Minute Guns were fired by a Battery of the C Battery, Royal Horse Artillery, under the command of Major H. V. Hunt, stationed in the Long Walk, Windsor Park, as the Procession passed

through the town.

Guards of Honour of the 3rd Battalion Grenadier Guards, under the command of Captain Honourable W. D. Murray, and of the Royal Navy, under the command of Commander Gresley, and of the Royal Marines, under the command of Captain E. A. Wylde, were mounted in the Lower Castle Yard.

On arriving at the West Entrance to St. George's Chapel, the Remains were received by The Lord Chamberlain and The Lord Steward, and were met by The Bishop of Rochester, Clerk of the Cleset to Her Majesty, The Dean, Canons, and Minor Canons of Windsor, and The Choir of St. George's, and The Reverend Frederick Hervey, Domestic Chaplain to His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales.

The Opening Sentences of the Burial Service were sung by The Choir to Croft's music, and subsequently The Prelude in E Minor, by Chopin, was played on the Organ as the Procession moved up the Nave in the following order:
