ORDER of the Local Government Board: District Auditor: Assignment of District and Duties (County Council):—

London County Audit District.

To Hugh Lloyd-Roberts, District Auditor;—
To the County Council of the Administrative County of London;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas by sub-section (3) of Section 71 of the Local Government Act, 1888, it is enacted that the Accounts of a County Council, and of the County Treasurer and Officers of such Council, shall be audited by the District Auditors appointed by the Local Government Board in like manner as the Accounts of an Urban Authority and their Officers under Sections 247 and 250 of the Public Health Act, 1875;

And whereas by sub-section (6) of Section 81 of the said Local Government Act, it is enacted that the Accounts of any Joint Committee appointed thereunder, and of their Officers, shall, for the purposes of the provisions of such Act, be deemed to be accounts of the County Council and their Officers;

And whereas by Section 18 of the Lunacy Act, 1891, it is enacted that the provisions of the Local Government Act, 1888, relating to the Accounts of County Councils and their Officers and to the audit of such Accounts shall apply to the Accounts of every Asylum belonging wholly or in part to a County Council and of the Visiting Committee and Officers thereof;

And whereas the said Hugh Lloyd-Roberts is a District Auditor duly appointed under the provisions of the Statutes in that behalf, and by an Order dated the 1st day of April, 1890, We, the Local Government Board, assigned to the said District Auditor the duty of auditing the Accounts therein mentioned so far as the same related to a period prior to the 1st day of April, 1890, and assigned to him "The South Eastern Counties Audit District";

And whereas by an Order dated the 4th day of May, 1891, We altered the said Order dated the 1st day of April, 1890, so that the period for which it was the duty of the said District Auditor to audit the said Accounts was changed to a period prior to the 1st day of April, 1891;

And whereas it is expedient that the said Orders should be rescinded, except as hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, We hereby certify the appointment of the said Hugh Lloyd-Roberts as a District Auditor, and do order and prescribe as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—We hereby rescind the said Orders dated the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and the fourth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, except so far as relates to any Audit already held or

commenced or any proceedings arising out of any such Audit.

ARTICLE II.—Unless we otherwise prescribe, it shall be the duty of the said District Auditor, from and after the date hereof, to audit the under-mentioned Accounts so far as the same are subject to audit by a District Auditor,—

- (1.) The Accounts of the County Council of the Administrative County of London and of their Officers.
- (2.) The Accounts of any Lunatic Asylum belonging wholly or in part to the said County Council, and not belonging in part to any other County Council, and of the Visiting Committee and Officers thereof.
- (3.) The Accounts of any Joint Committee consisting of representatives of the said County Council and the Quarter Sessions of any County.
- (4.) The Accounts of such of the Visiting Committees of Asylums or other Joint Committees including representatives of the said County Council and representatives of the County Council or Councils of some other County or Counties, as We may, by Order under our Seal, hereafter prescribe.

ARTICLE III.—The said District Auditor shall audit the said Accounts according to the provisions of the several Statutes and of the Orders issued by competent authority, in force for the time being in that behalf, and shall perform all such duties and exercise all such powers in connection with the audit of such Accounts as are prescribed and conferred by the said Statutes and Orders.

ARTICLE IV.—The District in which the said Hugh Lloyd-Roberts shall act as Auditor for the performance of the duties assigned to him by this Order, which District We hereby assign to him for the performance of such duties, and which shall be termed "The London County Audit District," shall, until We otherwise prescribe, comprise the area for the time being included in the Administrative County of London.

ORDER of the Local Government Board :
District Auditor : Assignment of District and Duties (County Councils) :—

South-Eastern Counties Audit District.

Counties of Kent, Middlesex, Surrey, East Sussex, and West Sussex.

To Francis Douglass Boggis-Rolfe, District Auditor ;—

To the County Councils of the Counties of Kent, Middlesex, Surrey, East Sussex, and West Sussex ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts ;

And whereas by Sub-section (3) of Section 71

of the Local Government Act, 1888, it is enacted that the Accounts of a County Council, and of the County Treasurer and Officers of such Council, shall be audited by the District Auditors appointed by the Local Government Board in like manner as the Accounts of an Urban Authority and their Officers under Sections 247 and 250 of the Public Health Act, 1875 ;

And whereas by sub-section (6) of Section 81 of the said Local Government Act, it is enacted that the Accounts of any Joint Committee appointed thereunder, and of their Officers, shall, for the purposes of the provisions of such Act, be deemed to be Accounts of the County Council and their Officers ;

And whereas by Section 18 of the Lunacy Act, 1891, it is enacted that the provisions of the Local Government Act, 1888, relating to the Accounts of County Councils and their Officers and to the audit of such Accounts shall apply to the Accounts of every Asylum belonging wholly or in part to a County Council and of the Visiting Committee and Officers thereof ;

And whereas the said Francis Douglass Boggis-Rolfe is a District Auditor duly appointed under the provisions of the Statutes in that behalf, and by certain Orders We, the Local Government Board, assigned to the said District Auditor his duties, and the District in which he should act as Auditor, such District being termed "The Surrey Audit District" ;

