TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command,

Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office; not later than *two days* previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

COMPENSATION FOR LOSS OR DAMAGE OF FOREIGN AND COLONIAL PARCELS.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

Repeal.

1. There shall be repealed, revoked, and annulled, on and as from the day upon which this Warrant comes into operation, the Warrant of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, dated the twenty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, relating to the Parcel Post between the United Kingdom and India.

2. In this Warrant—

(1.) The expression "Parcel" means a Postal Packet which is posted as a Parcel in the United Kingdom for transmission to any place mentioned in the Schedule hereto or posted in any place mentioned in such Schedule for transmission to the United Kingdom, in accordance with the provisions of any Warrant regulating the transmission of Parcels by Post between the United Kingdom and any such place.

(2.) The expression "United Kingdom" includes the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man.

3. Subject to the provisions of this Warrant, if any article of pecuniary value enclosed in or forming part of a Parcel, be lost or damaged whilst in the custody of the Postmaster-General,

the Postmaster-General may pay to any person or persons who may in the opinion of the Postmaster-General establish a reasonable claim to compensation (having regard to the nature of the article, the care with which it was packed, and other circumstances), such sum in respect of such Parcel as he may think just.

Provided that:—

(a.) If in addition to the postage payable in respect of such Parcel, the sum of sixpence only has been paid by the sender in respect of such Parcel, the sum paid by way of compensation shall not exceed five pounds.

(b.) In respect of every additional sum of sixpence up to five shillings which may be paid by the sender on a Parcel over and above the postage as aforesaid, the Postmaster-General may give compensation to an amount not exceeding the sum of five pounds.

(c.) The amount of compensation payable in respect of any one Parcel shall in no case exceed the sum of fifty pounds.

4. The Postmaster-General may give effect to the provisions of this Warrant as to the loss or damage of articles enclosed in or forming part of Parcels out of such aids or supplies as may be from time to time provided by Parliament for that purpose, but nothing contained in or done under or in pursuance of this Warrant shall render him liable either personally or in his official capacity to any action or other legal proceeding in respect of or in consequence of any such loss or damage. And the decision of the Postmaster-General on all questions arising between him and any person claiming payment in respect of the loss or damage of any article enclosed in or forming part of a Parcel shall be final.

This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.
