THE Marquis of Salisbury, K.G., Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received from the Chinese Minister at this Court, a Note, of which the following is a copy, as to the procedure to be observed in cases where the Provincial Authorities

in China may desire to enter into contracts with foreign financial houses for the purpose of obtaining loans:—

Chinese Legation,

MY LORD MARQUIS, *February 23, 1892.*

I HAVE the honour to forward to your Lordship the enclosed copy of a Circular Note which the Tsungli-Yamên have addressed to the Representatives of China in Foreign Countries, and which they have directed them to communicate to the Courts to which they are severally accredited.

As your Lordship will perceive on perusing the Note, it relates to the procedure to be observed in cases where the Governors-General, Governors, and others may desire to enter into contracts with foreign financial houses with the object of obtaining loans.

Henceforth, no contract for a provincial loan is to be concluded until the local official for whose administration the money is required shall have submitted it to the Central Government, and a notification that the project has received the Imperial sanction shall have been made by the Tsungli-Yamên to the Representative at Peking of the country more immediately concerned in the transaction. Loans contracted by the local authorities in contravention of this procedure will consequently be held to be illegal, and the Chinese Government absolved from all responsibility in connexion with them.

This measure, which has been approved by His Majesty the Emperor, by an Imperial Decree, issued at the instance of the Tsungli-Yamên, dated the 25th of November, 1891, has for its object the safeguarding of Chinese credit and the protection of foreign financiers from the loss and disappointment to which they might be subjected, in consequence of the powers of the Provincial Authorities to pledge the Imperial credit not being clearly defined.

I have the honour to request that your Lordship will be so good as to take such steps as may appear to you best fitted to bring the Circular Note under the observation of English financiers and others whom it may concern.

Translation of Enclosure

CIRCULAR NOTE addressed by the Tsungli-Yamên to the Representatives of China in foreign countries.

GENTLEMEN,

YOU are aware that loans contracted with foreigners by our Provincial Authorities, Viceroy, and Governors, to meet administrative needs have always been submitted for the preliminary authorization of the Central Government at Peking. This authorization must be requested by a special report presented to the Throne and must be confirmed by an official notification of the Tsungli-Yamên addressed to the Representatives of the powers concerned.

But certain Viceroys and Governors of Provinces having recently taken upon themselves to contract loans, without presenting a report to the Throne, to request its authorization of the same, the Tsungli-Yamên and the Ministry of Finance, sensible of this abuse which is much to be regretted, thought it right to submit the following measure for the approval of the Emperor:—

"For the future, whenever our Provincial

Authorities, Viceroy, Governors, and others shall approach foreign financiers with a view to contracting a loan, these latter should immediately communicate this fact to the Representative of their country accredited at Peking. The Representative should then ask the Tsungli-Yamen officially whether the loan is authorized by the Central Government, upon a report duly presented to that effect. If such should be the case, the loan may be concluded; in the contrary event, it shall not be valid.

"The Imperial Government will decline all responsibility for loans contracted without its authorization, even though a formal contract be produced bearing the seal and signature of the Provincial Authorities. It is unnecessary to add that the Chinese Government will, in such a case, take no action in favour of the creditors."

The preceding stipulations have been approved by His Majesty the Emperor, in a Decree dated the 25th of November, 1891.

You are instructed to bring this Circular Note, in writing, to the knowledge of the Governments to which you are accredited; it has also been communicated by us to the Representatives of the Powers at Peking.

You will not omit to add that this measure on the part of the Chinese Government has been dictated by the desire to protect the credit of China, as well as the interests of foreign financiers, and that we are, therefore, anxious that this communication should be made public by the Governments to which you are accredited, in order that it may be generally known how this matter stands.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1878.

41 Vict., c. 16, ss. 26, 95, 96.

ORDER of Secretary of State prescribing, with consent of Education Department, Standard of Proficiency and Standard of previous due Attendance at School (England and Wales).

WHEREAS by the Factory and Workshop Act, 1878, it is enacted as follows:—

26. When a child of the age of thirteen years has obtained from a person authorized by the Education Department a certificate of having attained such standard of proficiency in reading, writing, and arithmetic, or such standard of previous due attendance at a certified efficient school, as hereinafter-mentioned, that child shall be deemed to be a young person for the purposes of this Act.