Now therefore, We hereby certify the appointment of the said Francis Douglass Boggis-Rolfe as a District Auditor, and do order and prescribe as follows :—

ARTICLE I.—Unless We otherwise prescribe it shall be the duty of the said District Auditor to audit the undermentioned Accounts so far as the same are subject to audit by a District Auditor and relate to the year ended on the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one :—

- (1.) The Accounts of the County Councils of the said several Administrative Counties of Kent, Middlesex, Surrey, East Sussex, and West Sussex, and of their officers.
- (2.) The Accounts of any Lunatic Asylum belonging wholly, or in part, to one or more of the said County Councils, and not belonging in part to any other County Council, and of the Visiting Committee and Officers thereof.
- (3.) The Accounts of any Joint Committee consisting entirely of representatives of two or more of the said County Councils, or of representatives of one or more of the said County Councils and of the Town Council or Councils of any County Borough or Boroughs, and the Accounts of the officers of any such Committee.
- (4.) The Accounts of any Joint Committee consisting of representatives of the County Council of any of the said Counties and the Quarter Sessions of any County, with or without representatives of the Town Council of any County Borough, and of the officers of any such Committee.
- (5.) The Accounts of such of the Visiting Committees of Asylums or other Joint Committees including representatives of the County Council of one or more of the said Counties and representatives of the County Council or Councils of some other County or Counties, as We may by Order under Our Seal hereafter prescribe.

ARTICLE II.—The said District Auditor shall audit the said Accounts according to the provi-

sions of the several Statutes and of the Orders issued by competent authority, in force for the time being in that behalf, and shall perform all such duties and exercise all such powers in connection with the audit of such Accounts as are prescribed and conferred by the said Statutes and Orders.

ARTICLE III.—The District in which the said Francis Douglass Boggis-Rolfe shall act as Auditor for the performance of the duties assigned to him by this Order, which District We hereby assign to him for the performance of such duties, and which shall be termed "The South-Eastern Counties Audit District," shall, until We otherwise prescribe, comprise the area for the time being included in the several Counties above-named.

ARTICLE IV.—Nothing in this Order shall affect or interfere with the duties and powers of the said Francis Douglass Boggis-Rolfe as District Auditor of the said Surrey Audit District.

ORDER of the Local Government Board Prescribing Form of Requisition for copy Certificate of Birth :—

To all Superintendent Registrars, and Regis-

trars of Births and Deaths in England and Wales ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 20 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1891, it is enacted as follows :—

" Where the age of any child or young person under the age of sixteen years is required to be ascertained or proved for the purposes of this Act, or for any purpose connected with the elementary education or employment in labour of such child or young person, any person shall, on presenting a written requisition, in such form, and containing such particulars as may be from time to time prescribed by the Local Government Board, and on payment of a fee of sixpence, be entitled to obtain a certified copy under the hand of a registrar or superintendent registrar of the entry in the register, under the Births and Deaths Registration Acts, 1836 to 1874, of the birth of that child or young person ; and such form of requisition shall on request be supplied without charge by every superintendent registrar and registrar of births, deaths, and marriages."

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby order as follows :

ARTICLE I.—The requisition to be made to entitle any person to obtain a certified copy of an entry of a registry of birth under the section above-cited shall be in the Form set forth in the Schedule to this Order.

Notwithstanding anything in Part V of The Animals Order of 1886 the cargo of cattle expected to arrive at the port of London from Canada in the vessel Rosarian on or about this twenty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, may be transhipped in the River Thames from such vessel to the vessel Racoon (in this Order called the landing-vessel) for conveyance to the Foreign Animals Wharf, known as the Foreign Cattle Market at Deptford.

2. Those cattle shall be transhipped in the presence and under the supervision and control of an Officer of Customs, and an Officer of Customs shall remain in charge of the cattle on board the landing-vessel until its arrival at the Foreign Animals Wharf.

3. The landing-vessel shall proceed direct to that Wharf, and the cattle shall be landed there in the presence and under the supervision and control of an Officer of Customs.

4.—(1.) The landing-vessel shall immediately after the landing of such cattle, and before being again used, be cleansed and disinfected as follows:

- (i.) All parts of the landing-vessel with which the cattle or their droppings have come in contact shall be scraped and swept: then
- (ii.) The same parts of the landing-vessel shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water: then
- (iii.) The same parts of the landing-vessel shall have applied to them a coating of lime-wash: except that
- (iv.) The application of lime-wash shall not be compulsory as regards such parts of the landing-vessel as are used for the crew.

(2.) The scrapings and sweepings of the landing-vessel shall not be landed unless and until they have been well mixed with quicklime.

5. The cattle so transhipped shall continue to be deemed foreign animals.

6. If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of any of the provisions of this Order, the owner or consignee of the cattle, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the landing-vessel, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or omissions, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

7. Terms in this Order have the same meaning as in The Animals Order of 1886.
