receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have bee moved in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878.

(ii.) If an animal is not slaughtered as required by this Order, the person to whom the Movement Licence is granted, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person failing to cause the same to be so slaughtered, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878.

4. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority for

the county of Kent.

5. Terms in this Order have the same meaning as in the Animals Order of 1886.

- 6. This Order may be cited as THE ISLE OF SHEPPEY (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF
