THE Board of Trade have received a copy of a Notice, dated 14th October, 1891, issued by Her Majesty's Representative at Malta :—

Government Notice No. 178.

His Excellency the Governor, having heard the opinion of the Board of Health, has been pleased to direct that Government Notice No. 162 of the 21st September, 1891, is to be modified with reference to paragraph 4, and that the other provisions therein as to quarantine remaining unaltered the following regulations are to be observed, viz. :—

1. Vessels with pilgrims from the East, or having had cases of cholera on board, as well as all vessels having or having had on board cases of diarrhœa, which in the opinion of the Quarantine Medical Officer may be presumed to indicate cholera, shall not be permitted to enter this harbour.

2. Vessels not provided with duly authorized Medical Officers shall undergo strict medical inspection on arrival from any ports of Southern Europe (from Cape St. Vincent eastwards), of Turkey in Asia, and of Northern Africa east of Tangiers.

3. Vessels arriving from the Persian Gulf after twenty-one days from their departure, are to be admitted to pratique. Vessels arriving within a shorter period are to complete twenty-one days' quarantine reckoned from the date of their departure from the above-mentioned ports.

4. Vessels arriving direct from the Mediterranean ports of Turkey in Asia, and which are not provided with a qualified Medical Officer, are to undergo seven days' quarantine. Vessels arriving from the above places and which are provided with a qualified Medical Officer will be admitted to pratique if the qualified Medical Officer on board certifies that twenty-one days previous to arrival at Malta there has not been any case of illness on board which might give rise to the suspicion of the existence of cholera on board.

5. Vessels arriving from Arabian ports in the Red Sea which have not been admitted to free pratique at Suez and Port Said will not be allowed to enter the harbours of Malta.

6. Vessels from Arabian ports in the Red Sea touching at intermediate ports before arrival in this island are to undergo a period of twenty-one days' quarantine, to be reckoned from the day

of their departure from the first port at which they were admitted to pratique.

7. Passengers arriving from Egypt, Syria, and ports in the Red Sea will not be permitted to land at Malta unless they produce evidence satisfactory to the Port Authority that they have not resided or been in Arabia for the twenty-one days previous to their departure.

8. Soiled linen and wearing apparel shall not be allowed to be landed from any ship which may be under any suspicion of having had recently on board a case of contagious or infectious disease, or from any ship arriving through the Suez Canal, or from Syria, Karamania, and Spain, except after disinfection at the Lazaretto or at such other place as may be appointed by the Port Authority.

9. The importation of susceptible goods as hereunder specified from any of the ports subjected to quarantine is prohibited, viz. :—

Rags, cotton, and cotton seed, raw silk, hair, and feathers.

10. The importation of rags from Egypt is prohibited.

11. The importation is prohibited from any port of the Mediterranean of vines, vine shoots, leaves, roots, or any part of the vine plant, poles, or supports of any kind used in the cultivation of vines; also of vegetable earth, vegetable or mixed manure, or of vegetable produce if it contain any part or fragment of the vine plant, and unless it be accompanied by a sworn declaration made by the shipper before the competent Authority of the place of its origin, to the effect that it does not contain vines, or any parts thereof, that its contents come from nurseries, hothouses, fields, or gardens in which there are no vines, in which no vines or any parts of vines have been stored, which are at least 200 yards distant from the nearest vines or vineyards, and in which, moreover, the Phylloxera does not exist.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, a follows :

1. The following Place (namely),—the yard, stable, cow-houses, and outhouses at the back of the Goldsmith Arms Inn, East Acton, in the parish of Acton, in the county of Middlesex, in the occupation of Mr. Charles Nind,—which was declared by Order of the Board dated the twenty-second day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Place shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-fourth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

THE EDINBURGH (COW-SHEDS) PLEURO-PNEUMONIA ORDER.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

Short Title.

1. This Order may be cited as THE EDINBURGH (COW-SHEDS) PLEURO-PNEUMONIA ORDER.

Extent and Enforcement of Order.

2. This Order shall extend and apply to the Edinburgh Pleuro-Pneumonia Scheduled District which District is declared by Orders of the Board of Agriculture and includes the following areas, namely :

the County of Edinburgh except that portion thereof known as the Gala Water District in the south-eastern corner of the County, comprising the parishes of Stow, Temple, Crichton, Heriot, Borthwick, Fala, and Cranston, and that portion of the Calder District of the County of Edinburgh comprising the parishes of Mid Calder, West Calder, and Kirknewton :

the Burgh of Edinburgh :

the Burgh of Leith :

the Burgh of Musselburgh : and

the Burgh of Portobello :

and the provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authorities of the aforesaid County and Burghs.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the twenty-third day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

Interpretation.

