ORDER of the Local Government Board: Altering General Consolidated Order: Allowance of Tobacco and Snuff to certain Paupers in the Workhouse:—

Romney Marsh Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Romney
Marsh Union, in the County of Kent;—
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a General Order dated the 24th day of July, 1847, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Romney Marsh Union (amongst others), the Poor Law Commissioners made certain Rules and Regulations with regard to the government of the Workhouse of the said Union;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made as hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order that, from and after the date hereof, the following regulations shall be in force in the said Romney Marsh Union, namely,—

ARTICLE I.—Tobacco or snuff may be allowed

to such of the inmates of the Workhouse of the Union who are not able-bodied, or are employed upon work of a specially disagreeable character, as the Guardians may consider should be supplied with the same, the quantity to be allowed in each case, or in any class of cases, to be such as the Guardians may by resolution prescribe.

Guardians may by resolution prescribe.

ARTICLE II.—So much of Article 121 of the said General Order as provides that no pauper shall smoke in any room in the Workhouse without the special direction of the Medical Officer shall be rescinded, so far as regards the said Union; but the Guardians may from time to time, by resolution, determine in what rooms and at what times smoking shall be allowed, and no pauper shall smoke in the Workhouse in any other room or at any other time than is so allowed.

(New Works; Diversion and Appropriation of Additional Water; Provisions as to Compensation; Purchase of Lands and Easements compulsorily and by Agreement; Additional Capital; Incorporation and Amendment of Acts and other powers.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Exmouth and District Waterworks Company, (hereinafter called "the Company"), intend to apply to Parliament in the ensuing Session for leave to bring in a Bill for the following, or some of the following, among other purposes (that is

To authorise the Company to construct and maintain wholly in the county of Devon, the following works, or such of them, or such part or parts thereof, respectively, as the Bill may define;
