

ALPHA ROAD, Lisson Grove.	King William Street, proceeding Northwards ; horses' heads towards the Strand. Four Carriages. In the centre of Alpha Road, commencing forty-five yards East of Grove Road, and extending Eastwards as far as necessary ; horses' heads to the West.
BURROUGHS LANE, Hendon.	Two Carriages. On the North-West side of Burroughs Lane, Hendon, between the entrances to the Midland Railway Station and Goods Yard ; with horses' heads towards South-West.
STATION ROAD, Hayes Common.	Five Carriages: At Station Road, in front of Hayes Common Cricket Ground, three on one side of entrance to foot-path across Cricket Ground, and two on the other ; horses' heads towards Hayes Village.
LAVENDER HILL, Falcon Road.	Three Carriages. At Lavender Hill, South-East corner of Falcon Road ; horses' heads eastwards.
VICTORIA STREET, Orchard Street.	Ten Carriages. In Victoria Street, Westminster, to commence opposite the end of the hoarding adjoining the East end of St. Margaret's Mansions, and continue along the centre of roadway in an Easterly direction as far as may be necessary ; horses' heads to the West.
NORWOOD ROAD, Dulwich Road.	Twelve Carriages. On the South-West side of Norwood Road, sixteen yards back from Dulwich Road, extending Southwards as far as necessary for twelve Hackney Carriages ; horses' heads towards Herne Hill Railway Station.
BRANSBY ROAD, Herne Hill.	Five Carriages. At Bransby Road, to commence at end of Herne Hill Railway Station, extending Southward to Norwood Road as far as necessary for five Hackney Carriages ; horses' heads towards the Station.
BALCOMBE STREET, Dorset Square.	Two Carriages. In centre of Balcombe Street, seventeen yards North of Marylebone Road, and extending Northwards as far as necessary ; horses' heads towards the North.
KING'S ROAD, Upton Park.	Four Carriages. To commence at the West end of King's Road, Upton Park, and extend along the centre of the road Eastward as far as necessary for four Hackney Carriages to stand ; horses' heads West.
EUSTON ROAD.	Fifty-nine Carriages. In the centre of the roadway of Euston Road, commencing West of the Refuge opposite Judd Street, and continued to Gordon Street ; horses' heads towards the East.
SOUTHWARK STREET, Borough High Street.	Fifteen Carriages. In Southwark Street, along centre of roadway commencing opposite No. 18, and extending in a Westerly direction to the South-Eastern Railway Arch ; horses facing East.
SOUTHWARK STREET, Southwark Bidge Road.	Ten Carriages. In Southwark Street, along centre of roadway commencing opposite No. 62, and extending Westerly to corner of Great Guildford Street ; horses' heads facing East.
QUEEN'S GATE, Cromwell Road.	Eighteen Carriages. Commencing fifteen yards from Cromwell Road on the East side of Queen's Gate, by the kerb-stone, extending Northward as far as necessary for eighteen Cabs to stand ; horses' heads to face Cromwell Road.
HIGH HOLBORN, Chancery Lane,	Twenty Carriages. In the centre of the roadway of Holborn from the City boundary to Chancery Lane ; horses' heads towards the West.
VICTORIA ROAD, St. James's Road, Surbiton,	Four Carriages. On the South side of Victoria Road, Surbiton, extending Westward from the Railway Station ; horses' heads Eastwards.
VICTORIA ROAD, Adelaide Road, Surbiton,	Four Carriages. On the South side of Victoria Road, Surbiton, extending Eastward by the dead wall as far as Adelaide Road ; horses' heads Westwards—towards the Railway Station.
HIGH STREET, Putney.	Nine Carriages. In High Street, Putney ; commencing opposite the South exit door of the Railway Station, and extending along the centre of the roadway Northwards as far as necessary ; horses' heads southwards.
NORROY ROAD, Putney.	Three Carriages. In the centre of Norroy Road, commencing from High Street,
