PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

W HEREAS by "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," it is enacted that "Her Majesty may, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time reduce all or any of the dues for the time being payable in respect of existing or future lighthouses, buoys, or beacons, for the time being under the management of the General Lighthouse Authorities," therein-mentioned (that is to say) the Corporation of the Trinity House of Deptford Strond, the Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses, and the port of Dublin Corporation, now called the Commissioners of Irish Lights;

"And may also, by and with the like advice, from time to time increase or vary any of such dues, so that no dues payable in respect of any lighthouse huoy or beacon existing at the time when this Act comes into operation are made to exceed the amount which has at any period previous to such time been received in respect thereof, or to which the said dues might during any part of such period as last aforesaid lawfully have been raised."

And whereas it is by the said Act further enacted that "Tables of all light dues, and a copy of the regulations for the time being in force in respect thereof, shall be posted up at all Custom Houses within the United Kingdom, and each of the said General Lighthouse Authorities shall from time to time, as occasion requires, furnish copies of such tables and Regulations to the Commissioners of Customs in London, and to the principal officers of Customs resident at all places where light dues are collected on account of such lighthouse authority; and such copies shall be posted up by the Commissioners at the Custom House in London, and by such officers at the Custom Houses of the places at which they are respectively resident":

And whereas it is by the said Act further enacted that "Upon completion of any new lighthouse buoy or beacon, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, fix such dues in respect thereof to be paid by the master or owner of every ship which passes the same or derives benefit therefrom, as Her Majesty may deem reasonable, and may from time to time alter the amount thereof :

and such dues shall be paid and collected in the same manner, by the same means, and subject to the same conditions in, by, and subject to which the light dues authorized to be levied by this Act are paid and collected ":

And whereas by "The Merchant Shipping (Miscellaneous) Act, 1887," it is enacted that "In the Merchant Shipping Act, 1854, and the Acts amending the same, the expression ' lighthouses' shall, in addition to the meaning to it by the Merchant assigned Shipping Act, 1854, include sirens and all other descriptions of fog-signals, and the expression 'new lighthouse' shall include the addition to any existing lighthouse of any improved light or any siren or any description of fog-signal" :

And whereas by Order in Council dated the twenty-fourth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy (which came into operation on the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy), Her Majesty was pleased. to approve certain revised and amended New Consolidated Tables of Light Dues (Over-sea Section) levied by the said General Lighthouse Authorities respectively in the form thereunto an-nexed. together with the several reductions, variations, abatements, regulations, and exemptions therein contained ; and amongst other regulations and exemptions it was thereby provided that all vessels trading between ports in the United Kingdom and ports in Europe (excepting ports in the Mediterranean) should, in respect of every light passed on the whole voyage out and home, be liable to only one payment of dues for each general passing light.

And whereas by Order in Council dated the sixteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, Her Majesty was pleased to approve certain New Consolidated Tables of Light Duties (Coast Section), levied as aforesaid in the form thereunto annexed, together with the several reductions, variations, abatements, regulations, and exemptions therein contained.

And whereas by various Orders in Council since made in pursuance of the said Act in respect of certain new lighthouses, buoys, and beacons within the meaning of the said Acts, certain tolls have been directed to be paid for over-sea vessels and for coasting vessels respectively, subject to a certain abatement or discount, and the regulations and exemptions mentioned in the said New Consolidated Tables of Light Duties, and to the Order in Council for the time being in force.

And whereas by Order in Council dated the ninth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, Her Majesty was pleased to direct that on and after the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, the duties for all general passing lights under the management of the said General Lighthouse Authorities should be payable by coasting vessels once only for the whole voyage out and home.

And whereas by Order in Council dated the twenty-first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, Her Majesty was pleased to direct that on and after the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, all coasting vessels all and vessels trading between ports in the United Kingdom and ports in Europe (excepting ports in the Mediterranean) should (instead of making one payment on dues for the voyage out and home) be liable in respect of every light passed, or from which benefit might be derived either on the voyage out or on the voyage home, to one moiety of the dues as provided in the said New Consolidated Tables of Light Dues for each general passing light and for each local light under the management of the said General Lighthouse Authorities, subject, however, to the abatement or discount thereinafter mentioned.

And whereas by Order in Council dated the sixth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, after reciting (among other things) that it was expedient that the said duties should be varied in the manner thereinafter stated, in so far as related to home trade ships, that is to say, to ships trading or going between the United Kingdom, the Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Sark, Alderney, and Man, and the Continent of Europe between the river Elbe and Brestinclusive, and that such ships should be treated in the matter of light dues in the same manner as coasting vessels, it was provided (among other things) that on and after the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, vessels trading or going as aforesaid between the United Kingdom, the Islands aforesaid, and the Continent of Europe between the river Elbe and Brest inclusive, should, as respects such lights as would be chargeable on coasting vessels passing them, be liable to light duties at the same rates (subject to the same abatements) as coasting vessels and to no other:

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the seventh day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, Her Majesty was pleased to direct that all steamships which should put into or touch at any British port for the purpose of filling up with coal their permanent bunkers in which cargo is never carried should be exempted by the said General Lighthouse Authorities respectively from the payment of the Light Dues receivable by either of the said General Lighthouse Authorities at such port. Such exemption being subject to the terms and conditions in the said Order in Council contained :

And whereas by Order in Council dated the third day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, Her Majesty was pleased to direct that the abatement or discount to be allowed upon the amount of tolls specified in the said New Consolidated Tables of Light Duties mentioned in the said Orders in Council of the twenty-fourth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, and the sixteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and upon the amount of tolls specified in the said other Orders in Council hereinbefore referred to should in the case of every over-sea vessel and of every coa ting vessel be sixty-five per centum and no more :

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the twenty-second day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, Her Majesty was pleased to direct that the said recited provisions of the said Orders in Council of the twenty-fourth day of October; one thousand eight hundred and seventy, the twenty-first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and the sixth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, respectively, should exclusively apply. to, and have effect in favour of vessels trading or going only between ports situated within the limits in the said Orders in Council respectively particularly mentioned, and not arriving from or bound for a place or places beyond such ports, and should apply to and have effect in favour of no other vessels :

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that it is expedient to revise and amend the said Consolidated Tables of light dues approved by the said Orders in Council of the twenty-fourth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, and the sixteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, by consolidating therewith (1) the light duties in respect of home trade ships as defined by the Orders in Council of the sixth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, and the twenty-second day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and (2) the said tolls for new lighthouses, buoys, and beacons, and the several exemptions, and regulations imposed and made respectively by the other Orders in Council above-mentioned, and by making such other alterations therein 88. appear in the New Tables hereinafter mentioned : igAnd whereas New Consolidated Tables of Light Duties levied by the said General Lighthouse Authorities respectively in the form hereunto annexed together with the several additions, reductions, variations, abatements, regulations, and exemptions contained therein have been submitted for Her Majesty's approval :

And whereas the said New Tables and the said additions, reductions, variations, abatements, regulations, and exemptions contained therein, appear to be proper and reasonable, and it is expedient that the said tables shall come into operation on the day hereinafter mentioned :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said recited Acts, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council doth hereby direct, order, and declare as follows:--

1. Her Majesty is pleased to approve, and doth hereby approve the said New Consolidated Tables of Light Duties both the Over-sea Section with Home Trade, Elbe to Brest inclusive as well as the Coasting Section and the said additions, reductions, variations, abatements, regulations, and exemptions submitted as aforesaid.

2. The said New Tables shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.
