**THE ZETLAND (INFLUENZA) ORDER OF 1891.**

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

*Short Title.*

1. This Order may be cited as THE ZETLAND (INFLUENZA) ORDER OF 1891.

*Extent.*

2. This Order extends to the county of Zetland only.

*Commencement.*

3. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the fifteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

*Interpretation.*

4. In this Order—

The Act of 1878 means The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878 :

The Act of 1886 means The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1886 :

The Acts of 1878 to 1886 means The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886 :

The Acts of 1878 to 1890 means The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890 :

The Board means the Board of Agriculture :

Fodder means hay or other substance commonly used for food of horses, asses, or mules :

Litter means straw or other substance commonly used for bedding or otherwise for or about horses, asses, or mules :

Master includes a person having the charge or command of a vessel :

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1878.

*Extension of Acts of 1878 to 1886.*

5. Influenza, otherwise called or known as pink eye and bilious fever, of horses, asses, and mules (in this Order called influenza) shall be a disease for the purposes of the following Sections of the Acts of 1878 to 1886 (namely) :

Section thirty of the Act of 1878 (slaughter and compensation).

Section thirty-one of the Act of 1878 (separation of diseased animals &c.) except such part of the section as relates to notice of disease.

Section thirty-two of the Act of 1878 (Orders).

Section fifty of the Act of 1878 (powers of police).

Section fifty-one of the Act of 1878 (powers of inspectors).

Section six of the Act of 1886 (slaughter), and of all other Sections of those Acts containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those Sections, including such Sections as provide for offences and procedure.

*Notice of Disease.*

6. Every person having in his possession or under his charge a horse, ass, or mule affected with influenza, or suspected of being so affected, shall with all practicable speed give notice of the fact of the horse, ass, or mule being so affected, or suspected, to an Inspector of the Local Authority, or to one of his Assistants, who shall forthwith report the same to the Local Authority.

*Duty of Inspector to act immediately.*

7. An Inspector of the Local Authority on receiving in any manner whatsoever information of the supposed existence of influenza, or having reasonable ground to suspect the existence of influenza, shall proceed with all practicable speed to the place where such influenza, according to the information received by him, exists, or is suspected to exist, and shall there and elsewhere put in force and discharge the powers and duties by or under the Acts of 1878 to 1890, and any Order of the Privy Council or of the Board, conferred and imposed on him as Inspector.

*Public Warning as to Existence of Influenza.*

8.—(1.) The Local Authority may, if they think fit, give public warning by placards, advertisement or otherwise, of the existence of influenza in any stable, building, field, or other place, with or without any particular description thereof, as they think fit, and may continue to do so during the existence of the disease, and in case of a stable, building, or other like place, until the same has been cleansed and disinfected.

(2.) It shall not be lawful for any person (without authority or excuse) to remove or deface any such placard.

*Slaughter.*

9. The Local Authority may, if they think fit, cause to be slaughtered—

(i.) Any horse, ass, or mule affected with influenza ; or

(ii.) Any horse, ass, or mule being or having been in the same stable, building, field, or other place in which influenza exists or is suspected to exist, or being or having been in contact with a horse, ass, or mule affected with influenza.

(iii.) Provided, that if the owner of a horse, ass, or mule gives notice in writing to the Local Authority, or their Inspector or other officer, that he objects to the horse, ass, or mule being slaughtered, it shall not be lawful for the Local Authority to slaughter that horse, ass, or mule except with the further special authority of the Board first obtained.

*Compensation.*

10. The Local Authority shall, out of the local rate, pay compensation as follows for horses, asses, or mules slaughtered under this Order :

The compensation shall in every case be the value of the horse, ass, or mule immediately before it was slaughtered.

*Regulations of Local Authority as to Movement.*

11. The Local Authority may, with the view of preventing the spreading of influenza, make Regulations for the following purposes, or any of them :

(a.) For prohibiting or regulating the move-

ment by land or by water of horses, asses, or mules in the whole of their District or in such part or parts thereof as may be specified by the Local Authority :

- (b.) For prohibiting or regulating the movement by land or by water of horses, asses, or mules out of the whole of their District or out of such part or parts thereof as may be specified by the Local Authority :
- (c.) For prohibiting or regulating the movement out of any stable, building, field, or other place of a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of influenza :
- (d.) For prohibiting or regulating the movement out of any stable, building, field, or other place in which influenza exists or is suspected to exist of a horse, ass, or mule that has been in contact with or in the same stable, building, field, or other place with a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of influenza :
- (e.) For regulating the taking out of any stable, building, field, or other place of any fodder, litter, or other thing that has been in contact with or used for or about a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of influenza ;

but nothing in any such Regulation shall authorize movement in contravention of Article 91 or Article 94 or other provision of The Animals Order of 1886, or in contravention of any general Order of the Privy Council or of the Board for the time being in force ; and a Regulation under paragraph (d.) of this Article shall operate so long only as influenza exists in the judgment of the Local Authority in any stable, building, field, or other place to which the Regulation refers, and in case of a stable, building, or other like place, until the same has been cleansed and disinfected.

#### *Regulations of Local Authority as to Cleansing and Disinfection.*

12.—(1.) The Local Authority may, for the purpose of preventing the spreading of influenza, make Regulations for the following purposes, or any of them :

- (a.) For providing for the cleansing and disinfection of places used by horses, asses, or mules affected with or suspected of influenza :
- (b.) For prescribing the mode in which such cleansing and such disinfection are to be effected :
- (c.) For providing that such places be cleansed and disinfected at the expense of the Local Authority, or of the owner, lessee, or occupier thereof.

(2.) If any person fails to cleanse and disinfect any place in accordance with any such Regulation, it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of such Regulation, to cause such place to be cleansed and disinfected and to recover summarily the expenses of such cleansing and disinfection from such person by proceedings in any court of competent jurisdiction.

#### *General Provisions as to Regulations of Local Authority.*

13.—(1.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board a copy of every Regulation made by them under this Order.

(2.) If the Board are satisfied on inquiry with respect to any Regulation made by the Local Authority under this Order, that the same is of too restrictive a character, or otherwise objectionable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

#### *Application of Provisions of The Animals Order of 1886.*

14. The provisions of Article 179 (*Withholding*

*of Compensation*) and of Article 181 (*Record of Slaughter*) of The Animals Order of 1886 shall apply to the case of a horse, ass, or mule slaughtered under the provisions of the Order.

#### *Production of Licences ; Names and Addresses.*

15.—(1.) Every person in charge of horses, asses, or mules being moved, where, under any Regulation of the Local Authority under this Order, a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a Constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority, produce and show to him the Movement Licence, if any, authorizing the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Every person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or Constable, or Inspector or other officer.

#### *Offences.*

16.—(1.) If a horse, ass, or mule is moved in contravention of a Regulation of the Local Authority made under the authority of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the horse, ass, or mule, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the horse, ass, or mule, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel in which it is moved, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(2.) If any person, with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by clipping, or washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark clipped, painted, or stamped on a horse, ass, or mule, as required by a Regulation made by the Local Authority under the provisions of this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the horse, ass, or mule, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(3.) If anything is omitted to be done as regards cleansing or disinfection in contravention of a Regulation of the Local Authority made under the authority of this Order, the owner and the lessee and the occupier of any place in or in respect of which the same is omitted, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(4.) If a person in charge of horses, asses, or mules being moved, where, under a Regulation made by the Local Authority under the provisions of this Order, a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

# THE ZETLAND (STRANGLES) ORDER OF 1891.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

## Short Title.

1. This Order may be cited as THE ZETLAND (STRANGLES) ORDER OF 1891.

## Extent.

2. This Order extends to the county of Zetland only.

## Commencement.

3. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the fifteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

## Interpretation.

4. In this Order—

The Act of 1878 means The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878:

The Act of 1886 means The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1886:

The Acts of 1878 to 1886 means The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886:

The Acts of 1878 to 1890 means The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890:

The Board means the Board of Agriculture:

Fodder means hay or other substance commonly used for food of horses, asses, or mules:

Litter means straw or other substance commonly used for bedding or otherwise for or about horses, asses, or mules:

Master includes a person having the charge or command of a vessel:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1878.

## Extension of Acts of 1878 to 1886.

5. Strangles of horses, asses, and mules (in this Order called strangles) shall be a disease for the purposes of the following Sections of the Acts of 1878 to 1886 (namely):

Section thirty of the Act of 1878 (slaughter and compensation).

Section thirty-one of the Act of 1878 (separation of diseased animals &c.) except such part of the section as relates to notice of disease.

Section thirty-two of the Act of 1878 (Orders).

Section fifty of the Act of 1878 (powers of police).

Section fifty-one of the Act of 1878 (powers of inspectors).

Section six of the Act of 1886 (slaughter).

and of all other Sections of those Acts containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those Sections including such Sections as provide for offences and procedure.

## Notice of Disease.

6. Every person having in his possession or under his charge a horse, ass, or mule affected with strangles, or suspected of being so affected, shall with all practicable speed give notice of the fact of the horse, ass, or mule being so affected, or suspected, to an Inspector of the Local Authority, or to one of his Assistants, who shall forthwith report the same to the Local Authority.

