The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the ninth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas in consequence of altered conditions of the arrangements for the defence of the sea coast of the United Kingdom the services of the officers and men of the Royal Naval Artillery Volunteers cannot be any longer utilized with advantage to the State in their present capacities in connection with the Royal Navy, we are of opinion that it is desirable in accordance with the powers vested in us by the Naval Artillery Volunteer Act, 1873, section 12, to disband the respective Corps of the said Volunteers from the first proximo; but having regard to the services rendered by officers of the said Volunteers in forming and maintaining the respective Corps and to the personal and pecuniary sacrifices made by them in so doing, we beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to allow the present officers and honorary officers of the Royal Naval Artillery Volunteers to retain their Commissions and to continue to wear the uniform of the rank they now hold. Such officers to be described in Navy List as of the late Royal Naval Artillery Volunteers.”

Her Majesty having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

THE following scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the Local Board of Health for the Local Government District of Barton, Eccles, Winton, and Monton, in the county of Lancaster, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in pursuance of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882 :—

" WHEREAS by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882; it is enacted that where a petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to the Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporation Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter, the said Committee of Council may settle a scheme for the purposes in the said Act named and containing such provisions as are in the said Act particularised :

" And whereas under and by virtue of an Order in Council of the third day of July, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, made in pursuance of the Public Health Act, 1848, a Local Board of Health (hereinafter called 'the Local Board') was created of and for the Local Government District of Barton, Eccles, Winton, and Monton, in the county of Lancaster, and has become invested with various powers and duties :

" And whereas certain inhabitant householders of the said Local Government District of Barton, Eccles, Winton, and Monton, have petitioned Her Majesty the Queen, praying for the grant of a Charter of Incorporation :

" And whereas the said petition for a Charter has been referred to the Committee of Council, and it is proposed to create the said Local Government District within the limits set forth in the Charter in that behalf a Municipal Borough, and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof, and by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporation Acts to the Municipal Borough, to be created by the Charter :

" And whereas the Local Board for the said Local Government District (in this scheme referred to as 'the Local Board') are an Urban Sanitary Authority under the Public Health Act, 1875, and the said district is an Urban Sanitary District :

" And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the eleventh day of July, one thousand

eight hundred and seventy-seven, the said Local Board was constituted a Burial Board for the said district :

"And whereas by a Provisional Order under the seal of the Board of Trade, bearing date the 23rd day of July, 1877, and confirmed by the Tramways Act, 40 and 41 Vic., cap. 124, 1877, powers were given to the said Local Board to construct tramways within the said district, and whereas the said Board duly constructed tramways as authorised within their district :

"And whereas by a Provisional Order under the seal of the Board of Trade, confirmed by the Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation (No. 4) Act, 1883, powers were given to the said Board to manufacture and supply electricity to the residents within their district for lighting and other purposes :

"And whereas notice of the petition for the said Charter of Incorporation was given to the Lancashire County Council, and was also sent to the Local Government Board, and the Local Government Act, 1888, was in all respects duly complied with :

"And whereas this scheme was, before being settled by the Committee of Council, referred for consideration to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and to the Local Government Board :

"And whereas the Local Board is a Local Authority with the meaning of Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882 :

"And whereas it is expedient, right, and just, that a scheme should be settled pursuant to Part XI of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, containing the provisions hereinafter contained :

"Now, therefore, the said Committee of Council have settled a scheme containing the Provisions hereinafter set forth, and do hereby direct, order, and declare, as follows :—

"1. This scheme may be cited for all purposes as the 'Borough of Eccles Scheme, 1892.'

"2. This scheme shall come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough created by the Charter above referred to, or at the date of the confirmation of this scheme by Parliament or Order in Council, whichever shall be later, and this date is hereinafter referred to as 'the commencement of this scheme.' So far as may be necessary this scheme shall operate retrospectively.

"3. The Municipal Borough created by the said Charter shall be placed immediately on and after the commencement of this scheme, within the jurisdiction of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Eccles acting by the Council of the said Municipal Borough as the Sanitary Authority of the said Borough.

