THE following further Addresses and Resolutions of Condolence, on the occasion of the death of His Royal Highness Prince Albert Victor, Duke of Clarence and Avondale, K.G., &c., have been transmitted to the Right Honourable Henry Matthews, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, for presentation to The Queen, and have accordingly been presented by him to Her Majesty, who has been pleased to receive the same very graciously:—
