TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

Definition.

1. In this Warrant :---

- (1.) The expression "Parcel" means a Postal Packet which is posted as a Parcel in accordance with the provisions of this Warrant, or any Warrant amending the same.
- (2.) The expression "United Kingdom" includes the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man.

Places between which Parcels may be transmitted.

2. From and after the date when this Warrant comes into operation, Parcels may, subject to the provisions of this Warrant, be transmitted by post between the United Kingdom and the territory of the Imperial British East Africa Company.

Rates of Postage.

3. On every Parcel posted in the United Kingdom, addressed to the territory of the said Company, or posted in the said territory addressed to the United Kingdom, there shall be charged and paid the following rates of postage, that is to say :--

- If not exceeding one pound in weight, one shilling.
- If exceeding one pound and not exceeding eleven pounds in weight, for the first pound one shilling, and for every additional pound or fraction of a pound in weight eight pence.

4. On every Parcel posted in the said territory addressed to any other country or place, and transmitted by post by way of the United Kingdom, there shall be charged and paid :

(1.) In respect of its transmission from the said territory to the United Kingdom :

(a.) A rate of postage of seven pence if the Parcel do not exceed one pound in weight, and if the parcel exceeds that weight, then for the first pound a rate of pestage of seven
