THE Board of Trade, have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, the following Notice respecting quarantine at Cyprus, viz. :—

QUARANTINE.

UNDER the powers vested in him by the "Quarantine Ordinance, 1879," His Excellency the High Commissioner is pleased to direct that—

1. All vessels arriving in any port or part of Cyprus, except the port of Larnaca, from the Hedjaz, unless they have both undergone quarantine at an intermediate port and are provided with a clean bill of health, shall be repelled.

2. Vessels arriving at the port of Larnaca from the Hedjaz shall be placed in quarantine for at least ten clear days unless such vessels have both undergone quarantine at an intermediate port and are provided with a clean bill of health. Any passengers permitted to land from such vessels shall be landed in quarantine and shall undergo a quarantine of at least ten clear days from the date of leaving the ship. Passengers' baggage and merchandise shall be landed in quarantine and shall undergo, at the risk and cost of the owner or consignee, such disinfection as may be considered necessary by the Superintendent of Quarantine. Rags shall be repelled. Mails, except those forwarded in tarred bags from non-infected countries, shall be landed in quarantine, disinfected, and delivered to the Postal authorities with all possible despatch.

3. Nothing in the foregoing regulations shall be held to prevent the Chief Superintendent of

Quarantine, should he think it advisable, from refusing to admit any vessel to pratique.

MERSEY CONSERVANCY ACT.

THE Commissioners for the Conservancy of the River Mersey hereby give notice, pursuant to the 9th section of the Act 5 and 6 Victoria, cap. 110, intituled "An Act for the better preserving the Navigation of the River Mersey," that they have received from Mr. Joseph Banks, of 37, Ellen's-lane, Lower Bebington, in the county of Cheshire, Cowkeeper, a notice, given pursuant to

the provisions of the abovementioned Act, of his intention to level, and raise above the flow of a twenty-one feet tide, a piece of marsh land at the head of one of the branches of Bromborough Pool, in the said county, in accordance with plans lodged in this office.

"I, Joseph Banks, of 37, Ellen's-lane, Lower Bebington, Cowkeeper, hereby give notice that I propose, on the 12th day of October next, to commence to level and raise above the flow of a twenty-one feet tide a piece of marsh land belonging to me, situated at Primrose Hill, Lower Bebington, at the head of one of the branches of Bromborough Pool (being the westerly portion of the field numbered 138 in the Ordnance Map, Bebington and Bromborough Parishes, Cheshire, Western Division, Sheet XIII, 16), by depositing on the said marsh land dry ashpit refuse of an average depth of three feet, and covering the same with earth or sand of an average depth of one foot, with the object of making the said marsh land fit for cultivation as agricultural or horticultural land, but so and in such manner that the proposed work shall not materially project into or exclude, impede, or interrupt the tidal or other waters of the River Mersey, or any river, pool, creek, or inlet communicating therewith.
