PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

COUNTY OF LONDON.

SCHEME OF THE LONDON COUNTY COUNCIL FOR REGULATING THE HOLDING OF COURTS OF QUARTER SESSIONS FOR THE COUNTY OF LONDON, AS PROVIDED BY SECTION 42 (7) OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT.

Generally.

1. THE provisions of the Act 11 Geo. 4 and 1 Will. 4, c. 70, as to the times for holding

Quarter Sessions, shall not apply to the County of London.

2. Quarter Sessions shall be held at Clerkenwell and at Newington in the months of January, April, July, and October, in every year, and the first Session held in each of those months shall be General Quarter Sessions. [51 and 52 Vict., c. 41, s. 116.]

3. Adjourned Quarter Sessions shall be held at Clerkenwell in each of the months aforesaid at an interval of not less than two weeks or more than three weeks after the beginning of each Quarter Sessions held at Clerkenwell.

4. Adjourned Quarter Sessions shall be held at Newington in the months of February, May, August, and November.

5. A General Session shall be held at Clerkenwell in every month except in the months hereinbefore appointed for the holding of Quarter Sessions at Clerkenwell.

6. General Sessions shall be held at Newington in the months of March, June, September, and December in every year, and oftener, if need be.

7. An Adjourned General Session shall be held at Clerkenwell, for the disposal of business arising on the north side of the River Thames, in every month (except in the months hereinbefore appointed for the holding of Quarter Sessions at Clerkenwell) and shall begin at an interval of not less than two weeks or more than three weeks after the beginning of the General Session.

8. In the month of November in every year the Clerk of the Peace for the County of London shall prepare lists showing the days to be fixed for the Sessions to be held at Clerkenwell and Newington respectively during the ensuing year in accordance with the foregoing provisions. In the Lists so to be prepared special days shall be appointed for hearing appeals. The Lists so to be prepared shall be laid before the November General Sessions at Clerkenwell and the December General Sessions at Newington respectively, and shall be revised and settled by such Sessions respectively, and be printed on one paper in two parts or divisions, and be issued by the Clerk of the Peace for the County of London; and Sessions in accordance with such Lists, when so revised and settled, shall be held during the year at Clerkenwell and Newington respectively. Provided that, during the tenure of office of the existing Clerk of the Peace for the County of Surrey, the List of the Sessions to be held at Newington shall be prepared by him on a separate List [51 and 52 Vict., c. 41, s. 118 (10)], and such List, when revised and settled as aforesaid, shall be printed as a separate paper, and issued by him and not by the Clerk of the Peace of the County of London.

9. The Sessions so fixed shall so far as practicable be continued from day to day until the business to be dealt with at such Sessions is completed. And it shall be the duty of the Justices to take the steps necessary to secure that there shall be as many Courts sitting at the same time as may be required for the discharge of the business with proper expedition. For this purpose, (a) so long as the present Chairman holds office, in addition to the Court presided over by the Chairman, there may be a second Court, to be presided over by a person nominated in accordance with 14 and 15 Vict., c. 55, s. 15, and on the direction of the County Council approved by the Secretary of State, in pursuance of Sect. 42 (6) of the Local Government Act, 1888, a third Court, to be presided over either by a Deputy, as prescribed by 37 Vict., c. 7, s. 3, or

by one of the Justices, and a fourth Court to be presided over by one of the Justices. Any of the above Courts may be held at the same time at Clerkenwell and at Newington, and, subject to the provisions of this Scheme, shall be so held whenever necessary to prevent delay in the disposal of pending business; but only one nomination may be made under 14 and 15 Vict., c. 55, s. 15, and only one under 37 Vict., c. 7, s. 3.

(b.) Upon the present Chairman ceasing to hold office there may be held at the same time at Clerkenwell and at Newington, separate Courts of Quarter Sessions, and each of such Courts may divide itself into two or more Courts as may be necessary.

10. Every Court of Sessions of the Peace held at Clerkenwell and at Newington, and every adjournment thereof, shall have the same jurisdiction in every respect, including the power of hearing and determining appeals, as if such Court were Quarter Sessions, and every Session shall, as circumstances require, be deemed to be Quarter or General Sessions, and, if held at different places, to be original or adjourned Sessions, and, if held simultaneously at two or more places, to be divided Courts of the same Sessions. [51 and 52 Vict., c. 41, s. 42 (6), and s. 116 (c).]

11. The Clerk of the Peace for the County of London shall (save as hereinafter mentioned) take all necessary and proper steps to convene all Sessions, and shall issue all necessary precepts to the Sheriff to secure the due attendance there of the Grand and Petty Juries; provided that during the tenure of office of the existing Clerk of the Peace for the county of Surrey all such duties shall, as respects the Sessions to be held at Newington, be performed by him.