4. In this Order—

Registered Cowkeeper means any person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper who for the time being is registered under any Order of

the Privy Council or Board of Supervision made under the powers conferred by section 34 (*Dairies, Cow-Sheds, and Milk-Shops*) of the Act of 1878, as amended by section 9 of the Act of 1886 :

Premises of a Registered Cowkeeper means and includes any cow-shed, field, yard, farm, or other place in the occupation of a Registered Cowkeeper :

Pleuro-Pneumonia Infected Place means a place for the time being a place infected with pleuro-pneumonia under the Act of 1878 :

Cattle means bulls, cows, oxen, heifers, and calves :

Carcase means the carcase of a head of cattle, and includes part of such a carcase, and the lungs, meat, bones, hide, hoofs, horns, offal, or other part of a head of cattle, separately or otherwise, or any portion thereof :

Article means Article of this Order :

Schedule means Schedule to this Order :

Form means a Form given in the Schedule including the directions and notes in and on a Form :

Other terms have the same meaning and scope as in the Act of 1878.

Prohibition to Move Cattle between 7 P.M. and 5 A.M.

5. It shall not be lawful for any person to move any cattle out of or from any premises of a Registered Cowkeeper between the hours of 7 P.M. and 5 A.M.

Restriction on Movement of Cattle out of Registered Cowkeeper's Premises.

6.—(1.) No cattle shall be moved out of or from any premises of a Registered Cowkeeper without a Licence (in the Form A set forth in the Schedule or to the like effect) of the Local Authority first had and obtained, and which Licence shall only be granted on such a Certificate of a Veterinary Inspector as is described in that Licence.

(2.) Provided that where it is desired to move cattle from one part of a farm or of farms in the same occupation to another part of that farm or of those farms, or from and to a farm or premises to and from a common or grazing-land or watering-place which the occupier of the farm or premises is entitled to use for the cattle, the cattle may be so moved with an Occupation Licence (in the Form B set forth in the Schedule or to the like effect) of the Local Authority first had and obtained, and which Licence shall only be granted on such a Certificate of a Veterinary Inspector as is described in that Licence, the movement being wholly in the District of the same Local Authority ; and such Licence may authorize movement from time to time for a period of one calendar month and no longer ; but a fresh like Licence may be granted from time to time on a fresh like Certificate.

(3.) The provisions of this Article are in addition to and not in substitution of any regulations for the time being in force under any Order of the Board of Agriculture with respect to the movement of cattle in, into, or out of the Edinburgh Pleuro-Pneumonia Scheduled District.

Restriction on Removal of Carcases out of Registered Cowkeeper's Premises.

7.—(1.) No carcase nor any portion thereof shall be removed out of or from any premises of a Registered Cowkeeper otherwise than in accordance with the following provision (that is to say) :

(2.) A carcase or any portion thereof may be

removed out of or from any such premises with a Licence of the Local Authority granted on a Certificate of a Veterinary Inspector certifying that to the best of his knowledge and belief such carcase or portion of carcase is the carcase or formed a portion of the carcase of a head of cattle that was not when it died or was slaughtered affected with pleuro-pneumonia.

Restriction on Burial or Destruction of Carcases on Registered Cowkeeper's Premises.

8.—(1.) No carcase nor any portion thereof shall be buried or destroyed in or on any premises of a Registered Cowkeeper otherwise than in accordance with the following provision (that is to say):

(2.) A carcase or any portion thereof may be buried or destroyed in or on any such premises with the permission in writing of the Local Authority granted on a Certificate of a Veterinary Inspector certifying that to the best of his knowledge and belief such carcase or portion of carcase is the carcase or formed a portion of the carcase of a head of cattle that was not when it died or was slaughtered affected with pleuro-pneumonia.

Carcases of Cattle Affected with Pleuro-Pneumonia.

9.—(1.) The carcase of every head of cattle in or on the premises of a Registered Cowkeeper that was when it died or was slaughtered affected with pleuro-pneumonia shall be dealt with in such manner as the Board of Agriculture may direct, and not otherwise.

(2.) The provisions of Article 25 of The Pleuro-Pneumonia Order of 1891 shall not apply to any carcase in or on the premises of a Registered Cowkeeper to which this Order applies.

Mode of obtaining Licence.

10.—(1.) Where a Registered Cowkeeper is desirous of moving a head of cattle or a carcase or a portion of a carcase out of, or of burying or destroying a carcase or a portion of a carcase in or on, a cow-shed, field, yard, farm, or other place under this Order, he may give notice in writing of such his desire to the Local Authority or to an officer of the Local Authority appointed in that behalf, stating:

(i.) The name and residence of the owner of the animal or carcase, and the place where the animal or carcase then is:

(ii.) The name of the person to whom, and the place to which, the animal or carcase or portion of carcase is to be sent, or, in the case of an Occupation Licence, the places between which the animals are to be moved.

