THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, information from Her Majesty's Representative in Japan, that the Regulations for the Inspection of Vessels, issued by the Imperial Japanese Government on the 23rd June, 1882, will be put in force from the 7th June at the port of Nagasaki, in the case of all vessels arriving, either directly or otherwise, from the port of Bangkok, in Siam, or Malacca, places infected with cholera;

and that so long as these Regulations continue to be in operation in the port of Nagasaki, and hereafter in any other of the ports of Japan, where the Regulations in question may be enforced by the Japanese Government, all British vessels will, irrespective of the ports of departure or call, on their arrival be visited by health officers, and should cases of cholera have occurred on board during the voyage such vessels will be dealt with in the same manner as if they had sailed from or called at ports declared to be infected with cholera; also, that the Regulations for the medical inspection of vessels, issued by the Imperial Japanese Government on the 23rd June, 1882, have been put in force from the 20th instant at the ports of Nagasaki, Kuchinotsu, Akamagaseki, Kobe, and Yokohama, in the case of all vessels arriving, either directly or otherwise, from the ports of Singapore, Shanghai, and Swatow.

The quarantine stations are:—Nagaura for Yokohama, Wada Point for Kobe, and Megami in Nagasaki Bay for Kuchinotsu.

Re-Exhibition of Chassiron Point Permanent Light, and Discontinuance of Provisional Light.

WITH reference to Notices to Mariners, Nos. 159 and 391 of 1891:—

The French Government has given further notice, that the necessary works being completed, the permanent light will be re-exhibited at Chassiron Point, on the 27th September, 1891, and the provisional light discontinued:—

Chassiron Point permanent light will be a flashing white light of the first order, showing flashes every ten seconds, preceded and followed by total eclipses; over ile d'Oléron the character of the light will be altered by occultations through an arc of about 30°, or from the bearing of N. 12° W. to N. 42° W. The light is elevated 164 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 19 miles. It is antici-

pated that the rays of the flashes may be seen much farther off.

Re-Exhibition of Light near Hollum.

The Netherlands Government has given further notice, that on 1st October, 1891, the fixed white leading light near Hollum, west end of Ameland, will be re-exhibited from its altered position—477 yards N.W. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. from the principal light (flashing white)—and will be visible from the bearing of N. by W., through east, to W. by S., and obscured through an arc of 90° , over Ameland.
