THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

- 1. The following Area (namely),—such portion of the borough of Romsey, in the county of Southampton, as is comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north and west by the municipal boundary of the parish of Romsey Infra, on the east by the west side of the Greatbridge-road, and on the south by an imaginary line from the west side of the railway arch crossing the Greatbridge-road back to the western municipal boundary of the parish of Romsey Infra aforesaid, - which was declared by Order of the Board of Agriculture to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swinefever.
- 2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the sixteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.
