## PRESENT.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by Part III of "The Sea Fisheries Act, 1868," it is provided-

1. That the Board of Trade may make an Order for the establishment or improvement and for the maintenance and regulation of an Oyster and Mussel Fishery in manner therein prescribed;

2. That an Order of the Board of Trade under that part of that Act shall not of itself have any operation, but the same shall have full operation when and as confirmed by Act of Parliament;

3. That the Board of Trade may from time to time make an Order for amending an Order that has been confirmed by Act of Parliament, and that all the provisions of that part of that Act relative to an original Order shall apply also to an Amending Order mutatis mutandis.

And whereas by section seven of "The Fisheries (Oyster, Crab, and Lobster) Act, 1877," it is provided that, where an Order of the Board of Trade under Part III of "The Sea Fisheries Act, 1868," amends a previous Order without extending the area to which that Order applies, and a petition against the Order by any Local Authority or persons affected thereby is not within one month after the first publication of the Order received by the Board of Trade, or, if received, is withdrawn, the Board of Trade may, if they think fit, submit the scheme for confirmation to Her Majesty in Council, and every such Order if confirmed by HerMajesty in Council shall have full operation as if it had been confirmed by Parliament as provided by "The Sea Fisheries Act,

And whereas the Board of Trade did make an Order intituled the Swansea Fishery Order, 1871, which Order was duly confirmed by "The Oyster and Mussel Fisheries Orders Confirmation Act, 1871 (No. 2)"

And whereas the Board of Trade have made an Order dated the eleventh day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, intituled the Swansea Fishery Order, 1892, and the said Order amends the Swansea Fishery Order, 1871, without extending the area to which that Order applies, and the Order has been duly published, but no petition against the same has been received by the Board of Trade:

Now therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased, in the execution of and pursuant to the powers vested in Her in that behalf, hereby to confirm the Swansea Fishery Order, 1892, aforesaid as set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed.

## SCHEDULE.

Swansea Fishery Order, 1892.
The Swansea Fishery Order, 1871, confirmed by "The Oyster and Mussel Fisheries Orders

Confirmation Act, 1871 (No. 2)," is hereby amended, so that it shall be read as follows:— ORDER for the Regulation of an Oyster and Mussel Fishery in certain parts of the Sea

adjoining the county of Glamorgan.

1. The following are the limits of the fishery comprised in this Order (hereinafter called "the fishery"), namely :-

All those parts of the bed of the sea lying below the lines of extreme low-water mark of spring tides for the time being, and comprised within the following imaginary lines, namely :-

(1.) A straight line drawn true south, from the east end of Worms Head Island, to a point

true east of Helwick Light Vessel:

- (2.) A line drawn straight from the lastmentioned point to a point three miles true south from Port Eynon Head, thence continued straight to the navigation buoy south of White Oyster Ledge, and thence straight to Sker Point.
- 2. The Local Fisheries Committee for the Glamorgan Sea Fisheries District or for any Sea Fisheries District that may hereafter be created under "The Sea Fisheries Regulation Act, 1888, and any Act amending the same, and including the whole or the greater part of the fishery (hereinafter called "the Grantees"), shall be the Grantees of this Order, and shall, for the purposes thereof, be a body corporate under the name of "the Grantees of the Swansea Fishery Order, 1892."
- 3. Save as hereinafter provided, no person shall dredge or fish for, or take, oysters or mussels within the fishery during the months of May, June, July, and August in any year, nor within that portion of the fishery which lies east of a straight line drawn from the said navigation buoy to the lighthouse at Mumbles Head (hereinafter called "the Swansea Bay portion of the fishery' during the months of March, April, May, June, July, August, September, October, and November in any year.

4. Save as hereinafter provided, no person shall remove from the fishery, or from one part of the fishery to another part thereof (a), any cultch, or (b) any oyster which will pass through a circular ring of three inches in diameter, measured on the inside thereof, or (c) any mussel less than two

inches in length.

5. Subject to such rules as shall be prescribed by the Board of Trade, the Grantees may from time to time make bye-laws for all or any of the following purposes:

I. For closing for a period prescribed in the bye-law any portion or portions of the fishery so far as relates to the fishing for oysters or mussels, provided that-

(a.) No portion shall be so closed for a longer continuous period than four years.

(b.) No more than one-third of the whole area of the fishery shall be closed at any one and the same time.

II. For varying the minimum size of oysters or mussels prescribed by Article 4 of this

III. For permitting persons holding licences under this Order to dredge, fish for, or take oysters or mussels in the Swansea Bay portion of the fishery, or in any specified part thereof, during the months of March, April, September, October, and November in any year, or during such period within such months as may be prescribed in the Bye-law.

 For determining what marks shall be attached or affixed to or painted on skiffs, smacks, or boats licensed to dredge in the