The standards of proficiency and due attendance for the purposes of this section shall be such as may be from time to time fixed for the purposes of this Act by a Secretary of State, with the consent of the Education Department, and the standards so fixed shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall not have effect until the expiration of at least six months after such publication.

Attendance at a certified day industrial school shall be deemed for the purposes of this section to be attendance at a certified efficient school.

95. The expression "certified efficient school" in this Act means a public elementary school within the meaning of the Elementary Education Acts, 1870 and 1873, and any workhouse school in England certified to be efficient by the Local Government Board, and also any elementary school which is not conducted for private profit and is open at all reasonable times to the inspection of Her Majesty's Inspectors of Schools, and requires the like attendance from its scholars as is required in a public elementary school, and keeps such registers of those attendances as may be for the time being required by the Education Department, and is certified by the Education Department to be an efficient school.

96. The expression "Education Department," means the Lords of the Committee of the Privy Council on Education.

Now, I, the Right Honourable Henry Matthews, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, with the consent of the Lords of the Committee of the Privy Council on Education, hereby,

for the purpose of the above-mentioned enactment, and so far only as the same relates to England and Wales, order as follows:—

1. The standard of proficiency for the purpose of a certificate of proficiency shall, for the factories and workshops of each school district, be the Fourth Standard. But, in districts where the Bye-laws of the School Authority have fixed, or shall hereafter fix, a standard higher than the Fourth Standard as the standard of education for the total exemption of a child between ten and thirteen years of age from the obligation to attend school under the Elementary Education Acts, the standard of proficiency for the purposes of this Order shall be such higher standard.

2. Certificates of proficiency may be granted by the persons and in the manner prescribed by Articles 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8 of the Revised Regulations of the Education Department, dated the 12th April, 1883.

3. The standard of previous due attendance at a certified efficient school for the purpose of a certificate of previous due attendance shall be as follows:—

The following number of attendances each year after a child has attained five years of age.	In not more than two schools during each year for the following number of years, whether consecutive or not.
250	5

4. Certificates of previous due attendance at school may be granted by the persons and in the manner prescribed by Articles 10, 11, and 12 of the aforesaid Revised Regulations of the Education Department.

5. The Order of the Secretary of State, dated 15th February, 1879, is hereby revoked.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the expiration of six months after the publication thereof in the London Gazette.

ISLE OF WIGHT (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) ORDER OF 1892.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Notwithstanding anything in the Order of the Board dated the twenty-sixth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, prohibiting the movement of cattle, sheep, goats, or swine out of a District comprising the county of Southampton and the boroughs of Bournemouth, Portsmouth, Southampton, and Winchester, any cattle, sheep, goats, or swine landed from the Isle of Wight at any place in the county of Southampton or in the borough of Portsmouth or in the borough of Southampton may be moved out of the said District on the following conditions:

- (a.) When landed the animals shall be moved forthwith by the most direct available route to the nearest available railway station on the line of railway by which the animals are to be moved to their place of destination; and
- (b.) The animals shall be kept at such railway station until trucked, and shall be then moved by rail to the place of destination without untrucking.

2. If any head of cattle, or a sheep, or a goat, or a pig, landed from the Isle of Wight at any place in the county of Southampton or in the borough of Portsmouth or in the borough of Southampton, is moved out of the said District in contravention of the foregoing conditions, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878.

3. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to authorize the movement of any cattle, sheep, goats, or swine into the District of any Local Authority in contravention of any Regulation made by that Local Authority prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals into their District from the District of the Local Authority of the Isle of Wight.

4. This Order may be cited as the ISLE OF WIGHT (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) ORDER OF 1892.

Topographical Plan-drawing (i.e., the principles of topographical plan-drawing by scale and compass bearing; copying such plans by squares on the same, or reduced or enlarged scales; adapting them to altered relative positions of points. Also fair practical proficiency in topographical and perspective drawing with pencil, pen, and brush).
7. Translation from French, Spanish, or some other modern language.

III. Candidates must pass to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners in all the first six subjects. They will also be required to show what preliminary training or technical education they have undergone to qualify them for a situation of this nature, and they must satisfy the Commissioners that they possess the special qualifications necessary for the office. These include particularly aptness in hydrographical chart drawing, and on this point the Commissioners will ask for a report from the Hydrographer of the Admiralty.
