CEREMONIAL observed on Wednesday, 20th January, 1892, when the Remains of HIS LATE ROYAL HIGHNESS ALBERT VICTOR CHRISTIAN EDWARD, DUKE OF CLARENCE AND AVONDALE AND EARL OF ATHLONE, K.G., K.P., Eldest Son of THEIR ROYAL HIGHNESSES THE PRINCE AND PRINCESS OF WALES, and Grandson of HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN, were removed from Sandringham, for Burial in St. George's Chapel, Windsor Castle.

At a quarter to three o'clock, those who had the honour to receive the Queen's commands to be present at the Ceremony, but who did not take part in the Procession, were admitted at the South Entrance to St. George's Chapel, and shown to seats in the Choir by Her Majesty's Gentlemen Ushers.

At three o'clock, those who had been appointed to take part in the Procession assembled at the West Entrance of St. George's Chapel, and awaited the arrival of the Remains of His late Royal Highness.

At ten o'clock, the Royal Remains were removed from Sandringham Church, after a short Special Service, conducted by the Reverend F. Hervey and Honourable and Reverend L. Tyrwhitt, on a gun carriage of the Royal Artillery, under the command of Lieutenant H. White-Thompson, to Wolferton Station, where a Guard of Honour of the 3rd Battalion Norfolk Regiment, under the command of Captain Lloyd Payne, was mounted.

The Coffin was preceded by the Tenantry of the Sandringham Estate and followed by Their Royal Highnesses The Prince and Princess of Wales, The Prince George of Wales, The Princess Louise, Duchess of Fife, and The Duke of Fife, The Princesses Victoria and Maud of Wales, The Duchess of Teck, and Her Serene Highness The Princess Victoria Mary of Teck, and by the Household, the Heads of Departments, Keepers, Servants, and Labourers of the Sandringham Estate.

At half-past eleven a.m. o'clock, a Special Train left Wolferton Station to convey the Remains of His late Royal Highness to the Windsor Station of the South-Western Railway, where it arrived at three o'clock.

The Train also conveyed Their Royal Highnesses The Prince of Wales, K.G., and The Prince George of Wales, K.G., and The Duke of Fife, K.T., with the following Gentlemen in Attendance upon them, and the Household of His late Royal Highness:—General Sir Dighton Probyn, K.C.B., K.C.S.I., V.C., Sir Francis Knollys, K.C.M.G., C.B., Rear-Admiral H. F. Stephenson, C.B., The Reverend F. A. J. Hervey, The Reverend J. Mitchell, Dr. Manby, Major-General Sir Francis de Winton, K.C.M.G., and Captain G. Holford.

They were received at the Station by The Earl of Lathom, Lord Chamberlain, The Duke of Portland, Master of the Horse, Major-General Sir J. McNeill, K.C.B., V.C., Equerry to Her

Majesty, and The Honourable Sir S. Ponsonby Fane, K.C.B., Comptroller of The Lord Chamberlain's Department.

Colonel Hon. H. Byng, Equerry in Waiting, was at the Station, and placed upon the coffin a wreath sent by The Queen.

Guards of Honour of the 3rd Battalion Grenadier Guards, under the command of Captain R. Scott-Kerr, and of the Royal Navy, under the command of Commander Neville, were mounted at the Station.

The Coffin having been removed from the Train by a party from The Duke of Clarence's own Troop of the 10th Royal Hussars, "The Prince of Wales's Own," a procession was formed in the following order:—

Upon the Coffin, which was covered with a Union Jack, was placed the Busby and Sword of His late Royal Highness.

The Procession passed by Thames-street, Windsor, through Henry the Eighth Gate, and the Horse Shoe Cloister, to the West Entrance of St. George's Chapel.

The Route of the Procession was kept by the 2nd Life Guards, under the command of Major J. Smith Cunninghame, by the 3rd Battalion Grenadier Guards, under the command of Colonel L. J. Oliphant, 2nd Battalion Coldstream Guards, under the command of Colonel Viscount Falmouth, C.B., and 1st Battalion Scots Guards, under the command of Colonel R. B. Campbell, and by the 1st Volunteer Battalion Royal Berkshire Regiment, under the command of Captain W. A. Ellison.

Minute Guns were fired by a Battery of the C Battery, Royal Horse Artillery, under the command of Major H. V. Hunt, stationed in the Long Walk, Windsor Park, as the Procession passed through the town.

Guards of Honour of the 3rd Battalion Grenadier Guards, under the command of Captain Honourable W. D. Murray, and of the Royal Navy, under the command of Commander Gresley, and of the Royal Marines, under the command of Captain E. A. Wylde, were mounted in the Lower Castle Yard.

