

Civil Service Commission, April 14, 1891.

THE Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice, that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

SPECIAL REGULATIONS (Supplementary to the General Regulations issued 8th April, 1872, and amended by subsequent notices in the London Gazette), respecting an Open Competitive Examination for Junior Clerkships in the Public Record Office, England.

1. The limits of age for these situations are 22 and 24, and Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the Competitive part of the Examination.

2. The Examination will consist of two parts, and will be in the following subjects :—

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

1. Handwriting.
2. Orthography.
3. Arithmetic (to Vulgar and Decimal Fractions).
4. English Composition.

PART II.—COMPETITIVE.

All candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners in the History of England and in the Latin and French Languages.

No candidate will be allowed any marks in respect of any subject of examination unless he shall be considered to possess a competent knowledge of that subject.

3. Application for permission to attend the examination must be made in the writing of the candidate at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Commissioners.

4. A fee of £1 will be required from every Candidate attending the Preliminary Examination, and a further fee of £5 from every Candidate who may be admitted to the Competition.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice, that an Open Competitive Examination will be held in London, under the foregoing Regulations, commencing on the 16th June, 1891.

A Preliminary Examination will be held in London, Edinburgh, and Dublin, on the 28th May, 1891.

The number of situations to be filled will be the number vacant at the time of the Examination.

No person will be admitted to Examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 15th May, an application in the Candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

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THE Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice, that an Open Competitive Examination for situations as Student Interpreter in China, Japan, or Siam, will commence in London on the 30th June, 1891, under the Regulations dated 11th September, 1886.

No person will be admitted to Examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 19th June, an application in the Candidate's own handwriting on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

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THE Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice, that an Open Competitive Examination for Boy Clerkships in the Civil Service will be held in London, Edinburgh, Dublin, Liverpool, Aberdeen, Glasgow, and Belfast, commencing on the 26th May, 1891, under the Regulations dated 25th April, 1890, and published in the London Gazette of the same date.

The number of persons to be selected at this Examination is 153.

No person will be admitted to compete from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 13th May, 1891, an application, in the handwriting of the Candidate, on the prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.
