THE YORK (KNAVESMIRE) PLEURO-PNEUMONIA MOVEMENT ORDER OF 1891.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Restriction on Movement.

1.—(1.) No cattle shall be moved on to the Knavesmire in the city of York except as pro-

vided by this Order:

(2.) Cattle may be moved for the purpose of grazing on to the Knavesmire with a Licence of a Pasture-Master granted on a Certificate of a Veterinary Inspector, or of a person qualified according to the Act of 1878 to be such, certifying that each of the cattle described in the Certificate is in his opinion free from pleuropneumonia.

(3.) The Pasture-Master granting the Licence under this Order shall retain the Certificate produced to him and shall forthwith deliver the same to the Local Authority for the city of York or to such person as the Local Authority may

Offences.

2. If a head of cattle is moved on to the Knavesmire or Scarcroft or Hob Moor in the city of York, in contravention of the provisions of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as THE YORK (KNAVESMIRE) PLEURO-PNEUMONIA MOVEMENT ORDER OF 1891.

Commencement.

4. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the ninth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

Interpretation.

5. In this Order-

The Act of 1878 means The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878:

The Knavesmire means the tract of land situate in the city of York over which the Freemen of Micklegate Ward in that city have rights of pasturage, and includes the adjoining pieces of land called Scarcroft and Hob Moor respectively and over which the said Freemen have the same rights of pasturage.

Pasture-Master means a person who for the time being is a duly elected Pasture-Master of Micklegate Ward Strays (comprising the Knavesmire, Scarcroft, and Hob Moor) in the city of York.

Other terms have the same meaning as in The Pleuro-Pneumonia Order of 1891.