12. Upon the present Clerk of the Peace for Surrey ceasing to hold office, the Clerk of the Peace for the time being of the County of London shall perform all the duties which are by law or by this Scheme imposed upon the Clerk of the Peace for Surrey in respect of the County of London. [51 and 52 Vict., c. 41, s. 118 (10).]

13. Cases triable at Quarter Sessions and all other business to be disposed of at Quarter Sessions and arising on the North side of the River Thames shall be heard, determined, and disposed of at the Sessions held at Clerkenwell; and Cases triable at Quarter Sessions and all other business to be disposed of at Quarter Sessions and arising on the South side of the River Thames shall be heard, determined, and disposed of at the Sessions held at Newington. [51 and 52 Vict., c. 41, s. 116 (b).]

14. All depositions, recognizances, notices, and other documents and things relating to cases triable, or business to be disposed of at Quarter Sessions and required by Law to be transmitted to Quarter Sessions or to the Clerk of the Peace, shall, in respect of all cases and matters arising North of the River Thames, be transmitted to the Clerk of the Peace for the County of London; and in respect of all cases and matters arising South of the River Thames, shall be transmitted to the present Clerk of the Peace for the County of Surrey, and upon his ceasing to hold office, shall be transmitted to the Clerk of the Peace for the time being of the County of London. [51 and 52 Vict., c. 41, s. 116 (b).]

15. It shall be the duty of the Justices to take care that the above provisions for the disposal of business arising North and South respectively of the River Thames shall, so far as reasonably practicable, be strictly observed. Nevertheless,

a committal for trial or recognizance shall not be invalidated, nor shall the powers of the Sessions be affected by any disregard of the provisions of this Scheme, as to the place or time of trial, and every Court of Sessions held in and for the County of London, at whatever place or time such Court is held, shall have complete power to hear, determine, and dispose of any case or matter arising in the County of London, notwithstanding an objection that such case or matter ought to be heard and determined at the Sessions held at another place or at another time. [51 and 52 Vict., c. 41, s. 116 (b).]

16. Nothing in this Scheme shall affect or take away any power given by law to the present Chairman of Quarter Sessions, or to the present Clerk of the Peace for the County of London, or to the present Clerk of the Peace for the County of Surrey. [51 and 52 Vict., c. 41, s. 117 (5), and s. 118 (8), (10).]

As to Appeals under the Valuation (Metropolis) Act, 1869.

1. At every adjourned January Quarter Sessions held at Clerkenwell, sittings of the Court shall be fixed to hear appeals under the Valuation (Metropolis) Act, 1869. [51 and 52 Vict., c. 41, s. 42 (10).]

2. Such sittings shall begin not earlier than the 1st February then next, and shall be so arranged as to enable the Court to determine all appeals (except where a valuation list or valuation is ordered) before the ensuing 31st March.

3. The Court shall at the same Session appoint, with the consent of the Local Government Board, a Clerk and other persons to assist the Sessions in the performance of their duties under the Act. [32 and 33 Vict., c. 67, s. 25.]

4. A separate list shall be prepared of appeals relating to property in the city of London, and prior to the hearing of such appeals the Clerk of the Court (appointed under Order 3) shall send seven days' previous notice to the Clerk of the Peace of the city of London, for the information of the members of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the city of London appointed by that Court to attend and sit as Members of the Quarter Sessions for the County of London upon the hearing of such appeals. [51 and 52 Vict., c. 41, s. 42 (10).]

5. Appeals may be heard at Clerkenwell, or at Newington, or in the city of London, or at some or all of such places, at the same time, or at different times, as the Court shall from time to time determine. [32 and 33 Vict., c. 67, s. 26.]

6. At every April Quarter Session held at Clerkenwell, the Court shall assign the remuneration (subject to the approval of the Local Government Board) of the Clerk and other officers appointed as aforesaid for the year ended the 31st March. [32 and 33 Vict., c. 67, s. 25.]

7. A separate account shall be kept of the expenses incurred by the sessions in respect of the exercise of its jurisdiction under the Act, and such account made up to the 31st March in every year shall be submitted to and be examined by the Court of the April Quarter Sessions held at Clerkenwell.

8. Such account, when approved by the Court, shall be submitted by the Clerk of the Court (appointed under Order 3) for such audit as may be directed by the Local Government Board, with a view that the same, when audited, may be paid in manner prescribed by the Valuation (Metropolis) Act, 1869. [32 and 33 Vict., c. 67, s. 50.]

