TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England, on Monday, the 8th instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, and 51 and 52 Vic., cap. 32, to the amount of £2,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 13th February, 1892, and will be payable at three months, or six months, or twelve months, after date (at the option of the persons tendering), viz.:—on the 13th May, 1892, or 13th August, 1892, or 13th February, 1893, respectively.

3. The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for; and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Tuesday, the 9th instant, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than one o'clock, on Saturday, the 13th instant.

6. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. All animals being at any time within the Metropolitan Cattle Market, at Islington, in the county of London, shall not be moved out of that Market, but shall be slaughtered within the Market.

2.—(1.) If any animal required by this Order to be slaughtered is not so slaughtered, the purchaser or owner thereof or his agent (as the case may be) shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878.

(2.) If an animal is moved in contravention of the provisions of this Order, the owner thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, or conveying the animal, and the company or person removing or conveying it, shall each, according to and in respect of his or their own acts, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878.

3.—(1.) Words in this Order have the same meaning as in the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878.

(2.) The Metropolitan Cattle Market includes the lairs and slaughter-houses adjacent thereto being the property of the Corporation of the City of London.