## Duty of Inspector to act immediately.

7. An Inspector of the Local Authority on receiving in any manner whatsoever information

of the supposed existence of strangles, or having reasonable ground to suspect the existence of strangles, shall proceed with all practicable speed to the place where such strangles, according to the information received by him, exists, or is suspected to exist, and shall there and elsewhere put in force and discharge the powers and duties by or under the Acts of 1878 to 1890, and any Order of the Privy Council or of the Board, conferred and imposed on him as Inspector.

## Public Warning as to Existence of Strangles.

8.—(1.) The Local Authority may, if they think fit, give public warning by placards, advertisement, or otherwise, of the existence of strangles in any stable, building, field, or other place, with or without any particular description thereof, as they think fit, and may continue to do so during the existence of the disease, and in case of a stable, building, or other like place, until the same has been cleansed and disinfected.

(2.) It shall not be lawful for any person (without authority or excuse) to remove or deface any such placard.

## Slaughter.

9. The Local Authority may, if they think fit, cause to be slaughtered—

(i.) Any horse, ass, or mule affected with strangles; or

(ii.) Any horse, ass, or mule being or having been in the same stable, building, field, or other place in which strangles exists or is suspected to exist, or being or having been in contact with a horse, ass, or mule affected with strangles.

(iii.) Provided, that if the owner of a horse, ass, or mule gives notice in writing to the Local Authority, or their Inspector or other officer, that he objects to the horse, ass, or mule being slaughtered, it shall not be lawful for the Local Authority to slaughter that horse, ass, or mule except with the further special authority of the Board first obtained.

## Compensation.

10. The Local Authority shall, out of the local rate, pay compensation as follows for horses, asses, or mules slaughtered under this Order:

The compensation shall in every case be the value of the horse, ass, or mule immediately before it was slaughtered.

## Regulations of Local Authority as to Movement.

11. The Local Authority may, with the view of preventing the spreading of strangles, make Regulations for the following purposes, or any of them:

(a.) For prohibiting or regulating the movement by land or by water of horses, asses, or mules in the whole of their District or in such part or parts thereof as may be specified by the Local Authority:

(b.) For prohibiting or regulating the movement by land or by water of horses, asses, or mules out of the whole of their District or out of such part or parts thereof as may be specified by the Local Authority:

(c.) For prohibiting or regulating the movement out of any stable, building, field, or other place of a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of strangles:

(d.) For prohibiting or regulating the movement out of any stable, building, field, or other place in which strangles exists or is suspected to exist of a horse, ass, or mule that has been in contact with or in the same stable, building, field, or other place with a

horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of strangles :

(e.) For regulating the taking out of any stable, building, field, or other place of any fodder, litter, or other thing that has been in contact with or used for or about a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of strangles ; but nothing in any such Regulation shall authorize movement in contravention of Article 91 or Article 94 or other provision of The Animals Order of 1886, or in contravention of any general Order of the Privy Council or of the Board for the time being in force ; and a Regulation under paragraph (d.) of this Article shall operate so long only as strangles exists in the judgment of the Local Authority in any stable, building, field, or other place to which the Regulation refers, and in case of a stable, building, or other like place, until the same has been cleansed and disinfected.

*Regulations of Local Authority as to Cleansing and Disinfection.*

12.—(1.) The Local Authority may, for the purpose of preventing the spreading of strangles, make Regulations for the following purposes, or any of them :

- (a.) For providing for the cleansing and disinfection of places used by horses, asses, or mules affected with or suspected of strangles ;
- (b.) For prescribing the mode in which such cleansing and such disinfection are to be effected ;
- (c.) For providing that such places be cleansed and disinfected at the expense of the Local Authority, or of the owner, lessee, or occupier thereof.

(2.) If any person fails to cleanse and disinfect any place in accordance with any such Regulation, it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of such Regulation, to cause such place to be cleansed and disinfected, and to recover summarily the expenses of such cleansing and disinfection from such person by proceedings in any court of competent jurisdiction.

*General Provisions as to Regulations of Local Authority.*

13.—(1.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board a copy of every Regulation made by them under this Order.

(2.) If the Board are satisfied on inquiry with respect to any Regulation made by the Local Authority under this Order that the same is of too restrictive a character, or otherwise objectionable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

*Application of Provisions of The Animals Order of 1886.*

14. The provisions of Article 179 (*Withholding of Compensation*) and of Article 181 (*Record of Slaughter*) of The Animals Order of 1886 shall apply to the case of a horse, ass, or mule slaughtered under the provisions of this Order.

