutes by substituting for the clause as hereinbefore set out the following clause:—

" There shall be a Divinity Lecturer in the College, who shall be appointed by the Warden

“ and Fellows from time to time, for such term
 “ not exceeding ten years, as to the Warden and
 “ Fellows shall seem fit, and who shall be capable
 “ of reappointment for any like period from time
 “ to time, after the expiration of such term.

“ He shall receive as stipend such sum, not less
 “ than £150 per annum, as the Warden and
 “ Fellows shall fix from time to time, exclusive of
 “ any sum that may be paid him for Hebrew
 “ teaching, if such teaching be assigned to him
 “ by the Warden and Fellows. Such stipend
 “ shall be paid as to £31 10s. part thereof, out of
 “ the fund bequeathed by Dr. Wills for that pur-
 “ pose, and the residue out of the Tuition Fund
 “ hereinafter-mentioned.

“ The holder of the said office of Divinity
 “ Lecturer shall be bound to reside within the
 “ College, unless the Warden and Fellows shall
 “ at any time think fit to permit his residence
 “ elsewhere within the University, which they
 “ shall have power to do.

“ Any such Divinity Lecturer may at any
 “ time be removed from his office by the Warden
 “ and Fellows for inefficiency, neglect of duty, or
 “ other reasonable cause, subject to such right of
 “ appeal as hereinafter-mentioned.

“ The Divinity Lecturer shall be deemed to be
 “ a Lecturer of the College within the meaning
 “ of Statute III, clause 13.”

And we do further alter the ninth clause of the
 said Statute by substituting for the clause as
 hereinbefore set out the following clause:—

“ For the performance of Divine Service
 “ in the College there shall always be two
 “ Chaplains, who shall be appointed by the
 “ Warden, and shall receive, each of them, a
 “ yearly stipend of £50, to be paid out of the
 “ Corporate Revenue of the College.”

WHEREAS on an application from the Incumbent and Churchwardens of Malins Lee, in the parish of Dawley, in the county of Salop, the Right Honourable Sir George Grey, then one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did, by letter, dated the 19th February, 1857, signify his approval of a piece of land at that time added to the churchyard of Malins Lee, pursuant to the Act 16 and 17 Victoria, cap. 134, and to an Order of the Queen in Council of the 2nd October, 1856, which provided that no new burial-ground should be opened in the said parish without such approval.

And whereas by section 44 of the Act 15 and 16 Victoria, cap. 85, as extended and applied by the aforesaid Act 16 and 17 Victoria, cap. 134, it is enacted as follows:—

"It shall be lawful for one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State from time to time to make such regulations in relation to the burial-grounds and places for the reception of bodies previously to interment which may be provided under this Act as to him may seem proper, for the protection of the public health and maintenance of public decency, and the burial boards and all other persons having the care of such burial-grounds and places for the reception of bodies shall conform to and obey such regulations."

And whereas on a representation made to me, and, having made inquiry into the matter, I am of opinion that it would be for the protection of the public health and maintenance of public decency, that further regulation should be made concerning burial in the portion of the churchyard of Malins Lee approved as aforesaid.

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Henry Matthews, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do hereby make the following regulations in relation to the aforesaid portion of the churchyard of Malins Lee.

1. No earthen grave shall be dug within one foot of any other grave.

2. No body shall be buried in any vault or walled grave unless the coffin be separately entombed in an air-tight manner, that is, by properly cemented stone or brick-work which shall never be disturbed.

3. One body only shall be buried in any common earthen grave on the same day, unless the bodies be those of members of the same family, and every coffin shall be covered with earth at least a foot thick, which shall be closely rammed down never to be again disturbed.

4. No un-walled grave shall be reopened within fourteen years after the burial of a person above twelve years of age, or within eight years after the burial of a child under twelve years of age unless to bury another member of the same family; in every case a layer of earth not less than one foot thick shall be left undisturbed above the previously buried coffin; but if, on reopening any grave, the soil be found to be offensive, such soil shall not be disturbed, and in no case shall human remains be removed from the grave.

5. No coffin shall be buried in any un-walled grave within four feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years of age, when it shall not be less than three feet below that level.

And the Incumbent and Churchwardens of Malins Lee, and all other persons whom it may concern, are hereby required to conform to and obey the said regulations accordingly.

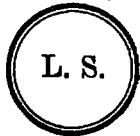
