In the centre of Alpha Road, commencing forty-five yards East of Grove Road, and extending Eastwards as far as necessary; horses' heads to the West.

Two Carriages.

On the North-West side of Burroughs Lane, Hendon, between the entrances to the Midland Railway Station and Goods Yard; with horses' heads towards South-West.

Five Carriages:

At Station Road, in front of Hayes Common Cricket Ground, three on one side of entrance to foot-path across Cricket Ground, and two on the other; horses' heads towards Hayes

Three Carriages.

At Lavender Hill, South-East corner of Falcon Road; horses' heads eastwards.

Ten Carriages.

In Victoria Street, Westminster, to commence opposite the end of the hoarding adjoining the East end of St. Margaret's Mansions, and continue along the centre of roadway in an Easterly direction as far as may be necessary; horses' heads to the

Twelve Carriages.

On the South-West side of Norwood Road, sixteen yards back from Dulwich Road, extending Southwards as far as necessary for twelve Hackney Carriages; horses' heads towards Herne Hill Railway Station.

Five Carriages.

At Bransby Road, to commence at end of Herne Hill Railway Station, extending Southward to Norwood Road as far as necessary for five Hackney Carriages; horses' heads towards the Station.

Two Carriages.