*Production of Licences ; Names and Addresses.*

15.—(1.) Every person in charge of horses, asses, or mules being moved, where, under any Regulation of the Local Authority under this Order, a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a Constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority, produce and shew to him the Movement Licence, if any, authorizing the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Every person so in charge shall, on demand

as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or Constable, or Inspector or other officer.

*Offences.*

16.—(1.) If a horse, ass, or mule is moved in contravention of a Regulation of the Local Authority made under the authority of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the horse, ass, or mule, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the horse, ass, or mule, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel in which it is moved, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(2.) If any person, with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by clipping, or washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark clipped, painted, or stamped on a horse, ass, or mule, as required by a Regulation made by the Local Authority under the provisions of this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the horse, ass, or mule, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(3.) If anything is omitted to be done as regards cleansing or disinfection in contravention of a Regulation of the Local Authority made under the authority of this Order, the owner and the lessee and the occupier of any place in or in respect of which the same is omitted, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(4.) If a person in charge of horses, asses, or mules being moved, where, under a Regulation made by the Local Authority under the provisions of this Order, a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

road known as the Lower-road which runs between the two last-mentioned fields, all which yard, stables, cowhouses, outhouses, fields, road, and premises are situate in the parish of Sharrow, in the West Riding of the county of York, in the occupation of the Reverend Samuel Hopper Powell,—which was declared by Order of the Board dated the twenty-fifth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, to be a Place infected with pleuro pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Place shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the ninth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

### THE LONDON (COW-SHEDS) PLEURO-PNEUMONIA ORDER.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

#### Short Title.

1. This Order may be cited as THE LONDON (COW-SHEDS) PLEURO-PNEUMONIA ORDER.

#### Execution and Enforcement.

2. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority of the City of London and the Local Authority of the County of London in their respective Districts.

#### Commencement.

3. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

#### Interpretation.

4. In this Order—

The Act of 1878 means The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878:

The Act of 1886 means The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1886:

Registered Cowkeeper means any person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper who for the time being is registered under any Order of the Privy Council or Local Government Board made under the powers conferred by section 34 (*Dairies, Cow-Sheds, and Milk-Shops*) of the Act of 1878, as amended by section 9 of the Act of 1886:

Premises of a Registered Cowkeeper means and includes any cow-shed, field, yard, farm, or other place in the occupation of a Registered Cowkeeper:

The Board means the Board of Agriculture:

Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Place means a Place for the time being a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia under the Act of 1878:

Cattle means bulls, cows, oxen, heifers, and calves:

Carcase means the carcase of a head of cattle,

and includes part of such a carcase, and the lungs, meat, bones, hide, hoofs, horns, offal, or other part of a head of cattle, separately or otherwise, or any portion thereof:

Article means Article of this Order:

Schedule means Schedule to this Order:

Form means a Form given in the Schedule including the directions and notes in and on a Form:

Other terms have the same meaning and scope as in the Act of 1878.

#### Prohibition to Move Cattle between 7 P.M. and 5 A.M.

5. It shall not be lawful for any person to move any cattle out of or from any premises of a Registered Cowkeeper situate in the City of London or in the County of London between the hours of 7 P.M. and 5 A.M.

#### Restriction on Movement of Cattle out of Registered Cowkeeper's Premises.

6.—(1.) No cattle shall be moved out of or from any premises of a Registered Cowkeeper situate in the City of London or in the County of London without a Licence (in the Form set forth in the Schedule to this Order or to the like effect) of the Local Authority first had and obtained, and which Licence shall only be granted on such a Certificate of a Veterinary Inspector as is described in that Licence.

(2.) Provided that no Licence shall be necessary under this Article in the case of movement of cattle for a distance not exceeding five hundred yards from premises to other premises in the same occupation within the Districts of the Local Authorities of the City of London and of the County of London, or either of them.

(3.) The provisions of this Article are in addition to and not in substitution of any regulations for the time being in force under any Order of the Board with respect to the movement of cattle in, into, or out of the City of London or the County of London.

#### Restriction on Removal of Carcases out of Registered Cowkeeper's Premises.

7.—(1.) No carcase nor any portion thereof shall be removed out of or from any premises of a Registered Cowkeeper situate in the City of London or in the County of London otherwise than in accordance with the following provision (that is to say):

(2.) A carcase or any portion thereof may be removed out of or from any such premises with a Licence of the Local Authority, granted on a Certificate of a Veterinary Inspector certifying that to the best of his knowledge and belief such carcase or portion of carcase is the carcase or formed a portion of the carcase of a head of cattle that was not when it died or was slaughtered affected with pleuro-pneumonia.