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Notwithstanding anything in Article 1 of the Order passed by the Board of Agriculture on the fifteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, prohibiting the movement of cattle, sheep, goats, and swine out of a District comprising the county of Kent (except such portion thereof as is within the Metropolitan Police District), and also comprising the boroughs of Canterbury, Chatham, Dover, Folkestone, Gravesend, Maidstone, Margate, Ramsgate, Rochester, and Tunbridge Wells, or in any other Order of the Board to the contrary, a flock of about four hundred sheep, the property of Edwin Vinson, of High Croft Hall, Swanley,

Kent, may be moved out of the said District to a Farm called Ruxley, Fooks Cray, Kent, situate within the Metropolitan Police District.

2. This Order shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

MOVEMENT OF SHEEP (SCOTLAND)
ORDER OF 1892.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Special Regulations as to Movement of Sheep out of and into certain Districts.

1.—(1.) Notwithstanding anything in the Orders

described in the First Schedule to this Order sheep may be moved for purposes of breeding or feeding from any farm or premises situate in any of the Districts described in the Second Schedule to this Order to any place situate in the District of any Local Authority in Scotland on the following conditions, and not otherwise:

- (i.) The sheep shall be accompanied with a Movement Licence of the Local Authority of the District from which the sheep are to be moved, which Licence shall specify the place to which the sheep are to be moved, and shall be granted only on such a Declaration as hereinafter provided, and also shall be accompanied with a further Licence of each Local Authority into or through whose District the sheep are to be moved, and every such further Licence shall be indorsed on or shall refer to the first-mentioned Licence;
- (ii.) The Declaration shall be a Declaration of the owner of the sheep or of his agent authorized in writing for this purpose declaring that the sheep to be moved have been in the possession of the owner, and have been exclusively grazed or otherwise fed on the premises from which they are to be moved, for a period of at least twenty-one days immediately before the making of the Declaration, and that the said sheep have not during that period been in any market, fair, sale-yard, or place of exhibition, and have not at any time during that period been at any place situate within two miles of a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place, and have not to the best of his knowledge and belief been in any way exposed to the infection of foot-and-mouth disease;
- (iii.) The sheep shall not be moved at any time through or within one mile of a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place;
- (iv.) The sheep shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the Licence and to no other place, and shall not be moved therefrom without a further Licence of the Local Authority of the District in which such place is situate first had and obtained.

(2.) Provided that for the purposes of this Article sheep shall not be deemed to be moved

into or through the District of a Local Authority in cases where they are moved through such District by railway without untrucking within such District.

Granting of Movement Licences.

2.—(1.) A Local Authority may if they think fit withhold a Movement Licence in any case where the movement of the sheep proposed to be moved would be in their judgment inexpedient or improper.

(2.) No Licence for movement of sheep granted under this Order shall be available if granted by the owner of the sheep to be moved or by his agent, or by the consignee, or by the occupier of the farm or premises from or to which the sheep are to be moved.

Delivery of Declarations.

3.—(1.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order is not available except when accompanied by the Declaration on which it is granted.

(2.) The person granting such Movement Licence under this Order, shall, for the identification of the Declaration produced to him, mark the same by signing his name thereon, with the date of the production thereof to him.

(3.) The person granting such Movement Licence shall deliver the Declaration produced to him, when so marked, with the Licence, to the person receiving the Licence from him.

Production of Licences: Names and Addresses.

4.—(1.) Every person in charge of sheep being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence may be necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Movement Licence, if any, authorizing the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Every person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Offences.

5.—(1.) If a sheep is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a Licence thereunder, the owner of the sheep, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the sheep, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(2.) If a person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as THE MOVEMENT OF SHEEP (SCOTLAND) ORDER OF 1892.

Commencement.

7. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after this twenty-sixth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

Interpretation.

8. In this Order—

- (b.) The animals shall be kept at the said railway-station until trucked, and shall then be moved by rail to the place of destination without untrucking.

(2.) If any head of cattle or any sheep, goat, or pig landed from Ireland at a port or place in the District described in the Schedule to this Order is moved out of the said District in contravention of the foregoing conditions, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

3. This Order may be cited as THE LANCASHIRE (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) MOVEMENT ORDER OF 1892.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after this twenty-eighth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

Interpretation.

3. In this Order—

The Act of 1878 means the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878:

Fat cattle, or fat sheep, or fat swine, means cattle, sheep, or swine intended for slaughter: Store cattle, or store sheep, or store swine, means cattle, sheep, or swine other than fat cattle, or fat sheep, or fat swine:

Public sale includes a market or fair, and any sale, whether conducted by auction or not, which is open to the public, whether on payment of entrance-money or other payment or not, whether it is held in a public place or not, and whether animals of different owners are exposed thereat or not; and includes also an exhibition:

Private sale means any sale other than a public sale:

Expose means expose for sale or in any manner put up or offer for sale, or exhibit at an exhibition:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Animals Order of 1883.