"4. The Local Board of Barton, Eccles, Winton, and Monton, and their powers, duties, rights, obligations, liabilities, and privileges, shall continue, and be deemed to have continued to exist until the commencement of this scheme, unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the grant of the said Charter, or the creation of the said Borough ; and the said Board shall, from the date of the grant of the Charter, until such commencement be deemed to have continued and continue to enjoy, be subject to, and exercise, the said powers, duties, rights, obligations, liabilities, and privileges, as if no such Charter had been granted, and all their acts from the date of the grant of the said Charter, until the commencement of this scheme, shall be and shall be deemed to have been as valid and effectual as if no such Charter had been granted.

"5. Immediately from and after the commence-

ment of this scheme the Barton, Eccles, Winton, and Monton Local Board shall be, and the same is hereby, abolished, and shall thenceforth be dissolved and cease to exist.

"6. All the jurisdiction, powers, duties, and property vested in or possessed by the Barton, Eccles, Winton, and Monton Local Board, or by any person or body in trust for them, or any of their members as such, or applicable for the benefit, or under the direction of the said Local Board, or any of their members as such (and not otherwise dealt with or transferred by or under any part of this scheme), shall vest in the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Eccles, and shall be held and applied for the municipal and public purposes of the said Borough.

"7. All liabilities which immediately before the commencement of this scheme attached to, and were enforceable against the said Local Board, or the property thereof, shall attach to, and be enforceable against the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Eccles.

"8. Any investigation, legal proceedings, or remedy in respect of any debt, liability, penalty, or forfeiture due to or incurred by or on behalf of the said Local Board before the commencement of this scheme may be continued, prosecuted, or enforced by or against the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Eccles.

"9. The term property in this scheme means and includes all property, real and personal, and all things in action, and all rights of common and commonable rights, and rights to toll, and all franchises, privileges, and rights which have any pecuniary value, and all charters, records, deeds, books, and documents, and all rights, and all claims to relief, and all rights to avoid contracts or otherwise, and includes any estate or interest, legal or equitable, in or in respect of any property so defined.

"10. The Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Eccles shall, in respect of the laws relating to burial, tramways, and the supply of electricity, and in respect of all other powers and duties exercised and performed by the Local Board, be substituted for the said Local Board, and all the rights, property, powers, authorities, privileges, duties, and liabilities vested in, devolving upon, or exercisable by the said Local Board in pursuance of the Burial Acts, the Tramway Acts, and the Electric Lighting Acts, and under any Provisional Orders confirmed by Parliament relating thereto as the same now exist, shall be transferred to, vest in, be exercisable by, attach to, and be enforceable by or against the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses.

"Provided that—

"(1) All persons being inhabitants of such parts of the district of the Local Board as are not included in the Borough of Eccles, shall, unless and until other provision be made for such parts of the said district, continue to possess all such rights and privileges with regard to burial as they would have possessed had the said Borough not been created.

"(2) All bye-laws, regulations, and lists of fees and tolls made by the Local Board under the provisions of the Acts relating to burial, tramways, and the supply of electricity, shall continue in force until the same shall be repealed or varied by the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses acting as the local authority under the said Acts.

"11 (A). The district fund and the general district rate of the Borough of Eccles, shall, save in the case of the provisions of the Acts relating to tramways, take the place of and be substituted for

the general district fund and general district rate respectively of the Local Board, and all sums of money respectively payable to, from, or out of, and all liabilities charged upon or attaching to the said general district fund or general district rate shall be paid to, from, or out of, and shall be charged upon the said district fund and general district rate leviable in the said Borough respectively.

“(B). In the case of the provisions of the Acts relating to tramways the borough fund and borough rate shall take the place of and be substituted for the general district fund and general district rate respectively of the Local Board, and all sums of money respectively payable to, from, or out of, and all liabilities charged upon or attaching to the said general district rate shall be paid to, from, or out of, and shall be charged upon the borough fund and borough rate.

“12. All rights, interests, powers, duties, property, obligations, and liabilities whatsoever of the said Local Board as the Urban Sanitary Authority of their district, and under or by virtue of the Public Health Act, 1875, and any Act or Acts amending or extending the same, and the Sanitary Acts (as by the Public Health Act, 1875, defined), and of any local or general Act for purposes the same as or similar to those of the Acts aforesaid, or any of them, shall be transferred to, vest in, attach to, and be exercisable by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Eccles acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority of the said Borough; and all bye-laws and Orders made under the said Acts, or any of them, shall continue in force and to be enforced in the said Borough to the same extent to which they are now enforced and enforceable within the district of the said Local Board, substituting only the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Eccles and their officers for the said Local Board and their officers, until the said bye-laws shall be repealed or varied by the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses.