#### Restriction on Burial or Destruction of Carcases on Registered Cowkeeper's Premises.

8.—(1.) No carcase nor any portion thereof shall be buried or destroyed in or on any premises of a Registered Cowkeeper situate in the City of London or in the County of London otherwise than in accordance with the following provision (that is to say):

(2.) A carcase or any portion thereof may be buried or destroyed in or on any such premises with the permission in writing of the Local Authority, granted on a Certificate of a Veterinary Inspector certifying that to the best of his knowledge and belief such carcase or portion of carcase is the carcase or formed a portion of the carcase of a head of cattle that



was not when it died or was slaughtered affected with pleuro-pneumonia.

*Carcases of Cattle Affected with Pleuro-Pneumonia.*

9.—(1.) The carcase of every head of cattle in or on the premises of a Registered Cowkeeper situate in the City of London or in the County of London that was when it died or was slaughtered affected with pleuro-pneumonia shall be dealt with in such manner as the Board may direct, and not otherwise.

(2.) The provisions of Article 25 of The Pleuro-Pneumonia Order of 1891 shall not apply to any carcase in or on the premises of a Registered Cowkeeper situate in the City of London or in the County of London.

*Mode of obtaining Licence.*

10.—(1.) Where a Registered Cowkeeper in the City of London or in the County of London is desirous of moving a head of cattle or a carcase or a portion of a carcase out of, or of burying or destroying a carcase or a portion of a carcase in or on, a cow-shed, field, yard, farm, or other place under this Order, he may give notice in writing of such his desire to the Local Authority of the City of London or of the County of London, as the case may be, or to an officer of either of those Local Authorities appointed in that behalf, stating :

(i.) The name and residence of the owner of the animal or carcase, and the place where the animal or carcase then is :

(ii.) The name of the person to whom, and the place to which, the animal or carcase or portion of carcase is to be sent.

(2.) On receipt of any such notice the Local Authority shall, unless there appears to them good reason to the contrary, as soon as may be, cause their Veterinary Inspector to visit the place from which the animal or carcase or portion of a carcase is proposed to be moved, or in or on which the carcase or portion of a carcase is proposed to be buried or destroyed.

*Saving for Inspectors and Officers of the Board.*

11. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to affect the action of an Inspector of the Board, or of any person specially authorized by the Board, in dealing with outbreaks of pleuro-pneumonia, and this Order shall not apply to or interfere with the movement of cattle or carcasses or the burial or destruction of carcasses moved or buried or destroyed under the direction or in charge of such Inspector or person.

*Form of Licence.*

12. The Form of Movement Licence given in the Schedule is part of this Order, and shall be used as indicated in this Order, with such variations as circumstances require.

*Granting of Licences and Permission to Bury or Destroy.*

13.—(1.) The Local Authority may, if they think fit, withhold a Licence or permission to bury or destroy in any case where the movement of the cattle or carcase proposed to be moved or the burial or destruction of the carcase or portion of carcase would be in their judgment inexpedient or improper.

(2.) No Licence for movement of a head of cattle or a carcase or portion of carcase or permission to bury or destroy a carcase or portion of carcase granted under this Order shall be available if granted by the owner of the animal or carcase to be moved or buried or destroyed or by his agent, or by the owner or consignee or other person selling the animal or carcase, or exposing the animal or carcase for sale, or by the purchaser

thereof or by his agent, or by the auctioneer or other person conducting the sale at which the head of cattle or carcase is exposed, or by the occupier of the cow-shed, field, yard, farm, or other place from or to which the animal or carcase is to be moved or where the carcase or portion of carcase is to be buried or destroyed.

*Production of Licences : Names and Addresses.*

14.—(1.) Every person in charge of cattle or carcasses being moved, where under this Order a Licence for such movement may be necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorizing the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Every person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

*Copy of every Licence to be sent to Board.*

15. The Local Authority shall cause a copy of every Licence granted by them under this Order to be forthwith sent to the Director, Veterinary Department, Board of Agriculture, St. James's-square, London, S.W.

*Offences.*

16.—(1.) If a head of cattle is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Movement Licence thereunder, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the head of cattle is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(2.) If a person in charge of a head of cattle being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(3.) If a carcase is removed in contravention of this Order, or is buried or destroyed in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Licence thereunder, the owner of the carcase, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the removal or burial or destruction, and the person removing or conveying the carcase or burying or destroying the same, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been removed in contravention as aforesaid, and the person burying or destroying the carcase, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(4.) If any person with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows a head of cattle to stray he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.
