Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her

Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be very distinctly written on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in

REDUCTION OF LETTER POSTAGE.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:-

Definition.

1. In this Warrant the expression "United Kingdom" includes the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man.

Rates of Postage.

2. On every letter transmitted by post between the United Kingdom and the Bahama Islands there shall be charged and paid (in lieu of any rates now payable) for every half of an ounce in weight of such letter, or fractional part of half an ounce in weight, a rate of postage of two pence halfpenny,

Unpaid and insufficiently prepaid Letters.

3. Any letter posted in the United Kingdom addressed to the Bahama Islands, or posted in the Bahama Islands addressed to the United Kingdom, upon which the postage chargeable under this Warrant is wholly or in part unpaid, shall be charged with double the amount of the deficient

Application of Provisions of other Warrants.

4. All such letters as are hereinbefore referred to shall, subject to the provisions of this Warrant, be posted, forwarded, conveyed, and delivered under and subject to the provisions of any Treasury Warrant now or for the time being in force applicable thereto.

Commencement of Warrant.

5. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one,

HADDINGTONSHIRE PLEURO-THE PNEUMONIA MOVEMENT ORDER of 1891.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Restriction on Movement.

1. No cow in calf or in milk shall be moved into the District of the Local Authority of the county of Haddington from the District of any other Local Authority in England or Wales or Scotland otherwise than in accordance with the following provisions (namely):

With a Licence of the Local Authority of the county of Haddington, granted on a Declaration of the owner, or of his agent authorized in writing for the purpose, declaring that to the best of his knowledge and belief-

(a.) each of the cows to be moved is not affected with pleuro-pneumonia and has not been exposed to the infection of pleuro-

pneumonia, and

(b.) each of the cows has been in the District of the Local Authority out of which it is to be moved for a period of at least fifty-six days immediately before the making of the Declaration, and has not during that period been in contact with any cattle which have been brought from Ireland, or during that period been within a distance of one mile of a pleuro-pneumonia infected place, or during that period been exposed in or at any market, fair, exhibition, or public sale, and

(c.) there is not at the time of the making of the Declaration a pleuro-pneumonia infected place within one mile of the farm or premises from which the cow is to be moved, and

(d.) the cow while being moved to its place of destination in the county of Haddington will not pass, otherwise than by railway, within one mile of a pleuro-pneumonia infected place.

Disposal of Movement Licence.

2. Cows moved under this Order shall be accompanied by the Licence permitting the movement, and such Licence shall within two days after the arrival of the cows at their place of destination in the county of Haddington be delivered lows:

1. The Place described in the Schedule to this Authority of that county to receive the same. Limitation.

3. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of cows by railway through the District of the county of Haddington, without untrucking.

Offences.

4. If a cow is moved into the county of Haddington in contravention of the provisions of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel in which it is moved, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

#### Short Title.

5. This Order may be cited as THE HAD-DINGTONSHIRE PLEURO-PNEUMONIA MOVEMENT ORDER OF 1891.

#### Commencement.

6. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-fourth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

Interpretation.

7. In this Order terms have the same meaning as in The Animals Order of 1886.

- 2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the nineteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

THE ZETLAND PLEURO-PNEUMONIA
MOVEMENT ORDER of 1891.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

#### Restriction of Movement.

1.—(1.) No cattle shall be moved into the county of Zetland from the District of any other Local Authority in England or Wales or Scotland

except as provided by this Order:

(i.) Cattle may be moved into the county of Zetland from the county of Orkney with a Declaration of the owner, or of his agent authorized in writing for that purpose, declaring that to the best of his knowledge and belief each of the cattle to be moved is not affected with pleuro-pneumonia and has not been exposed to the infection of pleuro-pneumonia and has been in the possession of such owner or agent for a period of at least three months immediately before the making of the Declaration.

(ii.) Breeding bulls may be moved into the county of Zetland from the District of any other Local Authority in Scotland which District is for the time being free from pleuro-pneumonia in accordance with the

following conditions (namely):

(a.) The bulls may be moved into the county of Zetland with a Licence of the Local Authority of that county granted on a Certificate of a Veterinary Inspector at the port of shipment certifying that each bull described in the Certificate is in his opinion free from pleuro-pneumonia, and a Declaration of the owner, or his agent authorized in writing for that purpose, declaring that to the best of his knowledge and belief each bull described in the Declaration is not affected with pleuro-pneumonia and has not been exposed to the infection of pleuro-pneumonia and has been in the possession of such owner or agent for a period of at least three months immediately before the making of the Declaration.

(b.) Each bull shall immediately after being landed in the county of Zetland and again at the expiration of eight weeks after the date of being landed be inspected by the Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority of

the county of Zetland.

(2.) The Declarations and Certificates required under this Article shall be delivered to the police immediately on the landing of the cattle in the county of Zetland.

#### Offences

2. If a head of cattle is moved into the county of Zetland in contravention of the provisions of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel in which it is moved, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as THE ZETLAND PURURO-PNEUMONIA MOVEMENT ORDER OF 1891.

Commencement.

4. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-eighth day of April, one thousand eight hundred, and ninety-one.

Interpretation.

5. In this Order terms have the same meaning as in The Animals Order of 1886.

(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA SCHEDULED DISTRICT.) By the Board of Agriculture.
