**REGULATIONS**

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING ROOM.

*By Her Majesty's Command;*

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

**PRESENTATIONS.**

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at a Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levées.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at two o'clock.

ON the 14th of October, 1890, Her Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary at Lisbon gave notice to the Portuguese Minister for Foreign Affairs of the intention of Her Majesty's Government to terminate the Treaty between Her Majesty and His Majesty the King of Portugal, respecting their Indian Possessions, signed at Lisbon on the 26th of December, 1878.

The Portuguese Government have acknowledged receipt of the said notice, and the Treaty will consequently terminate on the 14th of January, 1892.

The Convention signed at Panjim on the 20th of January, and at Calcutta on the 30th of January, 1880, for the Extradition of Criminals will terminate at the same time.

Her Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary at Lisbon also gave notice, on the 4th of February last, of the termination of the Convention signed at Calcutta, March 18, 1880, and at Panjim, April 12, 1880, respecting Moneys, Weights, and Measures. The Portuguese Government have acknowledged receipt of this notice, and the Convention will consequently terminate on the 4th of February, 1892.