(2.) On receipt of any such notice the Local Authority shall, unless there appears to them good reason to the contrary, as soon as may be, cause their Veterinary Inspector to visit the place from which the animal or carcase or portion of a carcase is proposed to be moved, or in or on which the carcase or portion of a carcase is proposed to be buried or destroyed.

Saving for Inspectors and Officers of the Board.

11. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to affect the action of an Inspector of the Board of Agriculture, or of any person specially authorized by the Board, in dealing with outbreaks of pleuro-pneumonia, and this Order shall not apply to or interfere with the movement of cattle or carcasses or the burial or destruction of carcasses moved or buried or destroyed under the direction or in charge of such Inspector or person.

Forms of Licence.

12. The Forms of Licence given in the Schedules

are part of this Order, and shall be used as indicated in this Order, with such variations as circumstances require.

Granting of Licences and Permission to Bury or Destroy.

13.—(1.) The Local Authority may, if they think fit, withhold a Licence or permission to bury or destroy in any case where the movement of the cattle or carcase proposed to be moved or the burial or destruction of the carcase or portion of carcase would be in their judgment inexpedient or improper.

(2.) No Licence for movement of a head of cattle or a carcase or portion of carcase or permission to bury or destroy a carcase or portion of carcase granted under this Order shall be available if granted by the owner of the animal or carcase to be moved or buried or destroyed or by his agent, or by the owner or consignee or other person selling the animal or carcase, or exposing the animal or carcase for sale, or by the purchaser thereof or by his agent, or by the auctioneer or other person conducting the sale at which the head of cattle or carcase is exposed, or by the occupier of the cow-shed, field, yard, farm, or other place from or to which the animal or carcase is to be moved or where the carcase or portion of carcase is to be buried or destroyed.

Production of Licences: Names and Addresses.

14.—(1.) Every person in charge of cattle or carcasses being moved, where under this Order a Licence for such movement may be necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board of Agriculture or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorizing the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Every person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Copy of every Licence to be sent to the Board.

15. The Local Authority shall cause a copy of every Licence granted by them under this Order to be forthwith sent to the Director, Veterinary Department, Board of Agriculture, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

Offences.

16.—(1.) If a head of cattle is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Licence thereunder, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the head of cattle is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(2.) If a person in charge of a head of cattle being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(3.) If a carcase is removed in contravention of this Order, or is buried or destroyed in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Licence thereunder, the owner of the carcase, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or

permitting the removal or burial or destruction, and the person removing or conveying the carcase or burying or destroying the same, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been removed in contravention as aforesaid, and the person burying or destroying the carcase, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(4.) If any person with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order allows

a head of cattle to stray he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. Notwithstanding anything in Part V of The Animals Order of 1886 animals brought from Her Majesty's Possessions in North America to the port of London may be transhipped in the River Thames or in any Dock in the port of London from the vessel in which they are brought to another vessel for conveyance to the Foreign Animals Wharf, known as the Foreign Cattle Market at Deptford, subject to the following conditions :

First. That the vessel (in this Order called the landing-vessel) into which the animals are transhipped be provided by the Local Authority for the City of London, and be specially fitted and appropriated for the purpose of conveying such animals.

Second. That the Local Authority for the City of London have received the special permission of the Commissioners of Customs so to employ the landing-vessel under this Order.

2. Those animals shall be transhipped in the presence and under the supervision and control of an Officer of Customs, and an Officer of Customs shall remain in charge of the animals on board the landing-vessel until its arrival at the Foreign Animals Wharf.

3. The landing-vessel shall proceed direct to that Wharf, and the animals shall be landed there in the presence and under the supervision and control of an Officer of Customs.

4. The landing-vessel shall not be used for any other purpose during the time of its being so appropriated.

5.—(1.) The landing-vessel shall immediately after each occasion of use, and before being again used, be cleansed and disinfected as follows :

(i.) All parts of the landing-vessel with which animals or their droppings have come in contact shall be scraped and swept : then

(ii.) The same parts of the landing-vessel shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water : then

(iii.) The same parts of the landing-vessel shall have applied to them a coating of lime-wash : except that

(iv.) The application of lime-wash shall not be compulsory as regards such parts of the landing-vessel as are used for passengers or crew.

(2.) The scrapings and sweepings of the landing-vessel shall not be land-d unless and until they have been well mixed with quicklime.

6. Animals so transhipped shall continue to be deemed foreign animals.

7. If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of any of the provisions of this Order, the owner or consignee of the animals, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the landing-vessel, and in the case of the animals being transhipped in a Dock the person owning the Dock, each according to and in respect of his own acts or omissions shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

8. Terms in this Order have the same meaning as in The Animals Order of 1886.
