THE RABIES (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1891.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. So much of Article 16 (*Slaughter in Rabies*) of The Rabies Order of 1887, dated the thirty-first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, as relates to dogs is hereby revoked.

2. A Local Authority may cause any dog affected with or suspected of rabies or having been bitten by a dog affected with or suspected of rabies within their district to be slaughtered.

3. This Order may be cited as The Rabies (Amendment) Order of 1891.

(1.) A Place comprising the cow-sheds and premises known as Black Boy Yard, situate in the Globe-road East, Mile End-road, Old Town, in the county of London, in the occupation of Mr. William Davis.

(2.) A Place comprising the cow-sheds situate at No. 1, Sidney-street, Commercial-road, in the county of London, in the occupation of Mr. Frederick Chandler.

(PORT OF DUNDEE—APPROVAL OF LANDING-PLACE FOR FOREIGN ANIMALS.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby approve of the following part of the Port of Dundee as a landing-place for foreign animals not subject to slaughter or quarantine:

All that space situate in the parish of Dundee, in the burgh of Dundee, and on certain land called the Reclaimed Ground on the north bank of the river Tay and included within the following boundary, namely,—commencing at a point on the water-edge of the said river Tay at a distance of one thousand six hundred and fifty feet or thereabouts to the east of the East Shipbuilding Yard, thence in a northerly direction for a distance of one hundred and seventy-one feet or thereabouts, thence in a westernly direction for a distance of seventy-eight feet or thereabouts, thence in a northerly direction for a distance of one hundred and eight feet or thereabouts, thence in an easternly direction for a distance of seventy-eight feet or thereabouts, thence in a northerly direction for