Exemption of the County of Lancaster from the Provisions of the Infected Districts Markets and Fairs (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1892.

4. The provisions of the Infected Districts Markets and Fairs (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1892 dated the twenty-third day of

February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, shall not apply to the District of the Local Authority of the county of Lancaster, and the Schedule to that Order shall be read and have effect as if the county of Lancaster were included in the list of Districts to which that Order does not apply.

Public and Private Sales.

5. No public or private sale of cattle, sheep, or swine, fat or store, shall be held in any of the Districts or part of District of Local Authorities mentioned in the Schedule to this Order, except as expressly authorized by this Order.

Public Sales of Fat Cattle, Sheep, or Swine by Licence of Local Authority.

6.—(a.) A public sale of fat cattle, or fat sheep, or fat swine may be held with a licence of a Local Authority, on the following conditions (namely):

(i.) Cattle, sheep, and swine exposed at the public sale so licensed shall, after their arrival thereat, and before they are moved therefrom, be marked by and at the expense of the owner, consignee, or other person exposing them, as follows:

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow, about five inches long, on the left hind quarter of each of the cattle.

Sheep and Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on the left side of each of the sheep or swine with the following composition, namely:—Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm: or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

(ii.) Every head of cattle, and every sheep, and every pig that is exposed at the public sale so licensed, whether it is sold thereat or not, shall be slaughtered within six days after the day on which the sale is held.

(iii.) Cattle, sheep, and swine exposed at the public sale so licensed shall not afterwards be exposed at any other public sale.

(b.) A licence of a Local Authority for a public sale of fat cattle, sheep, or swine under this Article shall be signed by the clerk of the Local Authority, by special direction of the Local Authority, and shall give notice of the conditions contained in this Article by specifying the same as conditions on which the licence is granted, and may impose such further conditions, if any, as the Local Authority think expedient, and shall be granted to the person entitled to hold the sale (as owner of a market, or as an auctioneer, or otherwise), and shall specify the place where the sale is to be held, and may authorize the holding of periodical sales on stated days, but may be renewed from time to time, and shall be published in such manner as the Local Authority consider best fitted to insure publicity for the same.

(c.) If the Board of Agriculture are of opinion, with respect to any licence of a Local Authority for a public sale of fat cattle, sheep, or swine under this Article, that the holding of the public sale thereby licensed is inexpedient, or that the licence is objectionable in any particular, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Public or Private Sales, Fat or Store, without Licence of Local Authority.

7. A public or private sale of a head of cattle, or of a sheep, or of a pig, or of cattle, sheep, or swine, fat or store, may be held without a licence of the Local Authority, in any case where the

sale is held in accordance with the following conditions (namely):

- (i.) That the sale is held on a farm or premises not in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place:
- (ii.) That no animal on the farm or premises is affected with foot-and-mouth-disease:
- (iii.) That the animal or each animal exposed at the sale has been on the farm or premises not less than fourteen clear days immediately before the day on which the sale is held.

Sales by Licence of the Board of Agriculture.

8. Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions and in addition thereto, a public or private sale of cattle, sheep, or swine, fat or store, may be held in any circumstances, with a licence of the Board of Agriculture.

Saving.

9. Nothing in this Order shall apply to—

- (i.) any sale of cattle, sheep, or swine in any Foreign Animals Wharf or Foreign Animals Quarantine Station or Landing-place for foreign animals: nor
- (ii.) any sale of swine in any Swine-Fever Infected Area (for which Area provision is made as regards public and private sales of swine by the Animals Order of 1886).

Offences.

10.—(a.) If a public or private sale of cattle, sheep, or swine, fat or store, is held in contravention of this Order or of the conditions of a licence of a Local Authority or of the Board of Agriculture thereunder, the person holding the sale, and the occupier of the place or farm or premises where the sale is held, and the owner or consignee of each animal exposed thereat, and the person exposing the same thereat, and the auctioneer, if any, or other person conducting the sale, and the person, if any, taking entrance-money or other payment for admission thereto, and the purchaser thereof of any animal, such last-mentioned person or such purchaser knowing the sale to be held in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(b.) If a head of cattle, or a sheep, or a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person exposing the same, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the purchaser thereof, and the person holding the sale, and the auctioneer, if any, or other person conducting the sale, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(c.) If any person, with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by clipping, or washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark clipped, painted, or stamped on any cattle, sheep, or swine, as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

(d.) If a head of cattle, or a sheep, or a pig is not slaughtered as required by this Order, the person failing to cause the same to be so slaughtered shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.