“13. From and after the commencement of this scheme those parts of the district of the Local Board which are not included within the Borough shall, for all purposes of the Public Health Act, 1875, and any Act amending the same, or incorporated therewith, or referred to therein, be within and be parts of the district of the Rural Sanitary Authority of the Barton-upon-Irwell Union, and be within the jurisdiction of the said Sanitary Authority, and the powers, obligations and duties of the Local Board in respect thereto shall (as to such of them as are vested in, exercisable by, or attached to a Rural Sanitary Authority, under the said Acts or any of them) be transferred to, and be exercised by and attached to the said Rural Sanitary Authority.

“14. That part of the district of the Local Board which is situate to the south of the centre of the Manchester Ship Canal, and is not included within the Borough, shall, for highway purposes, be deemed to form part of the hamlet of South Barton, and as such shall, for highway purposes, be within the jurisdiction of the Flixton, Urnston, and South Barton Highway Board. That part of the district of the Local Board which is situate to the north of the centre of the said Ship Canal and to the west of the Worsley Brook, and is not included within the Borough, shall, for highway purposes, be deemed to form part of the hamlet of Foxhill, Boysnope, and Salt-ye, and shall be within the jurisdiction of the surveyor of the said hamlet.

“That part of the district of the Local Board which adjoins the Sindsley Brook, and is

not included within the Borough, shall, for highway purposes, form part of the hamlet of Lower Worsley, and shall be within the jurisdiction of the surveyor of the said hamlet

“15. If at any time the district fund and general district rate of the Borough are insufficient to provide the sums required for interest or repayment of principal on or in respect of any money borrowed wholly or partly on the security of the district fund or general district rate of the Local Board, then (but not otherwise) notwithstanding anything in this scheme the rights of the creditors against the part of the Local Government District excluded from the Borough shall be deemed to be subsisting, and the Rural Sanitary Authority of the Barton-upon-Irwell Union shall (if required by one-third in value of the creditors, or by an Order of any competent Court), levy or cause to be levied in or upon the part of the Local Government District excluded from the Borough such portion of the said moneys then due and unpaid as bears the same proportion to the whole of the said moneys then due and unpaid as the then rateable value for sanitary purposes of the property in such excluded part of the Local Government District bears to the sum of such rateable value together with the rateable value for sanitary purposes of the property within the Borough, and the said Rural Authority shall levy and cause to be levied from or in the said excluded part the said portion of the said moneys by the same means and in the same manner as nearly as may be as contributions for special expenses are levied under the Public Health Act, 1875.

“Any sum or sums paid by the said Rural Authority under this clause shall and may be recovered by the said Rural Authority from the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Eccles acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority of the said Borough as a debt due from the latter to the former, and any sum or sums so repaid by the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses shall be treated as contributions for special expenses or shall be made applicable in such other way as the Rural Sanitary Authority, with the consent of the Local Government Board, may determine.

“16. Nothing in this scheme shall in any way or respect abridge, affect, or diminish the operation of Section three hundred and ten of the Public Health Act, 1875.

“17. The accounts of the said Local Board and of their officers shall be (as soon as conveniently may be) audited by the district auditor in like manner and subject to the like powers, duties, provisions, and right of appeal as if the Charter had not been granted; the provisions of Sections two hundred and forty-seven and two hundred and fifty of the Public Health Act, 1875, as amended by the District Auditors Act, 1879, and any regulations duly issued by the Local Government Board with respect to the audit of accounts of Local Boards and of their officers, shall apply to such audit; and the provisions of this scheme, with respect to the Local Board, shall be construed so as to admit of such exemptions as may be necessary to enable such audit to be duly made; but such exemptions shall be strictly limited in time, character, and operation to the purposes of such audit; any sums certified to be due from any person by the district auditor shall be paid by such person to the Treasurer of the said Borough.

