THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, a copy of a Despatch, dated the 10th February, 1892, from Her Majesty's Representative at Jamaica, stating that owing to the prevalence of yellow fever in Brazil, the ports of that Republic have been declared by the Governor and Privy Council of Jamaica to be infected places within the meaning of the Quarantine Law 37 of 1869.
