Privy Council Office, July 20, 1891.

THE following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the Local Board of the Local Government District of Haslingden, in the county of Lancaster, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in pursuance of the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1885:—

"Whereas by the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882 and 1885, it is enacted that where a petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Privy Council in the said Acts and in this Scheme referred to as 'the Committee of Council,' and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter, the said Committee of Council may settle a Scheme for the purposes in the said Acts named and containing such provisions as are in the said Acts particularized.

"And whereas certain inhabitant householders of the Local Government District of Haslingden, in the county of Lancaster, petitioned Her Majesty the Queen praying for the Grant of a Charter of Incorporation.

"And whereas the said petition for a Charter was referred to the Committee of Council, and it was proposed by the Charter to extend the

Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter.

"And whereas by a Royal Charter a district co-extensive with the Local Government District of Haslingden comprising such parts of the townships of Haslingden, Henheads, Higher Booths, Lower Booths, Musbury, Tottington-Higher-End, and Tottington-Lower-End, as are included in the said Local Government District of Haslingden has been created a Municipal Borough by the name of the Borough of Haslingden and the said Charter extended the Municipal Corporations Acts to the said borough of Haslingden.

"And whereas in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five under, and by virtue of, the Local Government Act, 1875, the Local Board for the Local Government District of Haslingden (hereinafter called the Local Board) was duly constituted and became invested with various powers and duties and the same became and was the Urban Sanitary Authority for the said Local Government District of Haslingden, and the said Local Government District from the time of the creation thereof until the extension thereof in the

year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three as hereinafter-mentioned consisted of the district of Hadingdon

of Haslingden.

"And whereas under and by virtue of 'the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 9) Act, 1883' (in this Scheme referred to as the Act of 1883) and the Haslingden Order thereto scheduled (hereinafter called the Order of 1883) the Local Government District of Haslingden was extended so as to include the whole of the district which has been created a Municipal Borough by Charter as abovementioned and was divided into two wards, viz.: the North Ward and the South Ward.

"And whereas there is in existence a School Board for the township of Tottington-Higher-End, and it is expedient to make certain provisions with respect to the alteration of the boundaries of the district of the School Board so as to exclude from such district such part of the township of Tottington-Higher-End as is within the borough, and to make such other provisions as are herein-

after contained:

"And whereas under and by virtue of 'The Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 7) Act, 1890' (in this Scheme referred to as the Act of 1890) and the 'Haslingden and Rawtenstall Outfall Sewerage District Order' thereto scheduled (hereinafter called the Order of 1890) the Urban Sanitary Districts of Haslingden and Rawtenstall (thereinafter referred to as the Constituent Districts) were formed into a United District called the Haslingden and Rawtenstall Outfall Sewerage District.

"And whereas it is expedient that such provision should be made for the continuance of a united district as provided for by the said Order, and for the property, rights, powers, duties obligations and privileges conferred or imposed by or acquired under the Order of 1890 and the Act of 1890 as by this Scheme is hereinafter made.

"And whereas by the Order of 1883 it was specially provided that the Local Board for the said extended district (in this Scheme referred to as 'the Local Board') should from time to time make separate assessments and levy and make such rates in the nature of a General District Rate upon the part of their district which constituted the Local Government District of Haslingden immediately before the commencement of the said Order of 1883 (hereinafter referred to as the Original District) as would be sufficient to defray in the manner provided by section 234 of the Public Health Act, 1875, the sum of twenty-

one thousand nine hundred and sixty-five pounds four shillings and tenpence or so much thereof as should be owing at the commencement of the said Order of 1883, and the interest due or to become due thereon within the respective periods for which the loans in respect of which the said sum

was owing were originally sanctioned.

"And whereas a portion of the said loans was expended in the purchase of three farms known by the several names of 'Clod,' 'Rough,' and 'Springwood' situate in the township of Haslingden in the county of Lancaster, and within the original district of Haslingden which were intended to be utilized for the treatment thereon of the sewage of the said original district, but since the constitution of the Haslingden and Rawtenstall Outfall Sewerage District such land will be no longer required for such purpose.

"And whereas the said Local Board and the Haslingden and Rawtenstall Outfall Sewcrage Board are Local Authorities within the meaning of Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act,

"And whereas the Scheme has before being settled by the Committee of Council been referred to the consideration of the Committee of the Lords of the Privy Council on Education to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and to the Local Government Board.

" And whereas it is expedient right and just that a Scheme should be made and settled pursuant to Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act 1882 as amended by the School Boards Act 1885, containing the provisions hereinafter con-

tained.

" Now therefore the said Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein and do hereby direct, order and declare as follows:

"1. This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as the Borough of Haslingden Scheme, 1891.

"2. This Scheme (when confirmed by Parliament or Order in Council as the case may be) shall come and be deemed to have come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough created by the Charter above referred to and shall be construed and have effect accordingly for all purposes. This date is herein-mentioned as the 'Commencement of this Scheme.' If and so far as may be neces-

sary this Scheme shall operate retrospectively.