On arriving at the West Entrance to St. George's Chapel, the Remains were received by The Lord Chamberlain and The Lord Steward, and were met by The Bishop of Rochester, Clerk of the Closet to Her Majesty, The Dean, Canons, and Minor Canons of Windsor, and The Choir of St. George's, and The Reverend Frederick Hervey, Domestic Chaplain to His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales.

The Opening Sentences of the Burial Service were sung by The Choir to Croft's music, and subsequently The Prelude in E Minor, by Chopin, was played on the Organ as the Procession moved up the Nave in the following order:

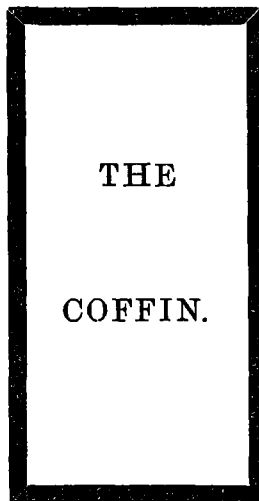

and the Attendants upon Their Royal Highnesses

On arrival in the Choir, the Coronet and Insignia of His late Royal Highness were placed on the Coffin.

His Royal Highness The Chief Mourner stood at the head of the Coffin, with his Supporters on either side.

The other Royal Personages and Representatives of absent Royal Personages stood near, and their Attendants behind them.

The Supporters of the Pall stood on either side, and The Lord Chamberlain and The Lord Steward at the foot of the Coffin.

As soon as The Choir reached their places, the 90th Psalm was chanted, music by Felton. The Dean of Windsor read the Lesson.

The three sentences, "Man that is born of a woman," &c., were sung by The Choir to the music of Croft and Purcell.

The Bishop of Rochester then read the sentence, "Forasmuch as it has pleased," &c. During which earth and flowers were cast upon the Coffin by The Reverend Canon Dalton.

The Choir then sang "I heard a voice from Heaven," &c., by Croft.

The Bishop of Rochester read the concluding Prayers.

Garter King of Arms then Proclaimed the Style of His late Royal Highness as follows:—

"Thus it hath pleased Almighty God to take out of this transitory life unto His Divine Mercy the late Most High, Mighty, and Illustrious Prince Albert Victor Christian Edward, Duke of Clarence and Avondale, Earl of Athlone, Duke of Saxony, Prince of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, Knight of the Most Illustrious Order of Saint Patrick, Eldest Son of Their Royal Highnesses The Prince and Princess of Wales, and Grandson of Her Most Excellent Majesty Victoria, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India, and of His Royal Highness The Prince Consort.

"May God bless and preserve Her Majesty with long life, health, and honour."

After which was sung Sir Arthur Sullivan's Anthem from the Martyr of Antioch, "Brother, thou hast gone before us."

In conclusion, The Bishop of Rochester pronounced the Blessing, and Chopin's Funeral March was played as His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, followed by The Royal Family, Royal Personages, and other Representatives of Royal Personages, with their Attendants, retired from the Chapel to the Deanery.

Others who had taken part in the Procession and those who had been invited to the Ceremony left the Chapel by the South Entrance.

Her Royal Highness The Princess of Wales, accompanied by Their Royal Highnesses The Princess Louise, Duchess of Fife, The Princesses Victoria and Maud of Wales, The Princess Mary Adelaide, Duchess of Teck, and Her Serene Highness The Princess Victoria Mary of Teck, were present in the Queen's Pew during the Ceremony, with Miss Knollys and Sir Francis Knollys, K.C.M.G., C.B., in attendance, and afterwards went to Windsor Castle.

Their Royal Highnesses The Princess Helena, Princess Christian of Schleswig-Holstein, The Princess Beatrice, Princess Henry of Battenberg, The Duchess of Connaught and Strathearne, and The Duchess of Albany, attended by the Baroness von und zu Egloffstein, Miss Minnie Cochrane, Honourable Mrs. N. Dalrymple, and Miss Beatrice Heron-Maxwell were also present at the Ceremony in one of the Royal Pews.

At half-past four o'clock, the Remains of His late Royal Highness were privately removed to the Memorial Chapel, borne by the men of the 10th Royal Hussars, and followed by His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, K.G., and the Royal and distinguished personages above-mentioned, while the Dead March in "Saul," by Handel, was played on the Organ, at which Dr. Parratt presided.

His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, K.G., with The Prince George of Wales, K.G., and The Duke of Fife, K.T., then proceeded to Windsor Castle, The Royal Family and Royal Personages returning to London.

Levée Dress was worn.

A Special Train conveying those invited to the Ceremony left Paddington Station at two o'clock, and returned from Windsor at half-past four and five o'clock.

Carriages were in waiting to convey them to St. George's Chapel, and to the South-Western Station to join the Funeral Procession there, and to return afterwards.