“18. In case any of the officers of the Local Board who shall have been employed by them for a period of at least five years shall not be employed

by the Council of the said Borough, nor offered by the said Council a position in their employ of a similar character and of an equal value to that formerly held by him, he shall be entitled to be paid, by way of compensation for the loss of his position, out of the funds of or under the control of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Eccles acting by the Council as the Urban Sanitary Authority for the said Municipal Borough, such annual allowance or such gratuity as on a full consideration of the circumstances of the case may seem to the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury to be a reasonable and just compensation for the loss of his position; and the said Commissioners in awarding the said compensation shall be guided by the principles which would be applicable in the case of an award of compensation under the provisions of the Superannuation Act, 1859, to a person retiring or removed from the public service in consequence of the abolition of his office, provided that no special minute within the meaning of the said Act stating any special grounds for granting such allowance shall be necessary or be made, and provided nevertheless that if any such officer be so employed by the said Council and discharged by them for any other cause than inefficiency, breach of duty, or misconduct, within two years after the commencement of this scheme, he shall be entitled to compensation in the same manner as if he had not been employed by the said Council. Provided also that the term 'Officer' shall include only all salaried persons employed by the said Local Board whose salaries or emoluments are payable at intervals of not less than one month. Provided also that the said Lords Commissioners shall be the sole judges as to the right or claim of any officer to any compensation whatever and as to the amount thereof and upon any question whatever which may arise under this clause, and that every determination of the said Lords Commissioners upon any such right, claim, amount, or question shall be absolutely final and conclusive, and every statement or reference to any matter aforesaid made at any time in writing and signed by any two of the said Lords Commissioners for the time being, shall be final and conclusive upon any person claiming under or by virtue of this clause and upon the said Corporation."

THE ANIMALS (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1892, No. 3.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

Revocation of Orders.

1. The Order of the Privy Council and the Order of the Board of Agriculture described in the First Schedule to this Order, to the extent described in the said First Schedule, are hereby, from and after the commencement of this Order, revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not revive any Order or part of any Order revoked by or otherwise affect the past operation or invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Order or part of Order hereby revoked, before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Order or part of Order hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order.

Animals from Countries in Second Schedule prohibited.

2.—(1.) Unless and until the Board of Agriculture otherwise order, animals brought from any of the countries named in the Second Schedule to this Order shall not be landed in England or Wales or Scotland.

(2.) The Animals Order of 1885 shall be read and have effect as if the countries named in the Second Schedule to this Order were included in the List of Prohibited Countries named in Part I of the Fourth Schedule to the said Order of 1886, and as if none of the countries named in the Second Schedule to this Order were included in the List of Free Countries named in the Fifth Schedule to the said Order of 1886.

Amendment of Article 130 of The Animals Order of 1886.

3. The following provisions of this Article shall

be read in the place of Article 130 of the Animals Order of 1886, and shall be deemed to be Article 130 of that Order (namely):

Conditions of Landing.

130.—(1.) The landing of foreign animals at a Foreign Animals Wharf under the provisions of this Chapter is subject to the following conditions:

First. That the vessel in which they are imported has not, within twenty-eight days before taking them on board, had on board any animal exported or carried coastwise from a port or place in any of the countries mentioned in Part I of the Fourth Schedule, or from a port or place in Malta, or in Belgium, or in Germany, or in Denmark, or in the Netherlands, or in Norway, or in Sweden, or in Spain, or in Portugal, or in Iceland, or from any port or place from which the landing of animals is for the time being prohibited.

Second. That the vessel has not within twenty-one days before taking them on board or at any time since taking on board the animals imported, entered any port or place in any of the countries mentioned in Part I of the Fourth Schedule, or any port or place in Malta, or in Belgium, or in Germany, or in Denmark, or in the Netherlands, or in Norway, or in Sweden, or in Spain, or in Portugal, or in Iceland, or any port or place from which the landing of animals is for the time being prohibited.

Third. That the animals imported have not, while on board the vessel, been in contact with any animal exported or carried coastwise from any port or place in any of the countries mentioned in Part I of the Fourth Schedule, or from any port or place in Malta, or in Belgium, or in Germany, or in Denmark, or in the Netherlands, or in Norway, or in Sweden, or in Spain, or in Portugal, or in Iceland, or from any port or place from which the landing of animals is for the time being prohibited.