"3. In this Scheme the expression 'the Charter, shall mean the said Charter creating the Municipal Borough of Haslingden. The expression 'the borough' shall mean the said borough of Haslingden. The expression 'the Corporation' shall mean the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Haslingden, acting by the Council. The expression 'the Local Government shall mean the Local Government District' District of Haslingden as it existed at the date of the said Charter. The expression 'the Local Board' shall mean the Local Board for the Local Government District of Haslingden.

"4. Immediately from and after the commencement of this Scheme the Local Board shall be dissolved and the Local Government District shall cease to be a Local Government District, and immediately on from and after the day of the first meeting of the Council of the borough, the borough shall be deemed to have been and shall

continue placed within the jurisdiction of the Corporation as the Sanitary Authority.

"5. Any investigation legal proceeding or remedy in respect of any property, debt, liability or forfeiture due to or incurred by or on behalf of Scheme may be continued prosecuted or enforced by the Corporation or against the Corporation and any Bye-laws made by the Local Board and in force at the date of the first meeting of the Council of the borough, shall continue in force except so far as the same may be repealed or altered by Byc-laws hereafter duly made by the Corporation and confirmed and shall apply throughout the borough.

"6. The three farms known by the names of 'Clod,' Rough,' and 'Springwood' situate in the township of Haslingden, and within the limits of the original district of Haslingden shall be and remain the property of the Corporation in trust for the said original district and the rents and profits thereof and if sold the proceeds of the sale thereof shall be applied in part payment and discharge of the loans and the interest thereon charged upon the said original district by the Order of 1883, provided that if the said farms or any part thereof shall be unsold at the date of the repayment of the whole of the said loans and interest thereon the rent and profits of the said farms or the proceeds arising from the sale thereof if sold shall from and after such repayment be held by the Corporation in trust for the borough and shall be applied for such purposes for the benefit of the borough as the Corporation may from time to time with the consent of the Local Government Board direct.

"7. All rights, powers, property, liabilities, or obligations vested in or attached to the Local Board under the Public Health Act, 1875, or any Act amending or enlarging the same or incorporated therewith save and except as provided for by Clause 6 hereof shall pass to be exerciseable by or against and vest in or attach to the Corporation.

"8. The effect of Clauses 6 and 7 hereof shall be and be taken to be such as may be declared in the event of any question arising with respect thereto by the Local Government Board under their seal and their declaration as to the effect of the said clauses shall be final for all purposes

whatever.

- "9. The provisions of the Order of 1883 requiring the making of separate assessments and the levying and making of rates in the nature of General District Rates upon the Original district for the purpose of defraying the loans as therein provided together with the interest due or to become due thereon and all the provisions of the said Order necessary to enable the said loans and interest thereon to be defrayed or relating thereto shall remain in full force and effect until the saidloans respectively and all interest thereon shall have been respectively wholly satisfied and discharged, but no longer; and the Corporation shall make such separate assessments and levy, and make such rates as may be necessary to carry the said provisions into effect and for the purposes aforesaid the Corporation shall have exercise and perform all the duties, rights, powers, and obligations of the Local Board in relation to the matters aforesaid and the same may be enforced by or against the Corporation accordingly.
- The Tottington Higher End School Board shall cease to have or to exercise any jurisdiction within that part of their district which is included within the borough.
- "11. The Act of 1890, and the Order of 1890 shall be read as if 'The Borough of Haslingden' were substituted for 'The Local Government District of Haslingden,' 'The Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Haslingden' for the Local Board before the commencement of this 'The Haslingden Local Board' and 'The Mayor'

for 'The Chairman of the Local Board,' wherever

the said expressions respectively occur.

"12. The accounts of the Local Board and of their Officers shall be (as soon as conveniently may be) audited by the District Auditor in like manner and subject to the like powers, duties, provisions and right of appeal as if the Charter had not been granted; the provisions of sections 247 and 250 of the Public Health Act, 1875, as amended by the District Auditors Act, 1879, and any regulations duly issued by the Local Government Board with respect to the Audit of Accounts of Local Boards, and of their Officers, shall apply to such Audit and the provisions of this scheme with respect to the Local Board shall be construed so as to admit of such exceptions as may be necessary to enable such Audit to be duly made, but such exceptions shall be strictly limited in time, extent, character, and operation to the purposes of such Audit.

"13. All Bye-laws made under or in pursuance of the Public Health Act, 1875, shall continue in force and be enforced in the said borough to the same extent in which they are now in force and enforceable within the district of the said Local Board substituting only the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Haslingden, and their Officers for the Haslingden Local Board and their Officers. The said Bye-laws may be altered, amended, or revoked as if they were Bye-laws duly made by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Haslingden acting by the Council of the Borough under the Public Health Act, 1875, and the Acts amending

the same."
