(c.) Dogs which have on a collar with the name and address of the owner of the dog

legibly engraved on such collar.

and the requirements as to muzzling contained in the said Article 6 shall not apply to such dogs as aforesaid in those Districts or part of District.

Saving as to Application of Orders.

2. Nothing in this Order shall in any way amend or affect the Muzzling Order in its application to any District or part of a District of a Local Authority which is not mentioned in the Schedule to this Order, or affect the provisions of the Order of the Board of Agriculture dated the eleventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, excluding the borough of Barrow-in-Furness, and so much of the county of Lancaster as is comprised in the Hundred of Lonsdale North of the Sands in that county, from the provisions of the Muzzling Order.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as THE RABIES (MUZZLING OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1889, AMENDMENT No. 7.

Commencement.

4. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the seventeenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.
