WHEREAS by the third section of "The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880," the killing and taking of wild birds was prohibited for the time between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of August in each year, and by the eighth section power was given to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as to Great Britain, upon the application of the Justices in Quarter Sessions assembled of any county, to extend or vary the time during which the killing and taking of wild birds, or any of them, was prohibited by the said Act, such extension or variation to be made by Order of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State:

Whereas, by section 11, sub-section (5) (1) of "The Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889," the powers and duties conferred upon the Justices in Quarter Sessions assembled by the aforesaid Act are now transferred to and vested in the

County Council of each county:

And whereas the County Council of the county of Zetland have applied to me to the effect that an Order should be made directing that the time during which the killing and taking of wild birds is prohibited shall be extended in regard to the county of Zetland so as to be from the 1st day of March to the 31st day of August.

Now, therefore, I, the Most Honourable Schomberg Henry, Marquess and Earl of Lothian, K.T., Her Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, in pursuance of the said Acts, and of "The Secretary for Scotland Acts, 1885 to 1889," and on such application aforesaid, hereby order as
