HER Majesty has been pleased by Her Order in Council of the twenty-third day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, to direct that new Letters Patent (to be made and sealed for the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the Isle of Man) be granted to Thomas Churchman Darby, of Pleshey Lodge, near Chelmsford, in the county of Essex, for the term of ten years, for the invention of "Improvements in Apparatus for Cultivating Land," as described in certain Letters Patent (No. 2555) granted to the said Thomas Churchman Darby, for the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Channel Islands, and bearing date the third day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven.

THE Portuguese Minister in London has addressed a Note, dated the 22nd instant, to the Marquis of Salisbury, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, giving notice on the part of the Portuguese Government to terminate the Treaty of Commerce and Navigation between Great Britain and Portugal of July 3, 1842, and the Supplementary Convention of May 22, 1882.

The above-mentioned Treaty and Convention will accordingly expire on the 22nd of June, 1892.