(2.) And the animals imported shall not be landed at a Foreign Animals Wharf unless and until the master of the vessel has on each occasion of importation of foreign animals therein delivered to the Commissioners of Customs or their proper officer, a declaration made and signed that all the animals then imported therein are properly imported according to the provisions of this Article.

Amendment of Article 151 of The Animals Order of 1886.

4. The following provisions of this Article shall be read in the place of Article 151 of the Animals Order of 1886, and shall be deemed to be Article 151 of that Order (namely):

Conditions of Landing.

151.—(1.) The landing of foreign animals at a Landing-Place for foreign animals under the provisions of this Chapter is subject to the following conditions:

First. That the vessel in which they are imported has not, within twenty-eight days before taking them on board, had on board any animal exported or carried coastwise from a port or place in any country other than Her Majesty's Possessions in North America, or New Zealand, or the Channel Islands, or the United States of America (provision as to which country is made by the second condition of this Article), or the Isle of Man

(provision as to which Isle is made by the third condition of this Article).

Second. That the vessel in which they are imported has not, within twenty-one days before taking them on board, had on board any animal exported or carried coastwise from a port or place in the United States of America.

Third. That the vessel in which they are imported has not, within twenty-eight days before taking them on board, had on board any cattle exported or carried coastwise from a port or place in the Isle of Man.

Fourth. That the vessel in which they are imported has not, within twenty-one days before taking them on board or at any time since taking on board the animals imported, entered any port or place in any country other than Her Majesty's Possessions in North America, or New Zealand, or the Channel Islands, or the United States of America, or the Isle of Man.

Fifth. That the animals imported have not, while on board the vessel, been in contact with any animal exported or carried coastwise from any port or place in any country other than Her Majesty's Possessions in North America, or New Zealand, or the Channel Islands, or (subject to the sixth condition of this Article) the Isle of Man.

Sixth. That the animals imported have not, while on board the vessel, been in contact with any cattle exported or carried coastwise from a port or place in the Isle of Man.

(2.) And the animals imported shall not be landed at a Landing-Place for foreign animals unless and until—

(a.) The owner or charterer of the vessel in which they are imported, or his agent in England or Wales or Scotland, has entered into a bond to Her Majesty the Queen, in a sum not exceeding one thousand pounds, with or without a surety or sureties, to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Customs, conditioned for the observance of the foregoing conditions; and

(b.) The master of the vessel has on each occasion of importation of foreign animals therein satisfied the Commissioners of Customs, or their proper officer, by declaration made and signed or otherwise, that all the animals then imported therein are properly imported according to the provisions of this Article.

Interpretation.

5. In this Order terms have the same meaning as in the Animals Order of 1886.

Short title.

6. This Order may be cited as THE ANIMALS (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1892, No. 3.

Commencement.

7. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

ESSEX AND HERTS (MOVEMENT AND SALES) ORDER OF 1892.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Short Title.

1. This Order may be cited as THE ESSEX AND HERTS (MOVEMENT AND SALES) ORDER OF 1892.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after this twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

Interpretation.

3. In this Order—

The Act of 1878 means the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878:

Fat cattle, or fat sheep, or fat swine, means cattle, sheep, or swine intended for slaughter: Store cattle, or store sheep, or store swine, means cattle, sheep, or swine other than fat cattle, or fat sheep, or fat swine:

Public sale includes a market or fair, and any sale, whether conducted by auction or not, which is open to the public, whether on payment of entrance-money or other payment or not, whether it is held in a public place or not, and whether animals of different owners are exposed thereat or not; and includes also an exhibition:

Private sale means any sale other than a public sale:

Expose means expose for sale or in any manner put up or offer for sale, or exhibit at an exhibition:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Animals Order of 1886.

Movement out of District in Schedule prohibited.

4. No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order without a licence granted by an Inspector of the Board of Agriculture, or by a person appointed for the purpose by the Board, which licence will only be granted where the Board, after inquiry, are satisfied that exceptional circumstances render the movement necessary or expedient.

Provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals by railway through the said District from a place outside the said District to another place outside the said District without untrucking within the said District.

Exemption of the County of Essex from the Provisions of the Infected Districts Markets and Fairs (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1892.

