GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Amending Regulations with respect to Remuneration of Vaccination Officer :—

Kettering Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Kettering Union, in the County of Northampton ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS We, the Local Government Board, by a General Order dated the thirty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, made rules and regulations relating to the appointment of Vaccination Officers by Guardians of the Poor of certain Unions and Parishes, including the said Kettering Union; and by Article 9 of that Order it was provided as follows :—

" The Guardians shall pay to any Vaccination

" Officer such salary or remuneration, and

" such only, as the Local Government Board

" may direct or approve, whether for ordinary

" duties or for occasional services; and such

" salary or remuneration may be increased

" or reduced as that Board may from time to

" direct or approve."

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Order as hereinafter mentioned, so far as regards the said Kettering Union:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order that, with respect to the said Kettering Union, the above-cited Article shall be amended by the addition of the following proviso :—

Provided that the Guardians, with the approval of the Local Government Board, may pay to any Vaccination Officer a reasonable compensation on account of extraordinary services, or other unforeseen circumstances connected with his duties or the necessities of the said Union.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Warrant dated the second day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and relating to Inland Postal Packets, and with the Warrants amending the same.

2. From and after the date when this Warrant comes into operation the portions of the said Warrant of the second day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, mentioned in the schedule hereto, shall be repealed.

3. Every Book Packet shall be posted either without a cover or in an unfastened envelope, or in a cover which can easily be removed for the purpose of examination without breaking any seal or tearing any paper or separating any adhering surfaces.

4. Any newspaper, or any cover of a newspaper, may bear upon it a reference to any page of or place in the newspaper to which the attention of the addressee is directed, and the provisions of the said Warrant shall be read and construed accordingly.

5. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. From and after the date when this Warrant comes into operation, all Parcels transmitted by post from the Straits Settlements to any country or place via the United Kingdom shall be subject to the rates of postage payable in respect of

Parcels so transmitted which are respectively specified in the First Schedule to the Warrant of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, dated the fourteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, or the equivalent of such rates in the currency of the Straits Settlements, and shall also be subject to the provisions contained in such Warrant, so far as such provisions are applicable to Parcels transmitted at the rates mentioned in the said schedule, and so much of the second schedule of the said Warrant, and of the Warrant of the said Commissioners, dated the twenty-second day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, as respectively relates to Parcels transmitted by post from the Straits Settlements to any country or place via the United Kingdom, shall be repealed.

2. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.
