Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare that Leonard Holmes à Court, Esquire, Lieutenant, 1st Battalion, the Wiltshire Regiment, Richard Henry Holmes à Court, Esquire, Charles Holmes à Court, Esquire, Herbert Edward Holmes à Court, Esquire, Lieutenant, Royal Navy, Alfred Holmes à Court, Esquire, Henry Worsley Holmes à Court, Esquire, Emily Caroline Holmes à Court, Edith Mary Holmes à Court, and Elizabeth Ann Holmes à Court, Spinsters, the brothers and sisters of the said William Frederick, now Baron Heytesbury, shall henceforth have, hold, and enjoy the same title, place, pre-eminence, and precedence as if their father had survived his father, William Henry Ashe, Baron Heytesbury, and had thereby succeeded to the said title and dignity of Baron Heytesbury:

And to command that the said Royal Order and Declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms.

**VICTORIA**, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith, to the President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurers, and other Members of the Council for the time being of the Society for the Encouragement of Arts, Manufactures, and Commerce; Greeting!

Whereas it has been notified to Us, through Our Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, that the President of the United States of America, pursuant to an Act of Congress, has made Proclamation that an Universal Exhibition of the Works of Industry and Agriculture, as well as of the Fine Arts, will be held at Chicago, in the State of Illinois, in the United States of America, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and has invited Great Britain and Her Colonies to take part therein by appointing Representatives thereat, and sending such exhibits as will most fully and fitly illustrate their resources industries, and progress in civilization:

And whereas it is Our wish that such Exhibition shall afford full and suitable representations of the Industry, the Agriculture, and the Fine Arts in Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Our Colonies and Dependencies in Europe, Asia, Africa, America, and Australasia, and that Our subjects shall take part in such Exhibition:

Now know ye that We, considering the premises and earnestly desiring to promote the success of the said Exhibition, and reposing great trust and confidence in your fidelity, discretion, and integrity, have authorized and appointed, and by these presents do authorize and appoint, you the President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurers, and other Members of the Council for the time being of the Society for the Encouragement of Arts, Manufactures, and Commerce, to be Our Commissioners to obtain and distribute full information as to the best mode by which the products of the Manufacturing and Agricultural Industries and the Fine Arts of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and of Our Colonies and Dependencies, may be procured and forwarded for exhibition; to assist with your advice and co-operation; and generally to promote the success of the said Exhibition.

And Our will and pleasure is that you, the said Council of the Society for the Encouragement of Arts, Manufactures, and Commerce, do report to Us in writing, under the Seal of the Society, all and every the several proceedings of yourselves had by virtue of these presents.

And, lastly, We do by these presents ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue until the close of the said Exhibition, and until the various proceedings in connection therewith shall have been properly concluded and brought to an end; and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, shall and may from time to time, and at any place or places, proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

Given at Our Court at *Saint James's*, the twenty-sixth day of *August*, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, in the fifty-fifth year of Our Reign.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: District Auditors Act, 1879: Assignment of Duties and District:—

## North Yorkshire Audit District.

To Sidney Dominic Jerrold, of Westwood Priory, Scarborough, District Auditor;—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Unions named in the Schedule to this Order;—

To the Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised within the said Unions respectively;—

To the Highway Board for each of the Highway Districts of East Hang, Leyburn, Northallerton, and West Bulmer;—

To the River Tees Port Sanitary Authority;—

To the Authorities referred to in Article I. (3) of this Order;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of "The District Auditors Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Local

Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act :

And whereas the said Sidney Dominic Jerrold is a District Auditor duly appointed under the provisions of the Statutes in that behalf for a period of one year from the date hereof.

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, hereby certify the appointment of the said Sidney Dominic Jerrold accordingly, and hereby Order and Prescribe as follows :—

ARTICLE I.—It shall be the duty of the said District Auditor to audit the Accounts of the following Authorities and their Officers ; namely,—

- (1.) The Guardians of the Poor of the several Unions named in the First Schedule to this Order.
- (2.) The Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in the said several Unions.
- (3.) The several other Authorities for the time being whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being wholly situated within one or more of the said Unions.
- (4.) The Highway Boards for the Highway Districts named in the Second Schedule to this Order, such Districts being partly within one or more of the said several Unions.
- (5.) The River Tees Port Sanitary Authority, the area within the jurisdiction of such Port Sanitary Authority, being partly within one of the said Unions.
- (6.) Such other Authorities whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being partly situated within one or more of the said Unions, as We may by Order under Seal hereafter prescribe.

ARTICLE II.—The said District Auditor shall audit the said Accounts according to the provisions of the several Statutes and of the Orders issued by competent authority, in force for the time being in that behalf, and shall perform all such duties and exercise all such powers in connection with the audit of such Accounts as are prescribed and conferred by the said Statutes and Orders.

ARTICLE III.—The District in which the said Sidney Dominic Jerrold shall act as Auditor, and which We hereby assign to him for the performance of the duties assigned to him by this Order, and which shall be termed "The North Yorkshire Audit District," shall, until We otherwise prescribe, comprise the area for the time being included in the several Unions and Districts named in the Schedules to this Order, the District of the Port Sanitary Authority named in paragraph (5) of Article I. of this Order, and the Districts or areas subject to the jurisdiction of any such Authority as is mentioned in paragraph (6) of the said Article I.

ARTICLE IV.—In this Order—

The term "Parish" includes any place for which a separate Poor Rate is or can be made or for which a separate Overseer is or can be appointed.

The term "Overseers of the Poor" includes Churchwardens and Assistant Overseers.

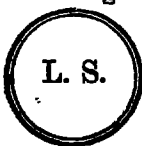

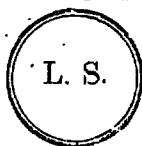