5. The provisions of the Infected Districts Markets and Fairs (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1892 dated the twenty-third day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, shall not apply to the District of the Local Authority of the county of Essex, and the Schedule to that Order shall be read and have effect as if the county of Essex were included in

the list of Districts to which that Order does not apply.

Public and Private Sales in District in Schedule.

6. No public or private sale of cattle, sheep, or swine, fat or store, shall be held in the District described in the Schedule to this Order, except as expressly authorized by this Order.

Public Sales of Fat Cattle, Sheep, or Swine by Licence of Local Authority.

7.—(a.) A public sale of fat cattle, or fat sheep, or fat swine may be held in the District described in the Schedule to this Order, with a licence of the Local Authority, on the following conditions (namely):

(i.) Cattle, sheep, and swine exposed at the public sale so licensed shall, after their arrival thereat, and before they are moved therefrom, be marked by and at the expense of the owner, consignee, or other person exposing them, as follows:

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow, about five inches long, on the left hind quarter of each of the cattle.

Sheep and Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on the left side of each of the sheep or swine with the following composition, namely:—Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm: or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

(ii.) Every head of cattle, and every sheep, and every pig that is exposed at the public sale so licensed, whether it is sold thereat or not, shall be slaughtered within six days after the day on which the sale is held.

(iii.) Cattle, sheep, and swine exposed at the public sale so licensed shall not afterwards be exposed at any other public sale.

(b.) A licence of the Local Authority for a public sale of fat cattle, sheep, or swine under this Article shall be signed by the clerk of the Local Authority, by special direction of the Local Authority, and shall give notice of the conditions contained in this Article by specifying the same as conditions on which the licence is granted, and may impose such further conditions, if any, as the Local Authority think expedient, and shall be granted to the person entitled to hold the sale (as owner of a market, or as an auctioneer, or otherwise), and shall specify the place where the sale is to be held, and may authorize the holding of periodical sales on stated days, but may be renewed from time to time, and shall be published in such manner as the Local Authority consider best fitted to insure publicity for the same.

(c.) If the Board of Agriculture are of opinion, with respect to any licence of the Local Authority for a public sale of fat cattle, sheep, or swine under this Article, that the holding of the public sale thereby licensed is inexpedient, or that the licence is objectionable in any particular, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Public or Private Sales, Fat or Store, without Licence of Local Authority.

8. A public or private sale of cattle, sheep, or swine, fat or store, may be held without a licence of the Local Authority, in any case where the sale is held in accordance with the following conditions (namely):

(i.) That the sale is held on a farm or premises not in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place: and

(ii.) That no animal on the farm or premises is affected with foot-and-mouth-disease: and

(iii.) That the animal or each animal exposed at the sale has been on the farm or premises not less than fourteen clear days immediately before the day on which the sale is held.

Sales by Licence of the Board of Agriculture.

9. Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions and in addition thereto, a public or private sale of cattle, sheep, or swine, fat or store, may be held in any circumstances, with a licence of the Board of Agriculture.

Saving.

10. Nothing in this Order shall apply to any sale of swine in any Swine-Fever Infected Area (for which Area provision is made as regards public and private sales of swine by the Animals Order of 1886).

Offences.

11.—(a.) If a public or private sale of cattle, sheep, or swine, fat or store, is held in contravention of this Order or of the conditions of a licence of the Local Authority or of the Board of Agriculture thereunder, the person holding the sale, and the occupier of the place or farm or premises where the sale is held, and the owner or consignee of each animal exposed thereat, and the person exposing the same thereat, and the auctioneer, if any, or other person conducting the sale, and the person, if any, taking entrance-money or other payment for admission thereto, and the purchaser thereof of any animal, such last-mentioned person or such purchaser knowing the sale to be held in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(b.) If a head of cattle, or a sheep, or a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person exposing the same, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the purchaser thereof, and the person holding the sale, and the auctioneer, if any, or other person conducting the sale, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(c.) If any person, with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by clipping, or washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark clipped, painted, or stamped on any cattle, sheep, or swine, as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(d.) If a head of cattle, or a sheep, or a pig is not slaughtered as required by this Order, the person failing to cause the same to be so slaughtered shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.
